THE PERSON & WORK OF CHRIST, PT. 2; COL. 1:16 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

CURRENTLY IN OUR STUDY OF COLOSSIANS, ~ WE ARE MAKING OUR WAY THROUGH Paul's discussion ~ about the Person and work of Jesus.

▶▶This paragraph, ~ as we noted, ~ is one of the most, ~ if not the most, ~ definitive passages on the Person and work of Jesus in all of Scripture.

AS WE KNOW, ~ FALSE TEACHERS ~ WERE ATTACKING AND DISTORTING ~ THE Person and work of Christ.

▶▶And in this paragraph, ~ Col. ~ 1: ~ 15-20, ~ Paul lays out the truth about the Person and work of Jesus, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in order to counter ~ this assault on and misrepresentation of ~ Jesus' Person and work.

▶▶Paul presents ten profound and sweeping assertions ~ about Jesus' Person and work.

OF COURSE THERE ARE MANY FALSE TEACHERS IN OUR DAY AS WELL.

▶▶And just like those in Paul's day, ~ they attack and distort the biblical teaching on the Person and work of Jesus. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ So we see a big part of the relevance of this passage for us.

LAST TIME WE LOOKED AT THE FIRST TWO ASSERTIONS ABOUT JESUS.

ightharpoonup Jesus is the visible expression of the invisible God. ~~ And he is supreme over all creation.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL LOOK AT THE THIRD ASSERTION. 11 1/13

JESUS IS THE CREATOR.

For by him ~ all things were created, ~ in heaven and on earth, ~ visible and invisible, ~ whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities ~~ all things ~ were created through him and for him.

>>Quick trans. note: ~~ some, ~ "by." ~~ Greek prep. here means "through."

IN ADDITION TO BEING THE NEXT ASSERTION, ~~ 77

▶ grammatically this statement in verse 16 ~ explains why Christ is preeminent over all creation.

>> The word "For" could be translated as "Because."

 \triangleright The idea here is: ~~ "He is the firstborn over all creation, ~ because ~ all things were created by him.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jesus is preeminent over creation \sim by virtue of the fact \sim that he is the sovereign Creator of it.

►► So verse 16 ~ serves a dual purpose.

 \triangleright It gives an important fact about Jesus ~ and also provides a reason why he is supreme over all creation.

- ▶▶Puts a nail in the coffin of the false teaching that Jesus is the "first created."
- ▶▶Furthermore, ~ since only God can be the Creator, ~ it means that Jesus is God.

OK, ~ LET'S UNPACK VERSE 16. 11 2/13

THE GREEK VERB FOR "CREATED" ~ DOES NOT REFER TO MAKING SOMETHING FROM preexisting materials.

- ▶▶It means to make or create something ~ which has not existed before.
- ▶▶In the NT, ~ the word is used exclusively ~ of God's activity in creation.
 - >>Reinforcing the truth that Jesus is God.
- ▶▶Jesus did not use preexisting materials when he created everything.
- ▶▶Like we would have to in order to build a house.
 - \triangleright We have to use preexistent materials \sim because we do not possess the creative power of God.
- ▶▶But Jesus, ~ being God, ~ called into being that which had not existed before.

 \triangleright Heb. 11:3, ~ LEB ~ By faith ~ we understand the worlds were created by the word of God, ~ 77

→in order that what is seen ~ did not come into existence ~ from what is visible.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In Ps. 33: ~ 6, ~ LEB ~ the psalmist writes, ~ 77

→ By the word of Yahweh ~ the heavens were made, ~~ and by the breath of his mouth ~ all their host.

- →→The Lord merely spoke, ~ and the heavens were created.
 - $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ He breathed the word, \sim and all the stars were born.

>> And God said, ~ "Let there be light," ~ and there was light. 11 3/13

THE ALL-ENCOMPASSING PHRASE ~ "ALL THINGS" ~ IN VERSE 16, ~ LEAVES absolutely nothing ~ beyond the scope of Jesus' creative power.

- ▶▶The repetition of the phrase ~ emphasizes and expresses ~ absolute universality.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright IOW$, ~ as John says in Jn. ~ 1: ~ 3b, ~ LEB ~ "and apart from him ~ not one thing ~ came into being that has come into being."

>>In the Greek text, ~ "not one thing" is emphatic. ~~ This trans. ~~ Brings out emph.

