THE PERSON & WORK OF CHRIST, PT. 5; COL. 1:19-20 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

TODAY WE CONCLUDE OUR STUDY OF COL. 1:15-20.

 \blacktriangleright As we know, \sim this paragraph \sim is one of the most, \sim if not the most, \sim definitive passages on the Person and work of Jesus in all of Scripture.

AS WE ALSO KNOW, ~ FALSE TEACHERS ~ WERE ATTACKING AND DISTORTING ~ THE Person and work of Christ.

▶▶And in this paragraph, ~ Col. ~ 1: ~ 15-20, ~ Paul lays out the truth about the Person and work of Jesus, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in order to counter ~ this assault on and misrepresentation of ~ Jesus' Person and work.

▶▶Paul presents ten profound and sweeping assertions ~ about Jesus' Person and work.

SO FAR, ~ WE HAVE STUDIED THE FIRST EIGHT PROFOUND AND SWEEPING assertions about Jesus.

▶ Just a brief review of them.

1st ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS IS THE VISIBLE EXPRESSION OF THE INVISIBLE GOD.

▶▶By his person, ~ words, ~ and actions ~ Jesus has revealed the Father to us.

 \triangleright Want to know what God is like? ~~ Look at Jesus. ~~ Want to know what God thinks about you? ~~ Look at Jesus. ~~ 77

→ Want to know how much God loves you? ~~ Look at Jesus. 11 1/13

- ▶▶In Ps. 89, ~ God says of the Messiah, ~ Jesus, ~ "I will also make him the firstborn."
 - >> Then the psalmist defines what He means: ~~ "the highest of the kings of the earth."
- ▶ "firstborn" ~ means ~ the highest in rank, ~ supremacy. ~~ Jesus is supreme over all of creation.
- 3rd ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS IS THE SOVEREIGN CREATOR OF THE UNIVERSE.
 - ▶▶"by him ~ all things were created." ~~ "and apart from him not one thing was created that has been created."
- 4th ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS IS ETERNAL.
- ▶▶John's point in 1:1 of his gospel: ~~ "Before the universe was created, ~ Jesus was already eternally existing."
- ► Micah said that the Messiah's "goings forth are from long ago, ~ from the days of eternity."
 - >>Although Jesus was born in Bethlehem, ~~ that was not His beginning.
 - → He has existed "from the days of eternity."
- 5th ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS UPHOLDS THE UNIVERSE BY HIS POWERFUL WORD.
 - ▶▶Not only is Jesus the Creator of all things, ~ all things continue to exist because of him.
 - ► Without him, ~ electrons would not continue to circle nuclei, ~ gravity would cease to work, ~ the planets would not stay in their orbits. 1 2/13

6th ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS IS SUPREME OVER THE CHURCH.

- ▶▶He, ~ and he alone, ~ is the head of the church.
- \blacktriangleright After His ascension into heaven, \sim God the Father officially established Christ as the head of the church.

7th ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS BROUGHT THE CHURCH INTO EXISTENCE. ⇒⇒ JESUS SAID, ~ "I will build my church."

▶▶After saying that, ~~ Jesus added, ~~ "and the forces of hell shall not prevail against it."

 \triangleright Jesus promises us that the church ~ will not be destroyed by the evil powers arrayed against it.

AND THE 8th ASSERTION. ~~ JESUS IS THE FIRSTBORN FROM THE DEAD.

- ▶▶This refers to his resurrection and that he is first in time and first in supremacy.
- \blacktriangleright I.e., \sim he was the first in time \sim to emerge from the realm of the dead with a glorified resurrection body, \sim never to die again.
- ►► And by virtue of his resurrection, ~ 77

DDJesus has been elevated in rank ~ to a position higher than any of the other resurrected dead will experience.

 \triangleright After making purification for sins, \sim Jesus sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, \sim the author of Hebrews declares.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL FINISH UP WITH THE LAST TWO PROFOUND AND SWEEPING assertions. 11 3/13

THE 9th SWEEPING AND PROFOUND ASSERTION ABOUT THE PERSON & WORK OF Jesus.

