## THANKSGIVING AND PRAYER, PT. 4; PHIL. 1:9-11 (Ed O'Leary)

#### INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE FINISH OUR LOOK AT THE FIRST MAJOR SECTION OF PHIL., ~ 1:3-11.

 $\blacktriangleright$  Mainly,  $\sim$  as we know,  $\sim$  in this  $\P$ ,  $\sim$  Paul expresses thanksgiving and prayer.

TODAY WE WILL EXPLORE VERSES 9-11. ~~ PRAYS FOR THE BELIEVERS IN PHILIPPI.

- ▶Now, ~ even though this was a prayer for a specific church, ~ this is what God desires for all believers. ~~ So we need to be praying this prayer for ourselves and for our fellow believers. ~~ Should incorporate this prayer into our prayer lives.
- ▶▶It looks like there are three prayer requests here.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$ , ~ that believers' "love may abound more and more," ~~  $2^{nd}$ , ~ that believers' would grow in "knowledge and all discernment;" ~~ and  $3^{rd}$ , ~ that believers would be "filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ."

# THE 1st REQUEST IS IN VS. 9a.

PAUL PRAYS THAT THESE BELIEVERS' "LOVE MAY ABOUND MORE AND MORE."

► Since one of the reasons Paul wrote was to exhort the church to live in unity, ~ most likely he is talking about their love for each other. ~ So prays this because love promotes unity.

THE PHRASE "MORE AND MORE" INDICATES THAT PAUL WAS NOT GETTING ON THEIR case for something they lacked.

- ▶▶These believers already loved each other. ~~ Paul was praying that their present love for one another would increase.
- This implies that no matter how much we, ~ believers, ~ love one another, ~ there is always room for growth.  $\sim$  Paul confirms this in 1 Thess. 4:9-10 . . . .
- ▶ But Paul doesn't just want us to increase our love for one another a little bit. ~~ He wants it to abound more and more.
  - >> There is to be so much love for one another that there won't be any room to store it.
    - $\rightarrow \rightarrow Or$ , ~ picture if you will, ~ a river overflowing its banks during a flood. ~~ These are the pictures Paul is painting here. 11/7

- ▶▶In my opinion, ~ based on the level of love in our fellowship, ~ I believe Paul would look at our church and say something very similar to us what he said to the believers in Thessalonica.
  - >> "Indeed, ~ it is quite evident that you already show your love for all the believers in your fellowship. Even so, ~ dear brothers and sisters, ~ we urge you to love each other even more."
    - → Let's pray that the Lord would keep increasing our present love for one another to the point that there's no place big enough to store it!
      - $\rightarrow$  And this in turn, ~ since love promotes unity, ~ will reinforce our already strong unity.

BEFORE WE LEAVE THIS FIRST PRAYER REQUEST, ~ WE NEED TO MENTION THE KIND of love for one another that Paul wants abounding in believers' lives.

- $\blacktriangleright$ It's not some mushy, ~ sentimental love. ~~ It is not selfish love; ~ i.e., ~ it's not a love which is used to get something for oneself.
- ▶ Rather, ~ it's a love that is selfless, ~ others centered, ~ and sacrificial, ~ that places high value on a person and actively seeks that person's benefit.
  - $\triangleright$ In short, ~ Christ-like love. ~~ Jn. 15:12-13, ~ "12 This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> Greater love has no one than this, that someone lay down his life for his friends.
  - $\triangleright$  Jesus loved us so much that He was willing to and did die for us. ~~ He loved us all the way to the cross on Calvary.
    - $\rightarrow$  The cross reveals the depth of Jesus' love for us.  $\sim$  And we are to reflect that love to each other in this fallen,  $\sim$  sinful world.
- ► So our prayer should be that Christ-like love for our fellow believers overflows its banks within us ~ and within our brothers and sisters in Christ.

PAUL'S SECOND PRAYER REQUEST IS IN VERSE 9b. ~~ "WITH KNOWLEDGE AND ALL discernment." A quick technical note here.

