SOLA FIDE (FAITH ALONE), PT. 1; PHIL. 3:1 (Ed O'Leary)

DON'T PRAY FIRST. ~~ INTRODUCTION.

THIS MORNING WE TURN TO THE NEXT SECTION OF PHILIPPIANS, ~ 3:1-11.

▶ But before we dig into this paragraph, ~ we're going to lay a solid foundation in order for us to get a better handle on the meat of this passage.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Longer intro than normal . . .

 \rightarrow And after building the foundation, ~ we'll look at verse 1. ~~ Where headed today.

***LET'S PRAY BEFORE WE BUILD THIS FOUNDATION & LOOK AT VERSE 1 ***

SOLA FIDE IS A LATIN PHRASE MEANING "FAITH ALONE." ~~ (Latin & history lesson)

► Sola fide is one of the five solas that came to define and summarize the key issues of the Protestant Reformation. ~~ The Latin word sola means "alone" or "only."

►► And the essential Christian doctrines represented by these five Latin phrases accurately summarize the biblical teaching on these crucial subjects.

>>Solus Christus, ~ Christ alone, ~ emphasizes the role of Jesus in salvation.

 \triangleright Sola scriptura, ~ Scripture alone, ~ emphasizes the Bible alone as the source of authority for Christians.

 \triangleright Soli Deo gloria, ~ for the glory of God alone, ~ emphasizes the glory of God as the goal of life.

 \triangleright Sola fide, ~ which we just mentioned and will look at a little more closely in a minute since it's directly related to 3:1-11.

>>And Sola gratia, ~ grace alone, ~ emphasizes grace as the reason for our salvation.

 \Rightarrow \Rightarrow IOW, ~ salvation comes from what God has done rather than what we do.

→ → Eph. 2:1-7

SOLA FIDE IS THE SUMMARY OF THE BIBLICAL TEACHING THAT A PERSON IS declared righteous or justified by God on the basis of our faith alone and not by works or anything else.

► Coupled with sola gratia, ~ grace alone, ~ we hold that justification before God is an act of God's grace which can only be received through faith in Jesus Christ.

 \triangleright Eph. 2:8, ~ "For by grace ~ [i.e., ~ by God's free and undeserved favor] ~ you have been saved ~ [and here's how we receive it:] ~ 77

→ → through faith ~ [faith in Jesus is the channel by which one receives God's free and undeserved favor and is saved]."

▷ Paul continues, ~ "And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." ~~ I.e., ~ "this salvation is not from you as a source; ~~ it is the gift from God." ~~ We not source . . .

>>No good work or righteous deeds, ~ or anything done on our part, ~ will allow us to earn salvation. ~~ Filthy rags.

>>Accomplishments and social status will not allow us to earn salvation. ~~ Performing religious rituals will not allow us to get into heaven.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But instead we put our faith in Christ as our only means of salvation.

▶▶And it is faith alone, ~ not faith plus works or faith plus something.

→→I.e., ~ it's not, ~ "To be saved, ~ believe in Jesus, ~ but you also must do this."

▶▶No. ~ It's faith alone ~ in Jesus alone. ~~ One mediator ~~ No other name

FAITH ALONE, ~ IN JESUS ALONE. ~~ BUT WHAT DO WE MEAN BY FAITH? ~~ SAVING faith.

▶▶In Rom 10:9, ~ NIV ~ Paul makes it clear that it is a heart response to hearing the content of the message of the gospel.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ "If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved."

▶▶In this respect, ~ it is an accepting response to God's revelation about himself through Jesus Christ.

▶ This includes an acknowledgment of who Jesus is, ~ an admission of one's sinfulness, ~ and a recognition, ~ sincere belief, ~ and acceptance that, ~ as Paul puts it in 1 Cor. 15:3b-4, ~ 77

DD "Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. 11 2/6

IT'S IMPORTANT THAT WE ARE CLEAR ABOUT THIS.

▶▶Millions of people today are trusting in their religion to get them into heaven.

>>They may think that practicing their religion and its rituals will get them into heaven.

 \triangleright They believe that just because they were baptized as an infant (or as a child or as a teenager or as an adult) that they are going to heaven.

>> They think that church attendance or receiving communion will get them into heaven.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ They think that just because they are a member of a particular denomination or religion that they're going to heaven.

 \rightarrow List could go on & on.

>> These things will not get anyone into heaven. ~~ They're rubbish.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Only saving faith in Jesus Christ, ~ and in Jesus Christ alone, ~ will get a person into heaven.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow When a person dies and stands before God, ~ he will not look for religious things from that person's life. ~~ Will not say

 \rightarrow \rightarrow God will look for one, ~ and only one, ~ thing, ~ whether or not that person is clothed in the righteousness of Jesus Christ, ~ his beloved Son.

▶ We need to understand two things from this.

