PAUL'S MINISTRY, PT. 5; COL. 2:1-2a (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

WE HAVE BEEN STUDYING ~ PAUL'S ACCOUNT ~ 77

- ▶▶of his apostolic ministry ~ to the church, ~ which takes up Col. 1:24 2:5.
- ▶► Today ~ we continue to do that.

AS WE ARE WELL AWARE OF, ~ HIS ACCOUNT ~ CAN BE SPLIT INTO THREE PARTS.

- ▶▶The first part ~ was Paul's ministry of suffering on believers' behalf, ~ 1:24.
- ▶▶The second part ~ was the character of his ministry, ~ 1:25-29.
- Now, ~ on the third part, ~ which is found in 2:1-5, ~~ and which ~ we'll begin to look at today, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright I$ 've modified my thinking on this.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ I had said ~ that in this part, ~ Paul talked about ~ his ministry of encouragement.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ But ~ after I began to study this more in depth, ~ 77
 - \rightarrow I felt ~ the more appropriate heading ~ would be ~ Paul's pastoral concern ~ for believers.

PAUL ~ HAD A STRONG PASTORAL CONCERN ~ FOR THE SPIRITUAL WELL-BEING OF believers.

- ▶ Even ~ when believers were largely strangers to him, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ and when others ~ were more immediately responsible ~ for their care.
- ▶ Even though ~ he had not known most of them personally.
- ▶▶He had a concern ~ for the whole church, ~~ not just ~ 77
 - Dofor those believers ~ who happened to be near him at the time.
- ▶▶He knew the reality ~ of the oneness in Christ ~ that all believers share.
- ►► And he felt obliged ~ to help believers everywhere ~ 77
 - Dogrow ~ in their spiritual lives ~~ and to stand firm ~ against the evils of false teaching.

PAUL ~ STANDS ~ AS A MODEL FOR US.

- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ It is very easy for us \sim to begin to focus our concern \sim 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ on just our little group, ~ our little corner of the universal church.
- ▶▶We must ~ take ~ a much broader perspective.
- ▶▶We are part ~ of a very large family.
- ►► And we need to be concerned for our brothers and sisters ~ outside of our local fellowship.

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DDPraying .... ⇒ → Helping .... 11 2/14
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OK, ~ LET'S BEGIN TO LOOK CLOSELY ~ AT PAUL'S PASTORAL CONCERN ~ FOR believers, ~ 2:1-5.

SPECIFICALLY IN THIS CASE, ~ HIS CONCERN FOR THE BELIEVERS IN COLOSSAE, ~ 77

- ▶▶and, ~ as we'll see, ~ the believers in the surrounding areas.
- ▶▶The specific area ~ of his concern in this case ~ was the danger of false teaching.

THIS PASSAGE, ~ COL. 2:1-5, ~ CAN BE BROKEN DOWN INTO FOUR PARTS.

▶▶In verse 1a, ~ Paul lets us know ~ how his concern was expressed.

>>Intercessory.

▶▶In verse 1b, ~ he notes the believers ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ on whose behalf ~ he was interceding.

- ▶▶In verses 2-3, ~ we find the content ~ of Paul's intercessory prayer.
- ▶▶And then in verses 4-5, ~ Paul gives ~ the reasons for his pastoral concern.

NOW, ~ WE'RE NOT GOING TO GO THROUGH ALL OF THIS TODAY.

► We'll just cover verses 1-2a, ~ 77

Dand end with ~ Paul's first prayer request for believers.

1st, ~ LET'S LOOK AT ~ HOW PAUL'S PASTORAL CONCERN WAS EXPRESSED.

Col. 2:1a. 11 3/14

▶▶the form ~ his pastoral concern was expressed by a great struggle.

>> For I want you to know ~ how great a struggle I have.

THE WORD FOR ~ "STRUGGLE" ~ POINTS ~ TO ~ AN INTENSE STRAIN.

- ▶▶The word is related ~ to the term "struggling" ~ in 1:29.
- ▶▶Which, ~ as we said ~ is ~ an athletic image, ~ 77

Depicting runners ~ straining ~ with every muscle ~ toward the finish line.

- ▶►IOW, ~ giving maximum effort ~ in order to win the victory ~ against formidable opponents.
- ▶▶Doubtless, ~ Paul, ~ here in 2:1, ~ is continuing ~ this athletic picture.

