CLOSING EXHORTATIONS, PT. 5; PHIL. 4:8-9 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL LOOK AT THE LAST TWO ~ OF PAUL'S SIX CLOSING EXHORTATIONS ~ in Philippians, ~ chapter 4, ~ verses 4-9. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Bulk of time on the fifth exhortation.

THE FIFTH EXHORTATION. ~~ VERSE 8.

▶▶"whatever is true, ~~~ whatever is honorable, ~~~ whatever is just, ~~~ whatever is pure, ~~~ whatever is lovely, ~~~ whatever is commendable, ~ 77

Dif there is any excellence, ~~~ if there is anything worthy of praise, ~~~ think ~ about these things."

THE BASIC COMMAND HERE IS: ~~ "THINK ABOUT THESE THINGS."

SIMPLY PUT, \sim THE PHRASE \sim "THESE THINGS" \sim REFERS \sim TO WHATEVER \sim is morally excellent and praiseworthy.

▶▶So, ~ we can expand on the basic command: ~~ 77

>>"Think about ~ whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy."

- ▶▶Now, ~ it's important to understand ~ Paul is looking at these things ~ from a biblical perspective.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ I.e., ~ how Scripture ~ defines these terms, ~~ not ~ how the world defines them.
 - \triangleright The world ~ has a very warped sense ~ of what is morally excellent and praiseworthy.
 - \rightarrow And we, \sim believers, \sim must never \sim align ourselves \sim with the world's definitions \sim of these things.
 - \rightarrow Rather, ~ we, ~ believers, ~ are to line up ~ with the Bible's definition ~ of these things. 11/13

\triangleright \triangleright So, ~ we could expand again on the basic command ~ and say, \Rightarrow \Rightarrow Think about ~ whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy according to the Lord."
```

WE COULD ASK, ~ "WHY DOES PAUL WANT US TO THINK ABOUT THESE THINGS?"

- ▶ Well, ~ for at least ~ two, ~ most likely obvious, ~ reasons.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ he wants us ~ to renew our minds ~ and here he tells us how.
 - ⇒⇒In Rom. ~ 12, ~ vs. 2, ~ Paul writes, ~ 77
 - →→"Do not ~ be conformed to this world, ~ but be transformed ~ by the renewal of your mind."
 - \rightarrow I.e., ~ instead ~ of being conformed to this world any longer, ~ as we were when we were unsaved, ~ 77
 - → we are to renew our minds ~ by changing ~ the way we think.
 - → And part of how we do that, ~ is by thinking about things ~ 77
 - →→that are morally excellent and praiseworthy from God's perspective.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd}$, ~ Paul wants us to think about whatever is morally excellent & praiseworthy, ~ 77
 - → because ~ he wants our minds ~ centered on the right things.
 - \rightarrow And \sim the things \sim that are morally excellent and praiseworthy according to God standards \sim are \sim the right things.
- "THINK ABOUT \sim WHATEVER \sim IS MORALLY EXCELLENT AND PRAISEWORTHY according to God's standards," \sim Paul says.
 - ▶▶The tense of the Greek verb ~ for "think about" ~ points to continuing activity.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ So we can expand the basic command again ~ and read it as, ~ 77
 - The continually think about \sim whatever is morally excellent and praiseworthy." $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Don't ever stop doing this, \sim Paul says. 11 2/13

▶ The idea here, ~ when Paul says, ~ "continually think about" ~ seems to be ~ that Paul is calling us ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ to continually fill our minds with, ~ focus on, ~ and give serious thought to ~ 77

→ → whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy according to God's standards.

→ Not just give them a passing thought.

GGOccupy our minds with these things. ~~ Dwell on them.

OK, ~ THE EXPANDED BASIC COMMAND.

- ▶►"Continually fill your minds with, ~ focus on, ~ and give serious thought to ~ whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy according to God's standards."
- \blacktriangleright Now, ~ we should understand ~ that this exercise ~ is not ~ geared for us to critically evaluate the culture around us ~ 77

Dwith its warped standards of morality and of what's praiseworthy.

- ▶▶We don't do this ~ in order to show them ~ just how depraved they are.
- This exercise \sim is geared to bring about \sim thinking and behavior in us \sim that is glorifying and pleasing to God.
- ▶▶And of course, ~ as we discussed before, ~ upon seeing our godly behavior, ~ 77

Dosome unbelievers will become open to the gospel ~ and be saved.

NOW, ~ PRIOR TO THE BASIC COMMAND, ~ 77

PAUL GIVES US A LIST ~ OF ~ SIX ~ SPECIFIC THINGS ~ THAT FALL UNDER THE category of morally excellent and praiseworthy. 11 3/13

>> "Continually ~ fill your minds with, ~ focus on, ~ and give serious thought to ~~ whatever
 is true, ~~ 77
    Downatever is honorable, ~~ whatever is just, ~~ whatever is pure, ~~ whatever is lovely.
     ~~~ whatever is commendable."
 ▶▶Now, ~ we're not going to look at all of these, ~ 77
     Din order ~ to focus on the bigger picture, ~ not only of this exhortation ~ 77
        → but ~ of the sixth exhortation as well.
    \triangleright \triangleright I will, ~ however, ~ highlight, ~ two of them ~ to give us a sampling, ~ 77
        "whatever things are true," ~~~ "whatever things are right."
           → And you can research the other four ~ in your personal study.
"CONTINUALLY ~ FILL YOUR MINDS WITH, ~ FOCUS ON, ~ AND GIVE SERIOUS thought
to ~ whatever is true."
 ▶▶This covers anything that is true.
 ▶▶But first and foremost, ~ it refers ~ to God's word.
     >> And this ~ is where I would like us ~ to put our focus.
     \triangleright \triangleright Ps. 19, ~ verse 9b ~ LEB.
        → "The ordinances of Yahweh ~ are true; ~~~~ they ~ are righteous altogether."
 ▶▶So, ~ first ~ and foremost, ~ 11
```

