### REASONS FOR GIVING THANKS, PT. 2; COL. 1:13 (Ed O'Leary)

#### INTRODUCTION.

CURRENTLY IN OUR STUDY OF COLOSSIANS, ~ WE ARE LOOKING AT FOUR REASONS ~ for joyfully and continually ~ giving thanks to God the Father.

#### TODAY, ~ WE'LL FOCUS ON THE SECOND REASON.

COLOSSIANS, ~ CHAPTER 1, ~ VERSE 13. \*Literal Trans.

▶▶The Father ~ "has rescued us ~ from the domain of darkness ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom ~ of the son of his love."

TWO NOTES RIGHT AT THE TOP HERE.

- $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$ , ~ this rescue and transference was not sequential. ~~~ I.e., ~ first rescue, ~ then transference.
  - >>It was concurrent. ~~~ The rescue and transference happened in one action.
  - >>There was no in between here.
    - → The Father did not rescue us and set us free ~ 77
      - →→with some promise of future entrance into the kingdom of his dear Son.
  - >>A believer's transfer is complete. ~~ We are not hovering between two kingdoms.
    - → We have left the domain of darkness behind forever ~ 77
      - $\rightarrow$  and have been placed firmly & permanently  $\sim$  in the kingdom of Jesus. 1111

 $\triangleright$ People who have undergone this kind of experience  $\sim$  have every reason to be profoundly grateful.

- → And their lives should be marked ~ by this profound gratitude.
  - → → We should live our lives every day ~ in an attitude ~ of gratitude.

>>Furthermore, ~ profound humility ~ should result from the truth of this rescue and transfer.

- → Because ~ we could not ~ and did not ~ rescue and transfer ourselves.
- $\rightarrow$  Because of his grace, ~ mercy, ~ and the great love with which he loves us, ~ 77
  - →→God the Father did the rescuing and transferring.
- → To him be the glory. ~~ Great things he has done.
- ▶▶And the 2<sup>nd</sup> note right at the top here.

 $\triangleright$  The past tense, ~ "has rescued," ~ "transferred," ~ points back to our conversion to Christ.

 $\triangleright$ IOW, ~ when we were saved, ~ God the Father ~ immediately and simultaneously ~ 77

"rescued us from the domain of darkness ~ and transferred us to the kingdom of the son of his love."

THE FATHER ~ Lit. Trans. ~~ "HAS RESCUED US ~ FROM THE DOMAIN OF DARKNESS ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom of the son of his love."

►► Grammatically, ~ the phrase ~ "of darkness" ~ can be viewed as being descriptive of "domain." 112/11

▶ We can read it as, ~ 77

Cod the Father has rescued us ~ from the domain ~ that is characterized by darkness ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom of the son of his love."

▶▶Unbelievers live in a domain which is characterized by darkness ~ and ruled over by Satan.

>>When we were unsaved, ~ we were a part of this domain.

RECALL WHAT WE SAID LAST WEEK ABOUT DARKNESS.

▶▶We noted that ~ in the Bible ~ darkness symbolizes evil and sin.

 $\triangleright$ It conveys moral evil, ~ unrighteousness, ~ falsehood, ~ error, ~ willful ignorance,  $\Rightarrow$  deceitfulness, ~ and self-deception.

⇒⇒It also signifies ~ corruption and death.

► Such things as ~ immorality, ~ anger, ~ strife, ~ vengeance, violence, ~ and oppression ~ thrive in such murk.

FURTHERMORE, ~ THE DOMAIN OF DARKNESS ~ IS THE REALM OF opposition toward God.

- ▶▶The unbeliever ~ is not only ~ without God in the world, ~ but he is also ~ against God.
- ▶▶The domain of darkness ~ is a realm of moral rebellion, ~ insubordination, ~ and creaturely independence.
- ▶John ~ 3: ~ 19-20, ~ And this is the judgment: ~~ the light has come into the world, ~~ and people loved the darkness rather than the light ~ because their works were evil. ~~ For everyone who does wicked things ~ hates the light ~ and does not come to the light, ~ lest his works should be exposed.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$  We were God's enemies while living in this domain.  $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$  3/11

- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$  in Eph. ~ 5: ~ 8, ~ Paul says that, ~ in our unsaved state, ~ we were ~ also characterized by darkness.
- ►Notice that Paul does not say, ~ 77

>> "you were in darkness" ~ or "you walked in darkness," ~ but rather "you were darkness."

