FROM DEATH TO LIFE, PT. 2; EPH. 2:2c (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE CONTINUE OUR CLOSE EXAMINATION OF EPH. 2:1-10.

▶ Basically, ~ as we noted, ~ in this paragraph, ~ Paul explains that God has brought believers from spiritual death to spiritual, ~ or new, ~ life by His grace alone.

NOW LET'S TURN OUR ATTENTION ONCE AGAIN TO A BRIEF OVERVIEW OF THIS paragraph, ~ in order to keep the overall context in view ~ and to remind ourselves how it all fits together.

▶ Paul begins, ~ in verse 1, ~ by stating what our condition was prior to salvation, ~ and also the reason for this condition.

>>He says, ~ "And you were dead in the trespasses and sins."*

▶ In verses 2-3, ~ Paul describes our spiritually dead condition. ~~ He writes, ~ "in which* you once walked, ~ following the course of this world, ~ following the prince of the power of the air, ~ the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience -77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, ~ carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, ~ and were by nature children of wrath, ~ like the rest of mankind."

▶ Then in verses 4-6, ~ Paul explains the gracious, ~ merciful, ~ and loving act of God that brought us from spiritual death to new life.

 \triangleright He says, ~ "But God, ~ being rich in mercy, ~ because of the great love with which he loved us, ~ even when we were dead in our trespasses, ~ made us alive together with Christ — by grace you have been saved — 77

→ → and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus."

►►After that, ~ in verse 7, ~ Paul points out \bar{a} purpose of God's gracious act of bringing us from spiritual death to spiritual life.

 \triangleright He writes, ~ "so that in the coming ages ~ he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus." 11/8

►►And finally, ~ in verses 8-10, ~ Paul explains that our salvation, ~ this new life that God has given us, ~ is totally by grace alone.

>>He says, ~ "For by grace you have been saved through faith. ~~ And this is not your own doing; ~~ it is the gift of God, ~ not a result of works, ~ so that no one may boast. ~~ For we are his workmanship, ~ created in Christ Jesus for good works, ~ which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

IF YOU RECALL, ~ LAST TIME WE EXAMINED VERSES 1-2b.

► We looked at verse 1a ~ and what our condition was prior to salvation. ~~ And that is ~ we were spiritually dead.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e., \sim$ before salvation, \sim we were separated and alienated from \sim and enemies with \sim God.

▶ We also discussed verse 1b ~ and the reason we were spiritually dead.

>>We were spiritually dead, ~ Paul said, ~ because of our "trespasses and sins."

→→As Paul says in Rom. 6:23a, ~ "For the wages of ~ [or payment for] ~ sin is death."

► And then we examined the first two of the five ways Paul describes our spiritually dead condition in verses 2-3.

▷▷1st, ~ in vs. 2a, ~ Paul: ~ prior to salvation, ~ we "walked" in our "trespasses and sins."

 \rightarrow \rightarrow I.e., ~ actively sinning characterized our lives prior to salvation. ~~ IOW, ~ in our pre-salvation condition, ~ sinning was a way of life for us. ~~ Sin dominated our lives.

→→Implication: ~~ sinning is not to characterize our new life in Christ.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 2nd, ~ Paul said that we followed "the course of this world."

 $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow As$ we talked about, ~ Paul here does not use the word "world" in the literal sense of the physical world, ~ but in the theological sense of people organized in their opposition against God.

 \rightarrow As noted, ~ this could be understood as referring to the various non-Christian religions, ~ ideologies, ~ philosophies, ~ values, ~ and economic structures, ~ as well as to the influence of peer pressure, ~ fashion, ~ and the media. ~~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And also to the people behind all these things. 11 2/8

→→I.e., ~ Before God saved us, ~ Paul says, ~ we followed the standards of this present evil world system, ~ or, ~ as Paul put it Gal. 1:4, ~ "the present evil age," ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow that is in rebellion against God, ~ that is opposed to everything and everyone associated with Him, ~ and where self is on the throne.