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow As$ I said before, ~ a seldom ~ or never opened, ~ dust-covered ~ Bible ~ benefits no one ~ but Satan. 11 4/13

>> we need to continually ~ fill our minds with, ~ focus on, ~ and give serious thought to ~

God's word.

- ▶ When it comes to God's word, ~ which is absolute truth, ~ continually ~ filling our minds with it, ~ focusing on it, ~ and giving serious thought to it ~ 77
 - Dis essential ~ in counteracting ~ the lies of Satan, ~ the world, ~ and our sin nature.
- $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ it essential in counteracting the lies of Satan.
 - \triangleright In Jn. ~ 8, ~ verse 44b, ~ Jesus said that Satan ~ "does not stand in the truth , ~~ because ~ there is no truth in him. ~~ 77
 - DDWhen he lies, ~~ he speaks out of his own character ~ 77
 - \rightarrow [i.e., ~ When he tells a lie ~ he is only doing what is natural to him], ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ for he is a liar ~ and the father of lies ~ 77
 - ⇒ → [I.e., ~ all the falsehood in the world ~ owes its existence to Satan]."
- \triangleright 2nd, ~ continually ~ filling our minds with, ~ focusing on, ~ and giving serious thought to ~ God's word, ~ is essential ~ in counteracting the lies ~ of the world.
 - \triangleright We live in a world, ~ to paraphrase Isaiah, ~ that increasingly says ~ evil is good ~ and good is evil, ~ 7.7
 - → that dark is light ~ and light is dark, ~~ that bitter is sweet ~ and sweet is bitter.
- $\triangleright \triangleright 3^{rd}$, ~ continually filling our minds with, ~ focusing on, ~ and giving serious thought to ~ God's word, ~ is essential ~ in counteracting the lies ~ of our own making.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright My$. . . , ~~ even though we are saved and have a new nature, ~ we still have ~ our sin nature.
 - \rightarrow And \sim we \sim are more than capable \sim of deceiving ourselves.
 - \triangleright Speaking of our fallen nature, ~ Jeremiah says in ~ Jer. ~ 17, ~ verse 9, ~ "The heart is deceitful ~ above all things, ~ and desperately sick; ~~ who can understand it?
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ And over in Romans, \sim Paul says that \sim nothing good \sim dwells in our sin nature.

