THE CENTER OF THE GOSPEL MESSAGE; COL. 1:6c, EPH. 2:8-9a (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

AT PRESENT IN OUR STUDY OF COLOSSIANS, ~ WE HAVE BEEN FOCUSING OUR attention on Paul's brief discussion of the gospel in Col. ~ 1: ~ 5b-6.

 \blacktriangleright As we have noted, \sim from what Paul says about the gospel in vv. 5b-6, \sim we can make at least 7 observations.

IN OUR STUDY, ~ WE HAVE COMPLETED OUR LOOK AT THE FIRST SIX. ⇒⇒ JUST A brief review.

- $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ we observed that the gospel is the good news ~ that Jesus has solved the problem of sin and death ~ through his death, ~ burial, ~ and resurrection.
- ▶▶ 2^{nd} , ~ we noted that Paul set forth the essential nature of the gospel: $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ abs. truth.
- $\triangleright 3^{rd}$, ~ we observed that in our unsaved state we do not seek God. ~~ God seeks us.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright 4^{th}$, ~ we noted that the gospel is for everyone in the whole world, ~ not just one nation or ethnic group.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright 5^{th}$, ~ we observed that the gospel is the living and enduring word of God ~ and it bears fruit.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$, ~ it produces salvation in all who call upon Jesus for salvation.
- \blacktriangleright And 6th, ~ we noted that the gospel is going out into all the world without restriction.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL FOCUS OUR ATTENTION ON THE 7th AND FINAL OBSERVATION.

►► And with that we'll conclude our look at the first major section of Colossians. 11 1/9

AT THE END OF VERSE 6, ~ FROM WHAT PAUL SAYS ABOUT THE GOSPEL, ~ WE can observe ~ that the gospel ~ is a message of God's grace.

SINCE THE DAY YOU HEARD IT ~ [I.E., ~ THE GOSPEL. ~~ SINCE THE DAY YOU HEARD ~ the gospel] ~ and understood the grace of God in truth.

▶▶The phrase "the grace of God" is parallel to "the gospel."

>> Another way of saying this is ~ "since the day you heard the gospel and understood it."

- ▶▶IOW, ~ Paul is using the phrase "the grace of God" ~ as a synonym of "the gospel."
- ▶▶The question is why?

 \triangleright Well, ~ no doubt to emphasize ~ and to remind these believers in Colossae ~ that God's grace ~ is at the center ~ of the gospel message.

 \blacktriangleright Keeping the overall context of the letter in mind, \sim it could be \sim that, \sim along with their other heresies, \sim 77

Dethe false teachers ~ were denying the doctrine ~ of salvation by grace alone, ~ 77

- → and were teaching some kind of salvation by human works or human merit.
 - →→ So Paul reinforces the truth ~ of the doctrine of salvation by grace alone.

NOW, ~ IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT ~ THAT WE, ~ BELIEVERS HERE AT NHCC, ~ be well-grounded in this doctrine.

WE MUST NEVER ~ BE IN A POSITION ~ IN WHICH WE CAN BE FOOLED OR CAUGHT off guard by any teaching ~ that even hints at denying salvation by grace alone.

►►Any teaching that has even the slightest whiff \sim of salvation by human works or human merit. 11 2/9

SO, \sim WE'RE GOING TO DROP BACK INTO EPH. \sim 2: \sim 8-9, \sim TO REVIEW PAUL'S teaching on this matter.

► But purposefully so, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in order to make sure we are all on the right page when it comes to the doctrine of salvation by grace alone.

 \triangleright And ~ to protect us from false teaching.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ Recall, \sim in the context of warning against and refuting false doctrine, \sim Paul told the Philippian believers, \sim 77

 \rightarrow "It is no trouble for me to write the same things to you again, ~ and it is a safeguard for you."

 \blacktriangleright Also, ~ since Christmas was just a couple weeks ago, ~~ I think it's quite appropriate, ~ to review the truth of salvation by God's grace alone.

>>Because Christmastime should always be a reminder to us of God's grace.

→ Because of God's grace alone, ~ "to us a child is born, ~ to us a son is given."

→ Because of God's grace alone ~ "when the fullness of time had come, ~ God sent forth his Son."

OK, ~ LET'S EXAMINE EPH. ~ 2: ~ 8-9, ~ BEGINNING WITH VERSE 8a.

FOR BY GRACE YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED.

- ▶▶"grace" here means free and undeserved favor. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Saved by God's
- ▶▶Paul emphasizes "by grace." ~~ "For by grace you have been saved."