THIS A.M., ~ WE TURN OUR ATTENTION TO VERSE 2C AND THE THIRD WAY PAUL describes our condition prior to salvation.

PAUL SAYS THAT WHEN WE WERE SPIRITUALLY DEAD, ~ WE WERE "FOLLOWING THE prince of the power of the air, ~ the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience."

▶ Before getting into the details, ~ let's note, ~ and keep in mind as we look at the specifics, ~ that the main point of description is that, ~ prior to salvation, ~ we followed this prince or ruler.

ALTHOUGH PAUL DOES NOT IDENTIFY HIM HERE, ~ NO DOUBT, ~ BASED ON THE overall context of Scripture, ~ and Paul's wording here in verse 2c, ~ he is referring to Satan, ~ 77

when he says "the prince of the power of the air."

► Satan is a real spirit being and the adversary of God and God's people. ~~ Satan was originally one of the holy cherubim, ~ created by God.

►►At some point before the events recorded in Gen. 3, ~ this cherub rebelled against God and became Satan.

▷▷Is. 14:12-15 and Ezek. 28:12-19 ~~ *And BTW, ~ when we say cherub*

► Satan is the adversary of God and God's people. ~~ And simply put, ~ Satan's main objective is to thwart the sovereign plan of God ~ and to destroy God's people.

 \blacktriangleright So, ~ in verse 2c, ~ Paul's third description of our spiritually dead life ~ is that, ~ when we were spiritually dead, ~ we were following Satan.

PAUL IDENTIFIES SATAN AS "PRINCE OF THE POWER OF THE AIR."

▶ Based on Paul's third overarching theme of Ephesians, ~ i.e., ~ the spiritual warfare of the believer, ~ and Paul's usage of the word for "power" (authority) elsewhere in Ephesians, ~ 77

▶ When Satan rebelled against God, ~ he took a number of angels with him; ~~ possibly onethird, ~ if that's what Rev. 12:4a is referring to. ~~ And they became the demons.

► To expand on Paul's third description of our spiritually dead life in verse 2c, ~ Paul is saying ~ that, ~ when we were spiritually dead, ~ we were "following Satan, ~ who is the ruler of the spiritual forces of evil."

OK, ~ SO "POWER" REFERS TO THE SPIRITUAL FORCES OF EVIL. ~~ BUT WHAT ABOUT the word "air," ~ when he says "prince of the power of the air"?

► Well, ~ Paul seems to be using "air" as a metaphor for the spiritual world in which the spiritual forces of evil operate. ~~ I.e., ~ using "air" to represent the spiritual realm.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And, ~ just as we cannot see air, ~ at this time we cannot see the spiritual realm.

► And since air is all around us, ~ Paul may have used the word "air" to emphasize how closely the spiritual forces of evil crowd in on human life, ~ filling the very atmosphere around us.

 \triangleright Here it seems that Paul wanted to press upon us the fact that Satan and his demons are very much present and involved in this world.

 \triangleright This is clearly portrayed in Satan's answer to God in Job 1:7. ~~ "The Lord said to Satan, ~ 'From where have you come?' ~~ Satan answered the Lord and said, ~ 'From going to and fro on the earth, ~ and from walking up and down on it."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And Daniel, ~ in his book, ~ refers to angels and demons that are assigned to ~ and involved with ~ the nations of the world.

→→Opens curtains . . . ~~ glimpse of what's going on behind the scenes.

→→In explaining the delay of the answer to Daniel's prayer, ~ the angel tells him in Dan. 10:13, ~ 77

→→"The prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days ~ [demon, ~ no human could resist an angel for a second, ~ let alone 21 days], ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow but Michael, ~ one of the chief princes, ~ came to help me, ~ for I was left there with the kings of Persia."

→→And then in 11:1, ~ the angel tells Daniel, ~ LEB ~ "And I, ~ in the first year of Darius the Mede, ~ I stood as a support ~ and as a protection for him." ~~ {Michael} \triangleright So, ~ we see that the spiritual world is very much present and involved in the physical world. ~~ And Paul, ~ it seems, ~ doesn't want us to miss this truth.