>> John was driving this point home. ~~ "Apart from Jesus ~ not even one thing ~ came into being that has come into being."

BACK TO VERSE 16.

▶▶We have two categories of creation here.

 \triangleright Jesus in relation to the physical universe. ~~ And Jesus in relation to the unseen world. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Jesus created both.

 1^{st} CATEGORY. ~~ JESUS CREATED ~ EVERY INCH OF ~ AND EVERYTHING IN ~ the physical universe.

▶▶Recall that when we started Colossians, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ we noted \sim that much of the heresy endangering the church at Colossae \sim probably was an early form of Gnosticism.

- ▶▶Remember, ~ one of their notions was that ~ spirit was good and matter was evil.
 - >> This notion led to the belief ~ that God could not have created the world ~ 77
 - \Rightarrow since it was matter and matter was evil. 11 4/13

>> Therefore, ~ a series of intermediary spirit beings, ~ or angels, ~ emanating out of God was postulated, ~ 77 → beach one being less God than the one preceding. ▶▶The false teachers at Colossae viewed Jesus as the first and most important of these angels. >>But they were convinced ~ 77 →it had to be a lesser being much farther down the chain ~ who eventually created the material universe. >>Paul rejected that false notion, ~ insisting that Jesus is God, ~ and He created the material universe FURTHERMORE, ~ SCRIPTURE CLEARLY REFUTES THE NOTION THAT MATTER IS EVIL. ▶▶Over and over in the creation account in Genesis, ~ as God was creating, ~ we read that he "saw that it was good." \triangleright And then when God was done, ~ Moses writes, ~ 77 → → "And God saw everything that he had made, ~ and behold, ~ it was very good." ▶▶In 1 Tim. 4, ~ warning against false teachers, ~ 77 Paul points out that God created all food to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and who know the truth. >> And everything God created is good. ~~ Nothing is to be rejected if it is received with thanksgiving.

 \triangleright You can look that up and get the full context. 11 5/13

▶▶Now, ~ the physical creation is under the curse, ~ as Paul points out in Romans.

>>But the material universe, ~ including our physical bodies, ~ is good in and of itself.

AND SPEAKING OF CREATION, ~ 77

▶▶it gives silent testimony of the glory, ~ power, ~ knowledge, ~ wisdom, ~ and intelligence of the Creator.

THE UNIVERSE ALSO STRONGLY INDICATES THAT IT WAS INTELLIGENTLY DESIGNED and created, ~ and did not evolve or come about by blind chance.

- ► Scientists now speak of the Anthropic Principle. ~~ Anthropic > $\check{\alpha}$ v Θ p ω π o ς .
 - \triangleright The AP states that the universe is especially suited for the well-being of humanity.
 - →→TPID, ~ the universe ~ appears to have been fine-tuned for our existence.
- \blacktriangleright Our existence in this universe \sim depends on numerous cosmological constants and parameters \sim 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ whose numerical values must fall within a very narrow range of values.
 - $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ If even a single variable were off, \sim even slightly, \sim we would not exist.
- ► Consider these examples.
 - \triangleright If the earth's magnetic field was much weaker, \sim our planet would be devastated by cosmic radiation.
 - $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ If it were much stronger, \sim we would be devastated by severe electromagnetic storms. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Perfect for our existence.

 \triangleright If the earth was much farther from the sun, ~ our planet's water would freeze. ~~ If we were much closer, ~ it would boil. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Just the right distance. 11 6/13

- \triangleright If our solar system were too close to the center of our galaxy, ~ or to any of the spiral arms at its edge, ~ 77
 - \rightarrow or any cluster of stars, \sim for that matter, \sim our planet would be devastated by cosmic radiation. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Just the right position.
- >>If the moon was closer to the earth, ~ tides would be greatly increased.
 - → Ocean waves could sweep across the continents.
 - → The seas themselves might heat to the boiling point from the resulting friction.
- $\triangleright \triangleright$ On the other hand, ~ a more distant moon would reduce the tides.
 - → Marine life would be endangered by the resulting preponderance of stagnant water.
 - \rightarrow Mankind would also be in trouble because the oxygen in the air we breathe is replenished by marine plants.
 - → We can conclude that the moon is in the "correct" position for man's well-being.
- \triangleright Even such details ~ as the mass of protons and the strength of gravity ~ 77
 - have values that give stability to the universe ~ and thus reinforce the Anthropic Principle.
- ▶▶Blind chance? ~~ Or intelligent design?
 - \triangleright The Anthropic Principle ~ is evidence in support of the thesis that ~~ the universe was planned and created by a divine Architect.
- ▶▶Now, ~ if I understand this correctly, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ the "blind-chance" people try to get around this principle by proposing the "multiverse" theory. 11 7/13