- ▶ Continually ~ filling our minds with, ~ focusing on, ~ and giving serious thought to ~ God's word ~ which is absolute truth, ~ is essential ~ 77
 - Din counteracting ~ the lies of our own making, ~ the lies of the world, ~ 77
 - → and ~ the lies of Satan.

NEXT, \sim "CONTINUALLY \sim FILL YOUR MINDS WITH, \sim FOCUS ON, \sim AND GIVE SERIOUS thought to \sim whatever is just."

- ▶▶"just" ~ here ~ refers ~ to what is upright or just, ~ conformable to God's standards ~ and thus worthy ~ of his approval.
 - \triangleright IOW, ~ we are to continually think about things ~ that ~ are in perfect harmony ~ 77
 - → with the eternal, ~ unchanging, ~ divine standard ~ of a holy God ~ revealed in Scripture.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ To put it very briefly, \sim we are \sim to continually \sim fix our minds \sim on things \sim that are right in God's eyes.
- ▶Notice, \sim not \sim things that are right in our eyes, \sim not \sim things that are right in others' eyes, \sim 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ and not ~ things that are right in the world's eyes.
 - \rightarrow The world ~ has a very warped view ~ of what is right.
- \blacktriangleright We're \sim to continually fix our minds \sim on things that are right \sim in God's eyes. 11 6/13

NOW, ~ IF YOU'LL NOTICE IN VERSE 8, ~ RIGHT AFTER LISTING THE SIX specific things to think about, ~ Paul moves ~ from the specific ~ to the general.

"CONTINUALLY ~ FILL YOUR MINDS WITH, ~ FOCUS ON, ~ AND GIVE SERIOUS thought to ~ these specific things: ~~ 77 11 6/13

- ►► whatever is true, ~~ whatever is honorable, ~~ whatever is just, ~~ whatever is pure, ~~ whatever is lovely, ~~ whatever is commendable."
 - >> Then he moves to the general: ~~ "if there is any excellence, ~~ if there is anything worthy of praise."
- ▶►IOW, ~ he gives us a list of some specific things to think about ~ that are morally excellent and praiseworthy.
- ▶►Then ~ at the end of the list, ~ 77
 - Dhe gives us ~ a comprehensive statement ~ to include ~ anything and everything ~ that is morally excellent and praiseworthy.
- ▶▶IOW, ~ we are not restricted to the list of six specific things.
 - \triangleright It is a representative list.
- ▶ Paul now includes ~ everything ~ that happens to be morally excellent and praiseworthy according to God's standards.

AND THAT BRINGS US BACK TO THE EXPANDED BASIC COMMAND.

"CONTINUALLY ~ FILL YOUR MINDS WITH, ~ FOCUS ON, ~~ AND GIVE SERIOUS thought to ~ whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy according to God's standards."

- ► Our thoughts ~ should <u>not</u> ~ center ~ on that which is ~~ false, ~~ frivolous, ~~ trivial, ~~ trashy, ~~ vulgar, ~~ dishonorable, ~~ shameful, ~~ or ~~ immoral.
 - \triangleright \triangleright When our minds ~ are focused on these types of things, ~ 77
 - \rightarrow we will come to find ~ that these types of things ~ 77
 - \rightarrow will consequently dominate \sim our thinking, \sim our attitudes, \sim and \sim our behavior. 11 7/13