 \rightarrow And here's a thought. ~~ When we observe things going on with the governments of the world's nations ~ and the actions they take, ~ we need to take into account what Daniel reveals to us.

 \rightarrow And begin to think more on a spiritual level ~ rather than on a physical, ~ only what we see level.

►► To further expand on Paul's 3rd description of our spiritually dead life, ~ Paul is saying ~ that, ~ when we were spiritually dead, ~ we were following Satan, ~ who is the ruler of the spiritual forces of evil in the unseen world, ~ which is all around us.

ALTHOUGH PAUL DOES NOT MENTION IT HERE, ~ WE SHOULD NOTE THAT IN addition to ruling over the spiritual forces of evil, ~ Satan is also the ruler of this world.

▶►I.e., ~ he is the ruler of this present evil world system, ~ that is in rebellion against God, ~ that is opposed to everything and everyone associated with Him, ~ and where self is on the throne.

 \triangleright Three times in John's gospel, ~ in 12:31, ~ 14:30, ~ and 16:11, ~ Jesus called Satan "the ruler of this world." ~~ Notice, ~ "the," ~ not "a."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In 2 Cor. 4:4, ~ Paul calls Satan "the god of this world." ~~ I.e., ~ the one who has power or authority over this world.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In 1 Jn. 5:19, ~ John writes, ~ "We ~ [i.e., ~ Christians] ~ know that we are from God, ~ and the whole world lies in the power of the evil one."

 \triangleright Satan is the ruler and the power behind the non-Christian religions, ~ ideologies, ~ philosophies, ~ values, ~ and economic structures, ~ and also the people involved in all these things.

→→We've already seen an example of this in two passages that we've already mentioned. ~~ Is. 14:12-15 and Ezek. 28:12-19....

▶▶Now, ~ the good news here is that on the cross, ~ Jesus defeated and overthrew Satan.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In Jn. 12:31, ~ which we mentioned earlier, ~ Jesus, ~ speaking about His crucifixion, ~ said, ~ Now is the judgment of this world; ~~ now will the ruler of this world be cast out."

>>But, ~ as we've discussed, ~ Jesus has not yet exercised His full authority. ~~ He allows this present evil world system and its ruler to temporarily continue.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow To put it differently, ~ this "present evil age" ~ and its ruler ~ are living and reigning on borrowed time. ~~ And that time will someday run out.

→ Rev. 20 ~~ **2 Peter

GETTING BACK TO EPH. 2:2c, ~ AND HIS THIRD DESCRIPTION OF OUR UNSAVED LIFE, ~ Paul further identifies Satan as ~ "the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience."

▶▶ "sons of disobedience" refers to unbelievers ~ and is actually a good description of them. ~~ They reject God, ~ rebel against His ways, ~ and follow Satan and his ways.

► Simply put, ~ Paul says that Satan, ~ and we could include the other demons here, ~ "is now at work in unbelievers."

>> The term Paul used for "at work" implies more than the idea of simply "at work in."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It can be paraphrased as "the spirit that is now powerfully working in the sons of disobedience."

►►And "powerfully working" most likely refers to powerfully influencing unbelievers.

>>Not only is Satan the ruler and power behind the evil world system. ~~ He also powerfully influences the various non-Christian religions, ~ ideologies, ~ philosophies, ~ values, ~ and economic structures, ~ 77

→ → as well as powerfully influencing peer pressure, ~ fashion, ~ and the media, ~ and also the people involved.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Much of the greed and self-centered ambitions of the nations, ~ much of the deceptive diplomacy of the political world, ~ much of the bitter hatred and rivalry in the sphere of commerce, ~ 77

--plus the godless ideologies of the masses of humanity, ~ spring out of ~ and are fostered by ~ Satan's powerful influence.

► Now, ~ it's extremely important to understand two things here regarding Satan powerfully influencing unbelievers.

 $>>1^{st}$, ~ it does not mean that people won't be held accountable for their actions . . .

