SOLA FIDE (FAITH ALONE), PT. 2; PHIL. 3:2-3 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

SOLA FIDE ~ FAITH ALONE.

► Summary of biblical doctrine teaching that a person is declared righteous or justified by God on the basis of our faith alone in Jesus alone & not by works or anything else.

► As noted ~ sola fide is basically what Paul discusses in this next paragraph that we are currently looking at, ~ Phil. 3:1-11.

►Last time we spent a significant amount of time building a solid foundation, ~ and purposefully so, ~ in order for us to get a better handle on the meat of this paragraph.

▶ Today we will take up verses 2-3. ~~ Recall vs. 1 included in foundation.

BASICALLY, ~ IN VERSE 2, ~ PAUL WARNS BELIEVERS TO WATCH OUT FOR THOSE who say that salvation is by faith in Jesus + something else.

FURTHER, ~ IT'S A WARNING AGAINST THOSE WHO SAY THAT WE CAN BE JUSTIFIED before God through religion and its rituals.

GROUP CALLED THE JUDAIZERS CONSTANTLY PLAGUED PAUL & HIS CONVERTS.

▶ They added works of the law to faith in Christ, ~ both for salvation and for Christian living. ~~ They did not omit faith in Christ but added works of the flesh.

>>But note what Paul says in Rom. 3:20a, ~ "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight."

▶ The OT rite of circumcision was of special concern to them. ~~ They insisted that it was necessary for salvation.

 $\triangleright \triangleright C$ ircumcision signified membership in the community of Israel, ~ and set them apart as God's people. ~~ But it had no value in commending someone to God.

▶ Paul is mainly concerned here in verse 2 with circumcision being added to faith.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But what he says applies to any teaching that adds anything to faith in Jesus . . .

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It also applies to the teaching that practicing religion and its rituals will get a person into heaven. 11 1/6

► Anyone who teaches that we can be justified before God through religion and their rituals, ~ or that salvation is by faith in Jesus plus something else, ~ is teaching a false gospel.

→→In Gal., ~ stern words for those who preach a false gospel. ~~ Accursed. (1:8-9)

VS. 2. ~~ LOOK AT PAUL'S THREEFOLD (NOT 3 GROUPS) DESCRIPTION OF THESE purveyors of false gospels.

► This description applies to all false teachers, ~ not just those who teach erroneous views of salvation. ~~ So we'll expand to include all types of false teaching. ~~ Verse 2 . . .

▶ Paul uses extremely vivid language here.

>>Most likely he uses it to wake us, ~ believers, ~ up to the terrible risk that false teachers pose. ~~ TPID, ~ shock us into reality. ~~ Not to be treated flippantly.

►►And notice Paul says "look out for" 3 times. ~~ "look out for" is a strong word, ~ meaning "look out for" or "be warned against."

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Thus the seriousness of the warning is quite apparent.

NOW LET'S LOOK AT PAUL'S THREEFOLD DESCRIPTION OF FALSE TEACHERS.

▶▶1st, ~ Paul calls them "dogs." ~~ Not pets ~~ When Jesus ~~ "house dog."

>>Uses different word. ~~ Paul most likely referring to the "dogs of the streets."

 \rightarrow The packs of homeless, ~ ravenous dogs which roamed the countryside eating whatever they could. ~~ Were vicious & attacked people on the street.

>>As these "dogs of the streets" represented a danger to those who encountered them, ~ so false teachers represent spiritual danger to their hearers.

▶ ≥nd, ~ Paul calls them "evildoers."

 \triangleright Most likely in the sense that they professed to work for the gospel, ~ but whose work in reality was evil. ~ 2 Cor. 11:13-15

>>False teachers come in disguise. ~~ Peter ~~ Jude

▶▶And thirdly, ~ Paul calls them mutilators. ~~ I.e., ~ their work does only harm. 11 2/6

PAUL USES VIVID LANGUAGE AND REPETITION TO AWAKEN US TO THE DANGER OF false teaching.

▶▶ False teaching is not neutral. ~~ False teaching is not harmless.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In his second epistle, ~ Peter says that false teaching is "destructive." ~~ It is destructive to both the church and to individual believers' faith.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In Titus 1:10-11, ~ speaking of false teachers, ~ Paul states, ~ "For there are many who are insubordinate, ~ empty talkers and deceivers, ~ especially those of the circumcision party. ~~ They must be silenced."

 \rightarrow Then Paul tells us why. ~~ He says, ~ "since they are <u>upsetting</u> whole families by teaching for shameful gain what they ought not to teach."

 \rightarrow "upsetting" means to cause serious difficulty or trouble with regard to someone's belief.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jude combines both the fact that false teachers come in disguise and that they are destructive.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Jude compares them teachers to "hidden reefs" that will suddenly destroy ships that come too near. ~~ IOW, ~ hidden dangers.

► There can be no compromise on our part with false teaching, ~ any more than a surgeon could compromise with a cancerous tumor in a patient's body.

IN VERSE 3a, ~ PAUL POINTS OUT THAT THOSE WHO HAVE FAITH ALONE IN Jesus alone are the true people of God.

"FOR WE ARE THE CIRCUMCISION."