- ▶▶This was no accident.
  - >>It is more than likely Paul intentionally chooses this language ~ 77
    - → to show us our absolute sinfulness before Jesus saved us.
- ▶▶We were not essentially good people ~ who had stumbled ~ or strayed off the path;
  - >>We were ~ in our very nature ~ "dark."
- ▶▶In our unsaved state we were spiritually dead.
  - >>Morally depraved. ~~ spiritually ignorant. ~~ 100% sinful.
  - $\triangleright$  Sinning was a way of life for us. ~~ We were following the standards of this world and Satan.
  - >> We were enslaved to our sinful nature and its sinful desires ~ 77
    - → and were carrying those sinful desires out daily.
  - $\triangleright$ And most tragically of all, ~ we were subject to, ~ deserving of, ~ and destined for ~ God's wrath. 11 4/11

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▶ Over in Eph. 2, ~ Paul said ~ that we were "separated from Christ," ⇒ that we had "no
hope," ~ and that we were "without God in the world."
   ⊳⊳"no hope."
      ⇒ I.e., ~ we had no promise of a glorious future ⇒ and therefore no confident
      expectation of a glorious future.
      →→For the believer, ~ life leads to a greater, ~ awesome life.
      → When we were unsaved, ~ life was leading ~ to despair, ~ discouragement, ~ 77
          → depression, ~ uncertainty for the future, ~ a fear of death, ~ and death itself.
   >> "without God in the world." ~~~ Paul does not mean that we were necessarily atheists.
      ⇒⇒word translated as ~ "without God" ~ refers to not having a relationship with the
      one true God.
      \rightarrow We were living in this world without a relationship with the one true God.
      \rightarrow Think through some of the things that meant. \Rightarrow \Rightarrow We did not have Him guiding us,
      ~ blessing us, ~ or helping us.
      → We did not have His friendship. ~~~ We did not have Him to turn to in times of
      trouble.
      → We did not have His word steering us through this sin-darkened world.
      → → How tragic.
         → And how tragic for those who still do not have a relationship with the one true
         God. 11 5/11
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►► All this Paul sums up by saying ~ that the person we were prior to Jesus saving us ~ was "darkness."

>> This word sums up quite well our absolute sinfulness before Jesus saved us.

NOW, ~ IF ALL OF THAT ISN'T BAD ENOUGH, ~ 77

- ▶▶the domain in which we lived ~ and were very much a part of, ~ is ruled by Satan.
- $\blacktriangleright$  He is the god of this age  $\sim$  and exercises control and tyranny  $\Rightarrow$  over unsaved humanity and this present world.
- ▶▶In 1 Jn. ~ 5: ~ 19b, ~ John writes, ~ 77

>> and the whole world lies in the power of ~ [or, under the control of] ~ the evil one."

- $\triangleright$  The verb form for "lies" pictures the world as characteristically nonresistant to, ~ 77
  - → and passively dependent upon, ~ the power that grips the lost masses of humanity.

**▷** Paul points this out.

- →→In 2 Tim., ~ he says that unbelievers ~ are held captive by Satan ~ to do his will.
  - $\rightarrow$  And in 2 Corinthians, ~ he says that Satan ~ blinds the minds of unbelievers.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$  Scripture makes it quite clear,  $\sim$  over and over,  $\sim$  that this world in which we live is ruled by Satan.

>> Three times ~ Jesus called Satan ~ "the ruler of this world." (John's gospel)

 $\triangleright$ Paul referred to Satan ~ as "the prince of the power of the air" ~ and "the god of this world." 11 6/11

 $\triangleright$ According to Luke's account of Jesus' temptation,  $\Rightarrow$  when Satan offered the kingdoms of the world to Jesus,  $\sim$  77

- → Satan claimed that they had been handed over to him
  - → Jesus, ~ of course, ~ refused Satan's offer, ~ but never disputed his claim.
    - They were handed over to him ~ when Adam and Eve chose to disobey God.

NOW, ~ WE SPENT A GOOD AMOUNT OF TIME ON THAT.

- ▶▶And I think it was important to do so. ~~ Not to make us feel guilty ~ or to drag us down.
- ▶▶Because ~ a solid understanding of our horrible condition prior to God rescuing us, ~ 77
  - Dwill help us come to a greater appreciation ~ 77
    - →for the great things he has done for us ~ and for how he has had mercy on us.
- ►► Additionally, ~ it will also help ~ guard us ~ against spiritual pride, ~ 77
  - $\triangleright \triangleright$  when we see ~ that we were totally enslaved ~ to sin, ~ death, ~ Satan, ~ and our sin nature, ~ 77
    - → with no hope of ever freeing ourselves.