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 2nd, ~ when Paul says Satan is powerfully influencing unbelievers, ~ it does not mean that Satan is personally at work in the life of each unbeliever.

 \Rightarrow Satan is a created being. ~ And, ~ unlike God, ~ who is God and omnipresent, ~ Satan cannot be in all places at one time.

 \rightarrow But through his army of demons and his power over the "present evil age," ~ he powerfully influences the lives of all unbelievers.

GETTING BACK TO, ~ AND ONCE AGAIN EXPANDING ON, ~ PAUL'S THIRD DESCRIPTION of our spiritually dead life, ~ 77

▶ Paul says that ~ when we were spiritually dead ~ we were following Satan, ~ who is the ruler of the spiritual forces of evil in the unseen world, ~ which is all around us, ~ and who is powerfully influencing <u>un</u>believers.

NOW LET'S BRIEFLY LOOK AT THE MAIN POINT OF PAUL'S 3rd DESCRIPTION

▶▶In brief, ~ Paul says that prior to salvation, ~ we followed Satan ~ and not God.

► Now, ~ based on the facts that Satan is the ruler of this world, ~ that he powerfully influences unbelievers, ~ and that when we were unsaved, ~ we belonged to this world, ~ 77

Drewe can draw out the larger point that Paul is most likely making here in his 3rd desc.

► And that is ~ when we were spiritually dead, ~ we followed the ways of Satan; ~~ we were under his dominion, ~ authority, ~ control, ~ and powerful influence; ~~ 77

>>> we carried out his will; ~~ and we joined him in his opposition to God and His people. ~~ Furthermore, ~ he blinded us from seeing the truth of the gospel.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In 2 Tim. 2:26, ~ Paul points out that Satan has captured unbelievers "to do his will." ~~ I.e., ~ to carry out what Satan desires.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And in 2 Cor. 4:4, ~ Paul writes, ~ NIV, ~ "The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, ~ so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, ~ who is the image of God."

> But the good news, ~ my brothers and sisters in Christ, ~ is that through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, ~ God the Father defeated Satan, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ opened our eyes to the truth of the gospel, ~ and freed us from the clutches of "the ruler of this world." 11 7/8

▷▷In Col. 1:13, ~ Paul writes, ~ NASB, ~ "For He rescued us from the domain of darkness, ~ and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son, ~ in whom we have redemption, ~ the forgiveness of sins.

 \triangleright And in Col. 2:13-15, ~ Paul says, ~ "And you, ~ who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, ~ God made alive together with him, ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow having forgiven us all our trespasses, ~ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. ~~ This he set aside, ~ nailing it to the cross. ~~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, ~ by triumphing over them in him."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In brief, ~ my brothers and sisters in Jesus, ~ now that God has "rescued from the domain of darkness, ~ and transferred us to the kingdom of His beloved Son," ~ 77

→ →we follow Jesus ~ and not Satan.

CONCLUSION.

PRIOR TO SALVATION, ~ we were spiritually dead, ~ because of our trespasses and sins, ~ 77

>> we were 100% sinful, ~ sinning was a way of life for us, ~ we were following the standards of this "present evil age," ~ and we were following Satan ~ and not God.

MY FELLOW BELIEVERS, ~ WE WERE IN THIS HORRIBLY SINFUL, ~ HELPLESS, ~ AND hopeless condition. ~~ We were alienated from and hostile toward God. ~~ 77

>> We aligned ourselves with Satan.

b"But God, ~ [to give us encouragement ~ and another preview of the good news that comes later in this paragraph, ~~ Paul writes in verses 4-6] ~ 77

DD[But God] ~ being rich in mercy, ~ because of the great love with which he loved us, ~ even when we were dead in our trespasses, ~ made us alive together with Christ — by grace you have been saved — and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus."

► Grace, ~ grace, ~ God's grace, ~ Grace that will pardon and cleanse within; ~~ Grace, ~ grace, ~ God's grace, ~ Grace that is greater than all our sin.