► Briefly put, ~ "circumcision" here is used figuratively as a title for "the true people of God," ~ the church. ~~ And "we" refers to believers in Jesus and him alone.

▶ Paul is drawing a contrast here between true believers and those who teach and also those who hold to false gospels.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Idea here is this: ~~ "For we, ~ i.e., ~ those who have faith alone in Jesus alone, ~ and not those who teach or hold to false gospels, ~ we are the true people of God."

THEN IN VS. 3b, ~ PAUL GIVES US A FULLER PICTURE OF THE genuine people of God. 13/6

SPECIFICALLY, ~ HE MARKS OUT THREE DISTINCTIVE QUALITIES OF GENUINE believers.

▶ Paul points out that there is a definite ~ and stark ~ difference between the genuine people of God and those who propagate or who trust in false gospels.

▶►Also, ~ what Paul says here provides a guideline to help us spot a teacher of false gospels.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ If a Bible preacher or teacher lacks these qualities, ~ alarm bells should go off.

1st, ~ THE GENUINE PEOPLE OF GOD "WORSHIP BY THE SPIRIT OF GOD."

► Genuine believers' worship is not a worship based in religious ritual! ~~ Sacrifices, ~ ordinances, ~ religious ceremonies, ~ etc.

► Ours, ~ i.e., ~ genuine believers, ~ is a worship of God that is prompted by the Holy Spirit dwelling within us ~ and flows forth from grateful hearts.

 $\triangleright \triangleright As$ the believer ponders the greatness of God our King and Savior, ~ the blessings we have from him, ~ and the work he has done on our behalf, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The Holy Spirit kindles within believers' hearts a raging, ~ unquenchable fire of awe, ~ gratitude, ~ and love for our Savior, ~ 77

which naturally results in heartfelt worship of our most awesome God.

PLEASE NOTE THE 2nd DISTINCTIVE QUALITY OF THE GENUINE PEOPLE OF GOD.

We "glory in Christ Jesus." ~~ I.e., ~ we boast about what Christ Jesus has done, ~ not in in who we are or in what we've done.

▶ We boast about what Jesus has done.

 \triangleright This is so because we know and readily acknowledge that our justification before God is an act of his grace, ~ which we received through faith alone in Jesus alone.

► We can't take any credit for our salvation.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In Eph. 2:8-9, ~ "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." 11 4/6

▶▶So we boast about Jesus and what he has done.

 $\triangleright \triangleright As$ Paul says in 1 Cor. 1:31, ~ "so that, as it is written, 'Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Man freed from a legion of demons by Jesus serves as example to us.

►►And in glory none of us will be able to say, ~ "let me tell you how I got myself here." ~~ No, ~ for all eternity, ~ we'll be boasting about Jesus and rejoicing in what he's done.

► Later we'll sing these words from Fanny Crosby. ~~ And if we are a genuine believer, ~ we should be singing them with great gusto and extreme gratitude.

>>Redeemed, how I love to proclaim it! Redeemed by the blood of the Lamb; Redeemed thru His infinite mercy, His child and forever I am.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ This, ~ my . . ., ~ is our salvation testimony.

 \rightarrow As Peter says in his first epistle, ~ we were not redeemed "with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot."

NOW LET'S LOOK AT THE 3rd DISTINCTIVE QUALITY OF THE GENUINE PEOPLE OF GOD.

► We "put no confidence in the flesh."

► When a person has such confidence, ~ he/she thinks that they are good enough in themselves, ~ or have what it takes, ~ or have sufficient ability to do whatever it takes, ~ to gain entrance into heaven.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But this is misplaced confidence, ~ because no one can gain entrance into heaven this way.

>>Jesus said that the tax collector who cried out for mercy from a distance "went down to his house justified."

→→But the Pharisee who bragged about his religious achievements remained condemned. (Luke 18:9-14)

► Genuine believers "put no confidence in the flesh."

▶ Paul's overarching point here, ~ I would suggest, ~ is this: ~~ We put no confidence in the notion that we could <u>be</u> in any way, ~ or <u>are</u> in any way, ~ the <u>source</u> of our salvation. 115/6

▶▶To explain more clearly, ~ for our salvation, ~ we rely upon no outward privilege, ~ physical advantage, ~ or outward appearance.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We place no confidence in who we are or efforts on our part.

>>We do not put trust in religious ceremonies or human qualifications.

 \triangleright There is no way we could be in any way, ~ or are in any way, ~ the source of our salvation,~ and we fully know and acknowledge it.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We also fully know and acknowledge that it is by God's free and undeserved favor we have been saved through faith.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow I.e., ~ faith alone in Jesus alone is the channel by which one receives God's free and undeserved favor and is saved.

 \rightarrow And in this, ~ and only this, ~ we put our confidence.

CONCLUSION.

I WILL NOT BOAST IN ANYTHING: ~~ NO GIFTS, ~ NO POWER, ~ NO WISDOM.

▶ But I will boast in Jesus Christ: ~~ His death and resurrection.

▶▶Why should I gain from His reward? ~~ I cannot give an answer.

▶ But this I know with all my heart: ~~ His wounds have paid my ransom.