VERSE 19. ~~ FOR IN HIM ALL THE FULLNESS OF GOD WAS PLEASED TO DWELL.

▶▶Paul's point here is this: ~~ God, ~ in all his fulness, ~ i.e., ~ in his full and complete deity, ~ was pleased to take human form in Jesus.

NOW, ~ THIS IS A LITTLE COMPLICATED, ~ I'M NOT SURE I FULLY UNDERSTAND IT, ~ and I'll try to explain briefly.

- \blacktriangleright The way Paul words this ~ shows ~ that he is highlighting the work of the Father through the Son ~ in his plan of salvation.
- ▶▶When see "God" in the NT, ~ usually it refers to God the Father.
- ▶ What Paul is saying more specifically here ~ is that the Father was pleased that his full and complete deity dwelled in the Son.
- ▶▶But we have to be careful in our wording of any explanation of this.
 - \triangleright For fear it would suggest that Jesus in himself was not fully God to begin with. ~~ That's not what Paul is saying.
- ▶▶The verb he uses, ~ "dwell," ~ indicates ~ that this fullness ~ 77
 - >> was not something added to Jesus' Being that was not natural to Him, ~ 77
 - → but that it was part of His essential Being as part of His very nature.
- ▶▶It seems ~ that Paul was simply highlighting involvement of the Father in our salvation.

- ▶▶Jesus ~ is God in human flesh.
- ►► To put it differently, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright G$ od the Son, \sim in his full and complete deity, \sim stepped onto the historical scene as a human being.

▶▶In the beginning was the Word, ~ and the Word was with God, ~ and the Word was God. ~~ And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us.

THE BIBLE TEACHES ~ THAT JESUS IS FULLY GOD AND FULLY MAN ~ IN ONE PERSON and will be so forever (more on this later).

- ▶▶ He has two distinct natures. ~~ He is not half man and half God.
- ▶ Jesus' two natures are not mixed together, ~ nor are they combined into a new God-man nature.
- \blacktriangleright And, \sim as Paul points out, \sim his divine nature was not changed when he took on a human nature.

 $\triangleright \triangleright God$, ~ in all his fullness, ~ became human.

- ightharpoonup He just allowed his humanity to cover his deity. ightharpoonup As Christmas hymn says, ightharpoonup 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ Veiled in flesh the Godhead see, ~ Hail the incarnate Deity!

IN HIS 9th ASSERTION, ~ 77

Paul was refuting at least two, ~ if not more, ~ of the points of the heresy that was threatening the Colossian believers. 115/13

	st, ~ recall that they believed ~ all matter is inherently evil ~ and only the spiritual and naterial is ~ of itself ~ good.
	►>And based on their belief that all matter is evil, ~ they taught that ~ God, ~ in Christ, never could have become a human person.
	Their thinking was, \sim if matter is evil, \sim how could God \sim ever be united \sim with a humanody?.
	Prices But God did exactly that, ~ Paul says, ~ thereby showing matter is not evil ~ and that esus is fully God and fully man.
▶ ▶2	2^{nd} , ~ the heretics said that Christ was not the unique Son of God ~ 77
	Dut rather one of many intermediary spirit beings, ~ or angels, ~ between God and eople.
\triangleright	Paul shows that ~ to be totally unbiblical.
▶▶Paul affirmed that God's "fullness" dwells in Jesus alone. ~~ Jesus has always been God and always will be God.	
	\triangleright All of God, \sim including \sim his divine attributes, \sim characteristics, \sim nature, \sim and being, indwells the Son.
\triangleright	\sim \triangleright When we have Jesus, \sim we have all of God in human form.
	Any teaching that diminishes any aspect of Jesus, ~ either his humanity, ~ his divinity, ~ s work ~ is false teaching.
AGAIN	N, ~ FALSE TEACHERS ~ IN EVERY AGE ~ TRY TO REDEFINE JESUS. 11 6/13

- ▶▶They proclaim a Jesus ~ who is <u>not</u> the Jesus of the Bible.
- ▶ E.g., ~ false teachers preach a Jesus who is not quite God and never quite saves, ~ as the cults teach.
 - >>A Jesus who wants you healthy and wealthy, ~ as preached by many televangelists.
 - >>Or a Jesus whom you ask into your life to make you feel good.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright My \dots$ we need to be grounded in the truth of the biblical teaching on the Person and work of Jesus.