>> Their argument goes like this. >> "Imagine ~ innumerable lifeless universes existing at the same time, ~ in which one or more of the necessary variables ~ 77 → fail to fall within the specific range of values required for life. >> The idea is ~ that nature would eventually get it right, ~ and apparently has done so ~ as evidenced by the fact that we exist. >> We are the lucky ones ~ whose universe blindly stumbled upon the right combination of cosmological values." >> That's their argument. → They clearly reject God ~ in favor ~ of made-up human theories. ▶▶Rom. 1:21-25, ~ has much to say about people like this. >> For although they knew God, ~ they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, ~~ but they became futile in their thinking, ~~ and their foolish hearts were darkened. ~~ Claiming to be wise, ~~ they became fools, ~ and exchanged the glory of the immortal God ~ for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things. ~~ Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, ~ to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves, ~~ because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie ~ and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, ~ who is blessed forever! ~~ Amen. ▶▶The silent testimony of the universe to its Creator is clear, ~ as David proclaims in Ps. 19: ~ 1. >> The heavens declare the glory of God, ~ and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. >> The testimony of nature to its Creator so clear ~ that it is only through willful unbelief ~ that someone could reject it. 11 8/13

DPaul writes in Rom. 1:20, ~ For his invisible attributes, ~ namely, ~ his eternal power and divine nature, ~ have been clearly perceived, ~ ever since the creation of the world, ~ in the things that have been made. ~~ So they are without excuse.

>>Like those who deny Christ's deity, ~ 77

those who reject him as Creator ~ give evidence of a mind darkened by sin and blinded by Satan.

BACK TO VERSE 16.

▶▶As we noted, ~ we have two categories of creation here.

 \triangleright Jesus in relation to the physical universe. ~~ And Jesus in relation to the unseen world.

→ Jesus ~ created both.

NOW WE TURN OUR ATTENTION TO JESUS IN RELATION TO THE UNSEEN WORLD.

- ▶For by him all things were created, ~ in heaven and on earth, ~ visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities.
- ▶▶"invisible" is further identified as thrones, ~ dominions, ~ rulers, ~ and authorities.
- ▶▶Now, ~ remember, ~ the false teachers plaguing the Colossians church ~ were teaching that Jesus was the first and most important of the angels.
- ▶▶BTW, ~ in our day, ~ the Jehovah's witnesses believe that Jesus is Michael the archangel.
- ▶▶But far from being an angel, ~ as false teachers claim, ~ Jesus created the angels.
- ▶▶Paul makes a clear distinction between the angels and Jesus. 11 9/13

▶▶The author of Hebrews does as well. ~~ Heb. ~ 1: ~ 6-8.

 \triangleright And again, ~ when he brings the firstborn into the world, ~ he says, ~~ "Let all God's angels worship him." ~~ Of the angels he says, ~~ "He makes his angels winds, ~ and his ministers a flame of fire." ~~ 77

 \rightarrow But of the Son he says, \sim "Your throne, \sim O God, \sim is forever and ever, \sim the scepter of uprightness is the scepter of your kingdom. \sim

▶ Paul also makes a clear distinction between the angels and Jesus in Eph. ~ 1: ~ 21, ~ 77

Desus has been exalted "far above all rule and authority and power and dominion, ~ and above every name that is named, ~ not only in this age but also in the one to come."

▶Peter reinforces this. ~~ 1 Pet. ~ 3: ~ 22.

>> "who ~ [i.e., ~ Jesus] ~ has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, ~ with angels, ~ authorities, ~ and powers having been subjected to him."

▶▶Scripture is crystal clear. ~~ Jesus is not an angel, ~ but the Creator of them.

>>He is sovereign over angels, ~ who in fact worship him.

▶▶Furthermore, ~ Jesus' relation to the physical and unseen worlds as Creator, ~ proves he is God.