- ▶▶ The phrase "with knowledge and all discernment" looks like it is attached to the first request. ~~ And it does modify it in the Greek text, ~ but it goes in a slightly diff. direction.
- ▶▶It can, ~ and I think it should, ~ be looked at as Paul praying for a second thing. ~~ The idea: ~~ Along w/ increasing in love, ~ believers would increase in ... 11 2/7

- ▶▶Let me give you a brief overview so we know where we're going.
  - $\triangleright$ In verse 9b, ~ Paul prays that believers would keep on growing in "knowledge and all discernment." ~~ & this is for the purpose of approving what is excellent, ~ vs. 10a.
    - → And then in verse 10b, ~ Paul lists the practical result of approving what is excellent: ~~ so that believers may be "pure and blameless for the day of Christ."
      - $\rightarrow \rightarrow Ok$ , ~ let's unpack this.

PAUL PRAYS IN VERSE 96 THAT BELIEVERS WOULD KEEP ON GROWING IN "KNOWLEDGE AND ALL discernment."

- ► Simply put, ~ the word for "knowledge" refers to knowledge of the truth. = God's Word . .
  - >>I.e., ~ Paul wants believers to keep on growing in our knowledge of God's word.
  - $\triangleright$ Now, ~ we are not passive in this. ~~ This is a joint effort.
    - $\rightarrow \rightarrow$  Our part is to study God's word;  $\sim \sim$  and as we do so,  $\sim$  the Holy Spirit gives us understanding.
      - →→Illuminating . . . . ~~ The Holy Spirit guides believers to an understanding of divine truth. ~~ Paul spells out in 1 Cor. 2:11-13. ~~ Read for homework.
- ► The last part of Paul's second prayer request is for "all discernment." ~~ "all" means "in every situation."
  - $\triangleright$ Here Paul prays that God will give believers the ability to understand the real nature of every situation.
    - $\rightarrow$  He wants us to be able to see and understand every state of affairs clearly and intelligently,  $\sim$  and to see and comprehend the truth about every situation.

### IN VERSE 10a, ~ AS WE NOTED, ~ PAUL GIVES US THE PURPOSE OF HIS REQUEST.

I.E.,  $\sim$  PAUL TELLS US WHY HE WANTS believers to grow in the knowledge & understanding of God's word and also to have God-given discernment for every situation.

▶▶"so that you may approve what is excellent." 11 3/7

 $\blacktriangleright$  We need this knowledge & understanding of God's word and God-given discernment so that we will be enabled to clearly see the difference between right and wrong,  $\sim$  good and evil,  $\sim$  7

Dand to always choose what is right and good.

▶► Simply stated, ~ we need divine enablement to consistently determine and make the Godhonoring-and-glorifying choices in this life.

BUT, ~ WE COULD ASK OURSELVES A QUESTION HERE.

▶▶Why do we need divine enablement to be able to clearly see the difference between right and wrong, ~ good and evil, ~ and to always choose what is right and good?

>>Well, ~ bluntly put, ~ we can't trust our own judgment when it comes to consistently determining and choosing right from wrong, ~ good from evil.