>>Paul does not want us to miss this, ~ 77

→ that the source of our salvation is God's grace, ~ and His grace alone! 11 3/9

▶ Earlier in Ephesians, ~ Paul said that God "lavished" His grace "upon us." >> The Greek word for "lavished" there means ~ 77 → more than enough, ~ to provide in abundance, ~ to cause to overflow. $\triangleright \triangleright God$ is infinitely rich in grace. \sim But He is not stingy with it. \sim Not like some cosmic Scrooge. >>God does not give His grace to us in limited measure, ~ carefully weighed out. >>He causes His grace to overflow, ~ to abound to us. ~~ Gives it in overflowing measure. ▶▶"Marvelous grace of our loving Lord, ~ Grace that exceeds our sin and our guilt! ~~ Marvelous, ~ infinite, ~ matchless grace, ~ freely bestowed on all who believe." ▶▶And God's grace is sufficiently abundant ~ to cover the sins of all ~~ and is adequate ~ for the worst of sinners. >> Some might think, ~ "Oh, ~ God could never forgive me for what I've done" → Jesus abundantly bestows His grace on all who respond to the gospel in true repentance. ▶ Paul: ~~ classic example. ~~ He testifies to this in 1 Tim. 1:12-14. >> "I thank him who has given me strength, ~ Christ Jesus our Lord, ~ because he judged me faithful, ~ appointing me to his service, ~ though formerly I was a blasphemer, ~ persecutor, ~ and insolent opponent. ~ 77 → But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ~ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus." >>Even the vilest of sinners who come to Jesus in true repentance and call out to Him for salvation ~ will be forgiven and become a new creation in Christ. $\triangleright \triangleright O$ perfect redemption, ~ the purchase of blood, ~ to ev'ry believer the promise of God; ~~ The vilest offender who truly believes, ~ that moment from Jesus a pardon receives. 11 4/9

"FOR BY GOD'S GRACE, ~ AND GOD'S GRACE ALONE, ~ you have been saved," ~ Paul says.

- ▶ By God's grace, ~ believers have been freed from sin and our sin nature ~ Sin's curse has lost its grip on me. ~~ We have been freed from all the powers of evil.
 - >> Every one of our sins have been forgiven. ~~ Sin not in part **
 - → We have been reconciled with God. ~~ Peace with God. ~~ We have been delivered from God's wrath.
 - → → And we are now new creations. ⇒ ⇒ More: ~~ Citizens. ~~ Children of the King.
- ►► Truly!, ~ God's grace is amazing, ~ isn't it?

IN VS. 8b, ~ PAUL STATES HOW WE RECEIVE GOD'S GRACE FOR SALVATION.

FOR CONTEXT, ~ START AT BEGINNING OF VERSE 8.

- ▶Paul says "8a for by grace you have been saved ~ [and here's how we receive it:] ~ 8b through faith."
- ► We just talked about this recently, ~ but since it fits here and is so important, ~ let's review it in order to cement it into our hearts and minds.
- ▶ Whereas God's grace is the objective source of our salvation, ~ "through faith" is the subjective means ~ or channel ~ by which one receives God's grace and is saved.
- ▶ Remember, ~ the salvation that was purchased by Christ's death ~ is universal ~ in its provision. ~~ But not in its application.
 - \triangleright One is <u>not</u> automatically saved because Christ died, \sim but one is saved when one puts their faith in God's gracious provision. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Recall the illustration of this in Jn. 3:16.
- ▶▶By grace alone, ~ through faith alone, ~ in Christ Jesus alone. 11 5/9

THEN, ~ PERHAPS TO EMPHASIZE HIS POINT EVEN MORE, ~ THAT GOD'S GRACE alone is the source of our salvation, ~ 77

IN VERSES 8c-9a, ~ PAUL EXPLAINS ~ THAT OUR SALVATION DOES NOT ORIGINATE with humans in any way, ~ shape, ~ or form.

IN VERSE 8c, ~ HE SAYS THAT OUR SALVATION DOES NOT ORIGINATE within us.

HE SAYS, ~ "AND THIS ~ [I.E., ~ THIS SALVATION] ~ IS NOT YOUR OWN DOING; ~~ IT is the gift of God."

▶▶The phrase ~ "is not your own doing" ~ expresses that salvation does not have its origin or source with humans.

 \triangleright Could paraphrase verse 8c this way: "And this salvation ~ is not from you as a source."

HOW COULD IT BE?