▶▶Rather, ~ our minds should concentrate ~ on whatever ~ is morally excellent and praiseworthy from God's perspective. >> And then ~ we will find ~ that our thinking, ~ attitudes, ~ and behavior ~ will tend to be ~ morally excellent and commendable. ▶▶ Are you familiar with the term ~ GIGO? ~~~ Not Geico! ~~~ GIGO. >>It was coined in the early days of computers. >>If the data entered into a computer ~ is bad, ~ the computer ~ can't do anything good with it. → What you put into a computer ~ determines ~ what comes out. \triangleright If you put the right data in, ~ the right answers come out. \triangleright The reverse ~ is also true. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ GIGO ~ was coined to express that truth. ⇒⇒It describes ~ both ~ the cause ~ and the consequence ~ of entering the wrong data into a computer. →→It stands ~ for ~ "Garbage In, ~ Garbage Out." >>Loved ones, ~ if we put garbage into our minds, ~~ guess what's going to come out? $\triangleright \triangleright$ But, ~ if we continually put into our minds ~ whatever ~ 77 → is morally excellent and praiseworthy, ~ according to God's standards, ~ 77 → the resulting output ~~ in our thinking, ~~ in our attitudes, ~ and ~~ in our behavior, ~ 77 will be that which is glorifying and pleasing to God. ▶▶To come at it from a different angle: ~~ 77 ▷It's said, ~ "Sow a thought, ~ reap an action. ⇒⇒ Sow an action, ~ reap a habit. ~~ 77 ⇒ ⇒ Sow a habit, ~ reap a character. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Sow a character, ~ reap a destiny. 11 8/13

NOW LET'S TURN TO PAUL'S ~ SIXTH AND FINAL ~ CLOSING EXHORTATION. ~~ verse 9a

"WHAT YOU HAVE LEARNED ~ AND RECEIVED ~ AND HEARD ~ AND SEEN IN ME ~~ practice these things."

WE'LL SPLIT THIS INTO TWO PARTS.

- ▶▶1st, ~ we'll look at "What you ~ have learned and received and heard and seen in me."
- ▶▶2nd, ~ we'll look at "practice these things."

 1^{st} , ~ "WHAT YOU ~ HAVE LEARNED AND RECEIVED AND HEARD AND SEEN IN ME, ~ I.E., Paul."

- ▶ Remember, ~ this was originally written to the believers in Philippi ~ who knew Paul.
 - \triangleright For us, ~ it refers ~ to all of what we've learned from studying this letter, ~ 77
 - → which gives us some information about Paul.
 - →→E.g., ~ his very positive attitude in suffering.
- ▶▶So, ~ the application for us, ~ believers here at NHCC, ~ is this: ~~ 77
 - Paul says, ~ "What you have learned from studying this letter."
 - >> And we've learned a lot.
 - \triangleright Eliminating the breaks from the letter, ~ we've spent ~ about a year in it.
 - →→So far. ~~~ We're not done studying it yet.
 - >>So, ~ we've learned much so far. ~~ Consequently, ~ 77
 - → our brains ~ should be packed full ~ of knowledge from this letter. 11 9/13

OK, ~ NOW WE'LL LOOK AT THE PHRASE: ~~ "PRACTICE THESE THINGS."

- ▶▶I.e., ~ "take what you've learned from studying this letter, ~ Paul says, ~ and ~ put it ~ into practice."
- ▶▶The tense of the verb for ~ "practice" ~ indicates ~ repeated action.

 \triangleright IOW, ~ we are to make ~ practicing what we've learned ~ a habit ~ in our daily lives.

THIS IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND.

IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE, ~ WE ARE TO NEVER STOP ~ AT SIMPLY GAINING knowledge from Scripture.

▶▶God's goal for us ~ is not ~ for us to just simply "know," ~~ but to "know ~ and ~ do."

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$, ~ to put ~ what we learn ~ into practice ~ on a daily basis.

PAUL MAKES THIS CLEAR IN EPHESIANS.