→ New nature . . . . ~ Old nature . . . . ~ Rom. 7:15-20 . . . .
```

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  So we can't trust ourselves to consistently determine and make the God-honoring-and-glorifying choices in this life.

- ▶▶Scripture makes this abundantly clear.
- ▶▶Prov. 3:5, ~ "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean ~ [or, ~ depend on] ~ on your own understanding.

 $\triangleright$  Why? ~~ Well, ~ for one thing, ~ we are imperfect, ~ so our understanding is faulty.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  Job's friends. ~~ Their thinking: ~~ "All suffering is punishment for sin; ~~ Job is suffering; ~~ therefore, Job is a sinner."

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$  But 3x in first two chapters Job described as blameless and upright, ~ one who reveres God and turns away from evil. ~~ And twice God is speaking.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  Faulty. ~~ John's gospel . . . .

- →→"It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him."
- ▶▶Prov. 14:12 and 16:25 also make it abundantly clear that we can't trust our own judgment.

 $\triangleright$  "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death. 11 4/7

- $\triangleright$  That doesn't instill a whole lot of confidence in our ability to judge right from wrong, ~ good from evil, ~ does it?
- >>Rather, ~ it points out a large capacity within us for self-deception, ~ doesn't it?
- ▶► And the verse that clinches it for needing the Lord to enable us to clearly see the difference between right and wrong, ~ good and evil, ~ and to always choose and practice the right and the good?
  - $\triangleright$ Jer. 17:9,  $\sim$  NIV,  $\sim$  "The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?"
  - $\triangleright$  There is nothing more deceitful than the human mind (heart). ~~ It is too sick to be healed.
  - $\triangleright$  That's part of why God had to give us a new nature. ~~ Unfortunately, ~ we are still susceptible to our fallen human minds.
    - $\rightarrow$  And therefore the need for help to consistently determine and make the Godhonoring-and-glorifying choices in this life.
- ► Our Heavenly Father wants us to <u>consistently determine and make the choices in this life</u> that honor and glorify Him.
  - $\triangleright \triangleright$  But He knows we are incapable of doing that consistently.
    - →→Ps. 103:14, ~ "For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust."
    - $\rightarrow$  He knows that they are weak and prone to failure.  $\sim$  And so He gives us what we need to  $\dots$   $\sim$  We just need to ask.
      - $\rightarrow$  James 1:5, ~ "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach ~ [i.e., ~ He will not rebuke us for asking], ~ and it will be given him.
- ►►How gracious, ~ loving, ~ and compassionate God is to give us His word and discernment so we can clearly see the difference between right and wrong, ~ good and evil, ~ and consistently choose that which honors and glorifies Him.
  - → And how thankful we should be.

CONTEXT, ~ VS. 10a. ~~ " $^{10a}$  SO THAT YOU MAY APPROVE WHAT IS EXCELLENT, ~~  $^{10b}$  AND so ~ [i.e., ~ and as a result] ~ be pure and blameless for the day of Christ."

- ▶▶I.e., ~ the practical result of consistently choosing what is pleasing to our heavenly Father will be that we lead pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return.
  - >> This reflects the truth that Jesus could return at any time. ~~ Don't know.
  - $\triangleright$ Now, ~ Jesus may not return in our lifetime. ~~ So, ~ Paul's message to us in a more general sense in verse 10b is this.
    - $\rightarrow \rightarrow As$  a result of consistently determining and making godly choices,  $\sim$  we will lead holy lives for the duration of our time on earth.
  - >> And holy living is what God calls His children to, ~ isn't it?
    - $\rightarrow$  1 Pet. 1:15-16, ~ "15 but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, 16 since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy."
- ▶▶A general observation here. ~~ We see that one of Paul's concerns for believers is that we start our life of faith well, ~ continue it well, ~ and finish it well. ~~ That we \_\_\_\_.
  - >> He wants all believers to be able to say at the end their lives what he said at the end of his in 2 Tim. 4:7. ~~ "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

## PAUL'S THIRD PRAYER REQUEST FOR THESE BELIEVERS IS IN VERSE 11a.

PAUL PRAYED THAT BELIEVERS WOULD BE "FILLED WITH THE FRUIT OF righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ."

- ▶ "of righteousness" here is describing "fruit." ~~ I.e., ~ Paul prays that believers be "filled with and live out the righteous fruit that comes through Jesus Christ."
- ►► And, ~ as I understand it, ~ "righteous fruit" refers to the godly qualities that Jesus produces within His people.
  - $\triangleright$ Paul shows this to be the case in Gal. 5:22-23a. ~~ "22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, <sup>23a</sup> gentleness, self-control."
- ▶▶Back to 11a. ~~ Paul wants believers to be filled with and live out these godly qualities that Jesus produces within believers. 11 6/7

▶►Notice, ~ this is not something that we can acquire or produce for ourselves. ~~ Only Jesus can produce these godly qualities within us.

>> What an awesome Savior. ~~ He wants us to be filled with and openly display these godly qualities. ~~ but we can't do it on our own. ~~ So He graciously produces them within us so we can live the way He wants us to.

#### CONCLUSION.

IN CLOSING, ~ I WOULD LIKE TO CALL OUR ATTENTION TO VS. 11b, ~ IN WHICH PAUL notes the result of being filled with and openly displaying these godly qualities.

> "to the glory and praise of God."

 $\triangleright$ I.e., ~ simply put, ~ when we are filled with and openly display the godly qualities that Jesus produces within us, ~ our lives will bring glory and praise to Him.

▶▶And bringing glory and praise to Jesus should be the desire of our hearts, ~ shouldn't it?