- ▶ There is nothing within us \sim that could cause God to save us \sim or \sim that could cause us to produce our own salvation.
- ▶ Remember, ~ when unsaved, ~ we were spiritually "dead ~ in [our] trespasses and sins."
 - >>Now, ~ physical death ~ is a state from which people cannot break free on their own ~~ Why? ~ because they're dead.
 - \rightarrow When people are dead \sim they have no capability to generate life. \sim Lazarus
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ And just like physical death, ~ spiritual death is a state from which people cannot break free on their own.
 - →→When we were unsaved, ~ we had no capability to generate spiritual life.
- ▶▶Add to this the fact that we weren't even looking for salvation. ~~ In Rom. 3:11, ~ Paul says that "no one seeks for God." $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow A \& E's$ reaction. 11 6/9

▶ What's more ~ we were unable even to understand the things of God ~ let alone act on them.

Do In 1 Cor. 2:14, ~ Paul writes, ~ NIV ~ "The person without the Spirit ~ [i.e., ~ an unbeliever] ~ does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God ~ but considers them foolishness, ~ and cannot understand them ~ because they are discerned only through the Spirit."

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow I.e.$, \sim only those who have been given spiritual life can understand what the Spirit means.

▶▶There's no way ~ we could be ~ or are ~ the source of our salvation.

CONTINUING IN VERSE 8c, ~~ "AND THIS SALVATION IS NOT FROM YOU AS A source; ~~ it is the gift of God," ~ Paul says.

▶▶In the Grk. text, ~ "of God" here means ~ "from God."

Departable Paraphrase verse 8c this way: ~~ "And this salvation ~ is not from you as a source; ~~ it is the gift from God."

- ▶▶In Rom 3:23-24a, ~ Paul says, ~ "for all have sinned ~ and fall short of the glory of God, ~ and are justified by his grace ~ as a gift."
- ▶ In Rom. 6:23, ~ Paul: ~~ "For the wages of sin is death, ~ but the free gift of God ~ is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."
- ▶▶And Eph. 2:4-5, ~ "But God, ~ being rich in mercy." ~~ Let's stop right there for a minute.
 - \triangleright When we consider Paul's description in verses 1-3 of our unsaved state, \sim we were spiritually dead, \sim following this world and Satan, \sim 77
 - \rightarrow carrying out our sinful desires, \sim and were subject to, \sim deserving of, \sim and facing God's wrath, \sim 77
 - \rightarrow you would think ~ the next words out of Paul's mouth would be ~ "God is rich in wrath." ~~ But he gives us a wonderful surprise. 11 7/9

 \triangleright "But God, ~ being rich in <u>mercy</u>, ~ because of the great <u>love</u> with which he <u>loved us</u>, ~ even when we were dead in our trespasses, ~ made us alive together with Christ ~~ <u>by</u> <u>grace</u> you have been saved."

▶▶Our salvation is a free and undeserved gift from God. ~~ Originates w/ God. ~~ Yahweh.

IN VERSE 9a, ~ PAUL SAYS THAT NEITHER ARE OUR WORKS THE SOURCE OF OUR salvation.

"WORKS" HERE ~ REFERS TO ANY GOOD DEED BY WHICH A PERSON MIGHT SEEK TO gain God's favor and attain salvation.

▶▶In brief, ~ we <u>cannot</u> earn salvation by doing good works.

>> And it's definitely not earned by a person's good works outweighing their bad.

- ►► As Paul says in Rom. 11:6, ~~ "But if it is by grace, ~ it is no longer on the basis of works; ~~ otherwise grace would no longer be grace."
- ightharpoonup If we could earn salvation through works, ~ then God's grace would not be what it really is, ~ free and undeserved.
- ▶ Paul reinforces this truth in Titus 3:4-7.

DD"But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, ~ he saved us, ~ not because of works done by us in righteousness, ~ but according to his own mercy, ~ by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, ~ whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, ~ so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life."

- ▶ Paul makes it quite clear. ~~ Our salvation is <u>not</u> a result the righteous things we had done.
 - \rightarrow It is because God is rich in mercy \sim and loved us with a great love \sim that we are saved.

CONCLUSION.

GOD'S GRACE ~ IS AT THE CENTER ~ OF THE GOSPEL MESSAGE.

- ▶▶By God's incredibly free and undeserved favor ~ we have been saved.
- ▶ Even though we were spiritually dead and utterly sinful, ~ even though sinning was a way of life for us, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ even though we were following the standards of this present evil age, \sim even though were following Satan," \sim 77
 - → even though we were enslaved to our sinful nature and its sinful desires ~ 77
 - → even though we carried those sinful desires out, ~ 77
 - \rightarrow and even though we were subject to, \sim deserving of, \sim and destined for \sim 77 God's wrath, $\sim\sim$ 77
 - GG od's mercy and love led him to offer humanity the free and undeserved gift of salvation.
- ►► Amazing grace! ~ how sweet the sound, ~ That saved a wretch like me! ~~ I once was lost, ~ but now am found, ~ Was blind, ~ but now I see.