<u>AT THE END OF VERSE 16, ~ PAUL NOTES TWO DETAILS ABOUT JESUS BEING the creator.</u>

EVERYTHING THAT EXISTS ~ WAS CREATED ~ THROUGH JESUS ~ AND FOR JESUS.

THE 1st DETAIL: ~~ EVERYTHING THAT EXISTS WAS CREATED ~ THROUGH JESUS.

▶ We should understand that Scripture teaches us that ~ the eternal Son of God was active with the Father as his co-worker. 110/13

 $\triangleright \triangleright Jn. \sim 1: \sim 3, \sim LEB \sim All$ things came into being through him, \sim and apart from him not one thing came into being that has come into being.

 \triangleright And Heb. ~ 1: ~ 2, ~ but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, ~ whom he appointed the heir of all things, ~ through whom also he created the world.

▶▶Jesus is seen here as ~ the Intermediate Agent in the work of creation.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But is not here represented as a mere instrument, ~ a passive tool, ~ but as a cooperating agent.

▶ Paul sets out the precise nature of this cooperation in 1 Cor. \sim 8: \sim 6.

 \triangleright yet for us there is one God, \sim the Father, \sim from whom are all things and for whom we exist, \sim and one Lord, \sim Jesus Christ, \sim through whom are all things \sim and through whom we exist.

- ▶▶All that exists has its ultimate source in God the Father, ~ "from whom are all things."
- ▶▶This happened, ~ however, ~ with the coordinate creative act of the Son, ~ "through whom" it was created.
- ▶▶Together, ~ they made all things.

JUST AS AN IMPORTANT SIDE NOTE HERE.

▶ Gen. ~ 1: ~ 2 ~ gives us a fuller picture, ~ by showing that the Holy Spirit was involved in creating all that exists as well.

 \triangleright The earth was without form and void, ~ and darkness was over the face of the deep. ~~ And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

▶▶The three Persons of our Triune God all actively participated in the work of creation.

- ▶Now, ~ if you can figure all of that out, ~ please let me know. ~~ I would love to understand it as well.
- ▶▶We are finite creatures. ~~ We cannot fully understand it.

OK, \sim NOW THE SECOND DETAIL PAUL GETS INTO AT THE END OF VERSE 16 ABOUT Jesus being the creator.

- ▶▶Everything that exists ~ was created for Jesus.
- ►► Most likely in the sense that everything exists ~ to display his glory ~ and to bring glory to him.
- ▶ Recall David's words. ~~ The heavens declare the glory of God, ~ and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.
 - \triangleright Then recall that David goes on and says ~ that day after day the heavens and sky continue to speak.
 - →→That night after night they make God known.
 - →→ They speak without a sound or word, ~ David says; ~~ their voice is never heard.
 - \hookrightarrow Yet, ~ their message has gone throughout the earth, ~ and their words to all the world ~ proclaiming God's glory and craftsmanship.
- ▶ When Isaiah saw the Lord high and exalted and seated on a throne, \sim you can read about it in Is. 6, \sim 77
 - Dhe noted that the seraphim ~ "called to another and said: ~~ "Holy, ~ holy, ~ holy ~ is the Lord of hosts; ~~ the whole earth is full of his glory!"
- ▶ Remember in Rom. 1:20 ~ Paul said that ~ 77
 - ►►God's "eternal power and divine nature, ~ have been clearly perceived, ~ ever since the creation of the world, ~ in the things that have been made." 11 12/13

- ▶► And when Paul follows that up with verse 21, ~ "For although they knew God, ~ 77
 - >> they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him," ~ 77
 - →one implication seems to be that ~ 77
 - \rightarrow the creation is designed \sim to lead people to honor Jesus and to give thanks to him.
- ►► Again, ~ the testimony of nature to its Creator so clear ~ 77
 - >> that it is only through willful unbelief ~ that someone could reject it.
- ▶▶So everything exists ~ to display Jesus' glory ~ and to bring glory to him.

CONCLUSION.

AND IN OUR LIVES, ~ MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN CHRIST, ~ 77

- >>are we honoring Jesus and giving thanks to him for his creation, ~ which includes us?
- ▶▶And do we clearly see his glory in what has been made, ~ or have we fallen for the lie of evolution?
- ▶▶Important questions for everyone to ponder this week.