WHEN WE'RE WELL-GROUNDED IN GOD'S WORD, ~ WE WILL QUICKLY RECOGNIZE THE lies of false teacher.

- \blacktriangleright TPID, ~ if we're not well-grounded in God's word, ~ how will we know when we're being lied to?
- ▶ Speaking of the righteous person, ~ David says in Ps. 37:31, ~ "The law of his God is in his heart; his steps do not slip.
 - \triangleright David says the righteous person has learned God's word, ~ remembers its teachings, ~ and it controls their thinking.
 - → And as a result, ~ they do not slip into sin.
- ▶ When ~ we have learned God's word, ~ remember its teachings, ~ and it controls our thinking, ~ we will not fall prey to the false teachers.

GETTING BACK TO VERSE 19, ~ DWELL. ~~ PERMANENTLY.

▶▶Did not leave his humanity behind @ ascension. ~~ Son of Man. ~~ Forever. 11 7/13

<u>AND NOW FOR THE 10th SWEEPING & PROFOUND ASSERTION ABOUT THE PERSON</u> & work of Jesus. ~~ Verse 20.

JESUS IS THE ONE WHO RECONCILES ALL CREATION THROUGH HIS DEATH.

▶ Jesus did not come to earth to merely be an example for us.

GOD THE FATHER ~ CHOSE TO SEND HIS SON ~ FOR THE DESIGNATED PURPOSE OF reconciling all creation, ~ 77

- ▶▶and in particular fallen humanity, ~ to himself. ~~ 2 Cor., ~~ in Christ, ~ God was reconciling the world to himself.
- ▶ Because Jesus is God, ~ He is able to do what no mere man could ever do: ~~ reconcile lost sinners to the Father.
- ▶▶Obviously, ~ the means by which this was accomplished ~ was Christ's sacrificial death on the cross.

>>He made "peace by the blood of his cross."

JESUS' DEATH ON THE CROSS WAS NOT martyrdom. ~~ It was a substitutionary sacrifice.

- ▶▶Is. 53 helps us understand what this means. ~~ In that chapter, ~ Isaiah says that Jesus bore our griefs and carried our sorrows.
 - \triangleright That ~ "he was pierced for <u>our</u> transgressions; ~~ he was crushed for <u>our</u> iniquities; ~~ upon <u>him</u> was the chastisement that brought <u>us</u> peace."
 - >>And that the Lord "laid on him ~ the iniquity of us all."
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ Substituted himself in our place. 11 8/13

- ▶ Jesus' substitutionary sacrifice ~ satisfied God's righteous demands ~ by paying in full ~ the penalty for sin.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ As the song says, \sim 'Til on that cross as Jesus died \sim The wrath of God was satisfied $\sim\sim$ For every sin \sim on Him was laid.
- ightharpoonup The enmity that existed between God and a sinful universe has ceased \sim because Christ's death made peace.
- ▶▶As Paul says in Romans, ~ "we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- ▶▶Only those who spurn Christ's offer in the gospel ~ are still at war with God.

THE NT DOCTRINE OF RECONCILIATION IS ALWAYS VIEWED AS A RECONCILIATION made to God.

▶▶"while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son;" ~~ and, ~ 77

DGod reconciled us to himself through Christ, ~ 77

→ Paul declares in Romans and 1 Corinthians respectively.

NOW, ~ IT IS EXTREMELY IMPORTANT TO UNDERSTAND ~ 77

- ▶▶that reconciliation is not equivalent to salvation.
- ► Rather, ~ reconciliation ~ refers to the removal of the barrier between God and humanity ~ through Christ's sacrificial work ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ so that God can deal with sinners in a new way.