- ▶ In chapters 1-3, $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Paul ~ explains ~ our great salvation ~ and its accompanying blessings that God has freely given us.
- ▶ In chapter 4, ~ verse 1, ~ through chapter 6, ~ verse 9, $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Paul gives a detailed description ~ of how we, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ who have been given this great salvation and its accompanying blessings, \sim are to live as a result.
- ▶▶So, ~~ Ephesians, ~ chapters 1-3, ~ deal with ~ knowing.
- ▶▶And, ~~ Eph., ~ 4, ~ vs. 1, ~ through chap. 6, ~ Vs. 9, ~ deal with ~ doing. ↓↓ 10/13

- ▶▶For the first eleven chapters, ~ Paul discussed theology, ~~ the wonderful fact ~ of our salvation by grace through faith.
- ▶▶Then in Rom. 12, ~ he switches the subject to behavior.

>>How should we act? ~~ How should we behave?

→ The word "therefore" ~ in 12:1 ~ connects who we are with what we should do.

► Our behavior described in Romans 12 and following ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ should be a direct consequence \sim of God's grace in our lives, \sim discussed in chapters 1-11.

▶ So, ~ again, ~ God's goal for us, ~ believers, ~ is not ~ for us to just simply "know," ~~ 77 DD but to "know ~ and ~ do."

EZRA ~ IN THE OLD TESTAMENT, ~ STANDS AS AN EXAMPLE ~ FOR PREACHERS AND teachers of God's word ~ in what he had devoted himself to do.

- ▶ But, ~ he also stands as an example ~ for all believers ~ in the first two categories ~ that he had dedicated himself to do.
- **▶**Ezra ~ 7, ~ verse 10.

 \triangleright "For Ezra ~ had set his heart ~ to study the Law of the Lord, ~~ and to do it ~~ and to teach his statutes and rules in Israel."

▶▶Let's break this down.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ Ezra ~ "had set his heart." 11/13

- \rightarrow He determined within his heart ~ that he would ~ faithfully and resolutely ~ commit himself ~ 77
 - → → to the habits ~ detailed in the rest of the verse.
- $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd}$, ~ Ezra ~ determined within his heart ~ to study ~ the law of the Lord.
 - \rightarrow He dedicated his life \sim to the reading and detailed examination \sim of God's Word.
- $\triangleright \triangleright 3^{rd}$, ~ Ezra ~ determined within his heart ~ to obey ~ the word of the Lord.
 - → His examination of the Scriptures ~ was not simply ~ a growth of knowledge.
 - → → He applied that knowledge ~ to his life.
 - ~ I.e., ~ he put ~ what he learned ~ into practice in his daily life.
- \triangleright And 4th, ~ Ezra ~ determined within his heart ~ to teach ~ God's word ~ throughout Israel.
 - \rightarrow He did not ~ keep the things he learned ~ to himself. ~~ He taught them ~ to others.
- ▶▶For preachers and teachers of God's word, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ he stands ~ as an example to follow ~ in all three categories, ~ study, ~ do, ~ and ~ teach.
- ▶▶But all believers ~ should follow Ezra's dedication ~ to study ~ and ~ to do ~ God's word.
 - >> All of us ~ should dedicate ourselves ~ 77
 - to the reading and detailed examination of God's word, ~~ 77
 - → → and ~ 77
 - → to putting what we learn ~ into practice ~ in our daily lives.

CONCLUSION.

TO WRAP THINGS UP TODAY, ~ NOTICE ~ THAT PAUL ENDS HIS SERIES OF CLOSING exhortations ~ with an encouraging reminder.

- ▶ Verse 9b, ~ "and the God of peace will be with you."
- ▶▶Paul here reinforces the promise ~ of God's presence with us.
- ▶ This statement, ~ unlike his earlier statement, ~ "The Lord is near," ~ is much easier to pinpoint as to where it fits.
 - >>There's a little more to it, ~ 77
 - → but given that it comes at the conclusion of the six exhortations, ~ most likely it applies to all of them.
- ▶►Since we have recently spent a great deal of time on this promise, ~ 77
 - DDI will just say this, ~ and then we'll be done.
- ▶▶Point Paul's making here in verse 9b ~ is that ~ as we live out these six exhortations, ~ 77
 - \triangleright Yahweh, ~ the sovereign creator of the universe ~ and our God, ~ will be with us ~ and ~ will help us carry them out.
- ▶▶To God ~ be the glory forever and ever.