 $>>1^{st}$, ~ these people who are trusting in their religion and all that goes with it ~ are lost, ~ in bondage, ~ and need the light of the true gospel, ~ the gospel of Jesus Christ, ~ to set them free.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The 2nd thing we need to understand is this. ~~ Satan loves religion. ~~ And he will give people as much religion as they want, ~ as long as it keeps them from Christ.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So we need to do all we can to bring the true gospel into their lives.

▶▶In addition to millions of people trusting in their religion and all its trappings, ~ many people have a "faith + something else."

 \triangleright They're trusting in Christ + baptism, ~~ or Christ + going to church, ~~ or Christ + church membership, ~~ or Christ + giving money ~~ or Christ + good works. 11 3/6

 \triangleright They love to sing that old gospel song: ~~ "Jesus paid almost all of it" ~ Q/Unquote, ~ because they think they've got to add their part to what Jesus did.

→→The hymn actually and correctly is entitled, ~ Jesus Paid It All.

 \rightarrow And the chorus says, ~ "Jesus paid it all, ~ All to Him I owe; ~~ Sin had left a crimson stain, ~ He washed it white as snow."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But what about things like baptism, ~ attending church, ~ church membership, ~ giving money, ~ and good works?

 \rightarrow \rightarrow They are all the outflow of salvation . . .

SOLA FIDE, ~ FAITH ALONE.

► Basically, ~ this is what Paul discusses in this next section of Philippians that we'll begin to look at today, ~ 3:1-11. ~~ Why solid foundation . . .

>>And we'll develop this theme of "faith alone" as we move through the paragraph.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow In a nutshell: ~~ Presents a warning against false views of salvation, ~ or false gospels, ~ and he also presents the correct view of salvation, ~ or the true gospel.

►► For the remainder of our time, ~ verse 1.

VS. 1 BEGINS W/ AN EXHORTATION TO BELIEVERS. ~~ "REJOICE IN THE LORD."

BASED ON THE CONTEXT, ~ PAUL IS PROBABLY REFERRING TO REJOICING IN WHO Jesus is and what he has done for us. ~~ Stresses the continuous action of rejoicing.

▶ The idea here seems to be that Paul is calling us to continually be overjoyed about who Jesus is and what he has done for us.

▶▶I would think that this is easy to do.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I$ say this because when we truly grasp who Jesus is and what he has done for us, ~ incredible joy will just well up and overflow in our hearts.

► Think about it. ~~ "My sin — oh, ~ the bliss of this glorious tho't! — My sin, ~ not in part, ~ but the whole, ~ Is nailed to the cross ~ and I bear it no more, ~ Praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul! ~~ "as far as the east is from the west"

▶ How could this truth not cause incredible joy to well up & overflow in our hearts? 11 4/6

NOW, ~ THE QUESTION COULD ARISE, ~ WHY THIS EXHORTATION HERE?

▶▶Most likely Paul gives us this exhortation because, ~ when we are continually overjoyed about Jesus and what he has done for us, ~ that will become our focus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$, ~ who Jesus is and what he has done for us will become the center of attention.

►►And as a result, ~ we will be less likely to abandon the sound doctrine of sola fide, ~ faith alone.

 \triangleright We will not be fooled into believing a false gospel that says a person can be saved through such things as status, ~ 77

→ →accomplishments, ~ works, ~ our own righteousness, ~ or religion and its religious rituals.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And we will not fall for the false gospel that says to be saved it takes faith + something.

<u>LET'S NOW LOOK AT THE END OF VERSE 1. ~~ "TO WRITE THE SAME THINGS TO</u> you is no trouble to me and is safe ~ [i.e., ~ a safeguard] ~ for you."

PHRASE "THE SAME THINGS" REFERS & INTRODUCES WHAT FOLLOWS.

► Verses 2-11 are a repetition of teaching that Paul sent in previous letters. ~~ As noted, ~ Paul presents a warning against false gospels, ~ and also presents the true gospel.

▶ Paul informs them that he never gets tired of telling them these things. ~~ And he does it to safeguard their faith.

BASICALLY, ~ I WOULD SUGGEST THAT THE TEACHING WHICH PAUL PRESENTS IN 3:2-11, ~ and a regular review of it, ~ will do two things.

 \blacktriangleright 1st, ~ will protect us from false gospels, ~~ & 2nd, ~ it will ground us in the truth of the true gospel, ~ that a person is saved ~ by grace alone ~ through faith alone ~ in Jesus alone.

 \blacktriangleright And since there are many voices out there promoting false views of salvation, ~ we need to carefully study what Paul says here, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ and also the whole of what Scripture teaches, ~ about what it takes to have a saving relationship with Jesus.

▶ Then it will be highly unlikely we'll be led astray by false these false gospels. 11 5/6

CONCLUSION.

SOLA FIDE ~~ FAITH ALONE. ~~ FAITH AONE IN JESUS ALONE.

► For nothing good have I ~ Whereby Thy grace to claim; ~~ I'll wash my garments white ~ in the blood of Calv'ry's Lamb.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jesus paid it all, ~ all to Him I owe; ~~ Sin had left a crimson stain, ~ he washed it white as snow.