- ► Dbjectively, ~ from God's side, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ the barrier between humans and God created by sin ~ has been removed by Jesus' sacrificial death, ~ 77
 - → → so that ~ the way is open for sinners to come to Him.
- ▶ But reconciliation does not eliminate the need of individuals to respond in faith to this work of God.
- ▶▶On the subjective side, ~ people must accept the reconciliation that God has offered.
- ▶▶You can look it up and read 2 Cor. 5:18-21 for reference on this.
 - \triangleright The idea is set forth there, ~ where people whom God has reconciled (v. 18) ~ are then urged to be reconciled to God (v. 20).
- ▶▶Jn. 3:16 points this out as well.
 - \triangleright "For God so loved the world, ~ that he gave his only Son ~ [God's gracious provision], ~ that whoever ~ [universal provision, ~ i.e., ~ available to all] ~ [objective] ~ 77
 - But one has to believe in Jesus ~ i.e., ~ to apply God's gracious provision to him/herself ~ [subjective]: ~~ 77
 - →→"that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."
- ▶▶The NT doctrine of reconciliation does not teach universal salvation.
 - >>It just means that the way is open for sinners to have eternal life.

UP UNTIL NOW, ~ WE HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT RECONCILIATION IN RELATION TO humanity. 11 10/13

▶ But in verse 20 of Col. 1 (P), ~ 77 Paul says that God chose to send his Son ~ for the designated purpose of reconciling all creation. ▶▶He says, ~ "all things, ~ whether on earth or in heaven." >>I.e., ~ the whole created universe, ~ both humanity and creation. ▶▶IOW, ~ reconciliation also includes the created universe apart from humanity. ▶▶The scope of reconciliation ~ is cosmic ~ as well as personal. BUT IN WHAT SENSE ~ DOES RECONCILIATION INVOLVE THE CREATED UNIVERSE apart from humanity? ▶▶Scripture teaches us that the natural creation was subject to and groans under God's curse. >>All of nature was subjected to decay and death and longs to be released. ▶ But Scripture also teaches that eventually the curse will be removed as a result of Jesus' sacrificial death. \triangleright Over in Romans, ~ Paul says that the creation looks forward ~ 77 → to the day when it will join God's children in glorious freedom from decay and death. >> There will be "new heavens and a new earth," ~ as Peter tells us. >> And the apostle John saw the new heaven and new earth in one of the visions God gave him, ~ recorded in Revelation. 11 11/13

▶▶In some way, ~ therefore, ~ 77 DDJesus' death on the cross has dealt not only with the guilt ~ but also with the defiling consequences of sin. ▶►All of creation, ~ Paul says in Col. 1:20, ~ has benefitted from the cross. NOW, ~ WE MUST NOT PASS BY THE WORD "PLEASED" HERE WITHOUT commenting on it. WE'VE ALREADY READ IN VERSE 19 ~ THAT THE FATHER WAS PLEASED THAT HIS FULL

and complete deity dwelt in his Son.

▶ But when we read verse 19 with verse 20, ~ we see grammatically ~ that the Father was also pleased ~ 77

Do to reconcile all things to himself through His Son.

- ▶ We mustn't think that God unwillingly provided salvation for us.
- ▶▶Or that Jesus grumbled throughout his earthly ministry.
- ▶▶ As the Christmas hymn continues, ~ "Pleased as man with men to dwell, ~ Jesus our Immanuel."
- ▶▶Loved ones, ~ this is a most amazing truth.

>> We ~ had sinned against God. ~~ We ~ had broken his law. ~~ We ~ were his enemies. ~~ We ~ were alienated from him.

 \triangleright He ~ was under no obligation to save us, ~~ and had every right ~ to condemn us to a Christ-less eternity. 11 12/13

>>And yet, ~ it pleased him to reconcile all things to himself through His Son.

>>And it pleased Jesus, ~ God the Son, ~ to become man and die for us.

▶▶Recall that the author of Hebrews tells us Jesus endured the cross, ~ 77

Dethe most cruel and disgraceful of deaths, ~ having disregarded the shame of it, ~ 77

 \rightarrow i.e., \sim ignoring the shame \sim and not allowing it to dissuade Him \sim or cause Him to waver.

>>And then the author tells us that Jesus did it ~ "for the joy that was set before him."

→ Jesus went to the Cross because of the joy it would bring.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ He looked right through the cross to the coming joy, \sim part of which was the joy of bringing salvation to those he loves.

►► Amazing love