## HUMANITY IS IN A DEPRESSING AND HORRIBLE SITUATION, ~ 77

- ▶▶on the brink of eternal destruction, ~ and fully under the control  $\Rightarrow$  of sin, ~ death, ~ Satan, ~ and their sin nature.
  - >>Not a pretty picture by any stretch of the imagination.
- ▶ But praise God, ~ it's not that way for those who are in Christ Jesus.  $\Rightarrow$  We are no longer in this depressing and horrible situation. 11 7/11

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THE FATHER ~ Lit. Trans. ~~ "HAS RESCUED US ~ FROM THE DOMAIN THAT IS characterized by darkness ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom of the son of his love."
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- ▶▶The word for "rescued" ~ means "rescued from danger."
- ▶▶My . . . , ~ we were lost, ~ under the guilt and penalty of sin, ~ 77
  - Dunable to free ourselves from "the domain of darkness," ~ 77
    - → and in danger of spending eternity apart from God.
      - → The sword of God's judgment ~ was hanging over our heads!
- ▶▶Our rescue from all of this ~ was dependent upon a source other than ourselves.
  - >>Enter God the Father.
    - →→Through his beloved Son, ~ he intervened in our hopeless situation ~ 77
      - → and took us out of the realm of darkness.
- ▶▶Now, ~ we should look at "rescued" ~ as an all-encompassing term, ~ 77
  - $\triangleright \triangleright$  taking into consideration the perfect righteousness of Christ ~ 77
    - $\rightarrow$  and His substitutionary death on the cross,  $\sim$  77
      - →→whereby ~ he satisfied divine justice ~ for all who would believe.
  - $\triangleright \triangleright$  Jesus made it possible for people to be rescued.

# TO EXPAND ON THIS RESCUE FOR A MOMENT, ~ 77

▶▶the NT reveals that the domain of darkness ~ is not the only thing believers have been rescued from. ↓ 1 8/11

- ▶ Paul says ~ in 1 Thess. 1:10 ~ that Jesus ~ delivers us from the wrath to come.
- ▶▶All believers look forward to Jesus' Second Coming ~ 77
  - Downher he will take us to be with him, ~ rescuing us from the terrors of the coming judgment.
- $\blacktriangleright$  This refers to the time  $\sim$  when God will display his anger toward a sinful world  $\sim$  and destroy all evil.
  - $\triangleright \triangleright God's$  wrath is a certainty,  $\sim$  for he will not let sin continue unabated forever.
- ▶▶Believers, ~ however, ~ can trust in their Savior who rescues them.
- ▶▶All those who confess with their mouth ~ that Jesus is Lord, ~ 77
  - Dand believe in their heart that God raise Him from the dead, ~ 77
    - → → will be delivered from the wrath of God that is coming upon this sinful world!
- THE FATHER ~ Lit. Trans. ~~ "HAS RESCUED US ~ FROM THE DOMAIN THAT IS characterized by darkness ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom of the son of his love."
  - ▶▶As we said at the beginning, ~ 77
    - Dethe Father did not rescue us and set us free ~ 77
      - → with some promise of future entrance into the kingdom of his dear Son.
    - >>A believer's transfer is complete. ~~ We are not hovering between two kingdoms.
      - → We have left the domain of darkness behind forever ~ 77
        - →→and have been placed firmly and permanently ~ in the kingdom of Jesus. 11 9/11

▶ Recall from last time, ~ that we noted the inheritance that God the Father qualified us to inherit ~ 77 Dis the kingdom of Jesus, ~ which we will receive when he returns. ▶Now, ~ it's important for us to understand the following. >> Although the full establishment of the kingdom, ~ and our reception of it, ~ 77 → must await our Lord's return, ~ 77 → believers have already been made citizens of it ~ 77 → and presently enjoy some of its privileges. >>E.g., ~ total and permanent freedom from "the domain of darkness" and all it entails. ▶▶We are not yet physically in the kingdom, ~ and the kingdom is not yet physically manifested. >> But positionally, ~ we are already solidly and permanently ~ in the kingdom of Jesus. ▶▶It's similar to Ephesians, ~ chapter 2, ~ verse 6, ~ that says ~ 77 Dethe Father has seated believers with Jesus in the heavenly places. >>Up to this point, ~ we have not physically sat down there. → Nonetheless, ~ Paul says that we have been seated with Jesus there. >> Someday we will physically experience that. ~~ Now it's what we call a position. →→It is a legal fact, ~ but it awaits its fulfillment. 11 10/11

- ▶▶It's the same when it comes to the kingdom of Jesus.
  - >> We are already solidly and permanently ~ in the kingdom of Jesus.
    - →→And all the physical aspects of that ~ will be established when Jesus returns.

### CONCLUSION.

THE FATHER ~ Lit. Trans. ~~ "HAS RESCUED US ~ FROM THE DOMAIN THAT IS characterized by darkness ~ and transferred us ~ to the kingdom of the son of his love."

▶▶Let us gratefully remember this great rescue ~ as we celebrate the Lord's Supper today.