HOWEVER, ~ SINCE PAUL WAS UNDER HOUSE ARREST IN ROME ~ WHEN HE WROTE this letter, ~ 77

- ▶▶he could not ~ have been talking about ~ 77
 - DD maximum ~ physical effort ~ or ~ formidable ~ physical opponents.
- ► He must be talking about ~ maximum ~ spiritual effort ~ and ~ formidable ~ spiritual opponents.
- ▶ Paul uses a related word in Col. 4:12 ~ to refer to ~ 77
 - \triangleright Epaphras' wrestling in prayer ~ for these believers. 11 4/14

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► So no doubt ~ Paul is referring ~ here in Col. 2:1a, ~ to ~ 77
    Dethe spiritual warfare ~ of wrestling in prayer, ~ to which ~ Paul gave maximum effort.
AT THE BEGINNING OF HIS DISCUSSION ON SPIRITUAL WARFARE, ~ Paul writes, ~ 77
 ▶▶Eph. 6:12. ~~ For we do not wrestle ~ against flesh and blood, ~ 77
    >>but against ~ the rulers, ~~ against ~ the authorities, ~ 77
        → against ~ the cosmic powers ~ over this present darkness, ~~ 77
           → against ~ the spiritual forces of evil ~ in the heavenly places.
 ▶▶This applies ~ to prayer as well, ~~ perhaps ~ especially ~ to prayer.
WE NEED TO UNDERSTAND ~ THAT ~ ALL PRAYER ~ IS SPIRITUAL WARFARE.
 ▶▶There is no such thing ~ as ~ regular prayer ~ and ~ spiritual warfare prayer.
 ►► All prayer ~ is spiritual warfare.
 ▶▶The minute ~ we engage in serious prayer, ~ 77
    bthe spiritual forces of evil ~ mount a full-scale attack on us.
 ►►Why?
    >> Because ~ they know ~ the power of prayer.
 ►► And will do all they can ~ 77
    \triangleright \triangleright to ~ discourage us, ~~ to ~ stop us ~~ or ~ to ~ prevent us ~~ from praying. 11 5/14
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► To be engaged ~ in serious prayer ~ 77
    Dis to be engaged ~ in fierce spiritual warfare, ~ against ~ formidable ~ spiritual
    opponents.
FURTHERMORE, ~ AT ~ THE END ~ OF HIS DISCUSSION ON SPIRITUAL WARFARE, ~ 77
 ▶▶Paul indicates ~ that prayer ~ is central ~ 77
    Din our fight against ~ "the spiritual forces of evil ~ in the heavenly places."
BACK TO COL. 2:1a.
 ▶▶And ~ to how ~ Paul's pastoral concern for these believers ~ was expressed.
 ▶▶To put it briefly, ~ Paul ~ was engaged ~ in serious ~ intercessory prayer.
 ▶► He was expending ~ great energy ~ in prayer ~ on these believers' behalf.
NOW, ~ THE FORM OF THE VERB FOR "I HAVE" ~ 77
 ▶▶when he says, ~ For I want you to know ~ how great a struggle I have, ~ 77
    Dindicates ~ that ~ this intercessory prayer ~ was ongoing.
 ▶▶Verse 1a ~ could be translated, ~~ For I want you to know ~ how greatly ~ I am struggling.
FURTHERMORE, ~ WHEN WE LOOK ~ AT THE CONTENT ~ OF HIS CONTINUAL
intercession, ~ 77
 ▶▶we'll see ~ that his praying ~ was specific. ▶▶ 6/14
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- ▶▶heartfelt, ~~ in-depth, ~~ continual, ~~ and ~ specific.
- ▶▶This ~ was not ~ some vague, ~ surface, ~ or sporadic praying.
- ►► Such as, ~ once in awhile praying, ~ 77

DD"O, ~ Lord, ~ bless so and so." ~~ 77

→ Or, ~ "O, Lord, ~ be with so and so."

PAUL ~ SERVES AS A MODEL ~ FOR ALL BELIEVERS.

- ▶▶All believers ~ can learn ~ three valuable lessons here ~ from Paul.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ we should be engaged in serious prayer for our fellow believers.
 - →→And if we don't know what to pray for, ~ just open our Bibles.
 - → Scripture ~ will always ~ show us what to pray for ~ for our fellow believers.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd}$, ~ we need ~ to make sure ~ that our prayers for them ~ are ~ 77
 - → heartfelt, ~~ in-depth, ~~ continual, ~~ and specific.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 3rd, ~ don't let the spiritual forces of evil ~ keep us from praying. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Is. 41:10

 \Rightarrow fear not, ~ for I ~ am with you; ~~~ be not dismayed, ~ for I ~ am your God; ~~~ I ~ will strengthen you, ~~~ I ~ will help you, ~~~ I ~ will uphold you ~ with my righteous right hand. 11 7/14

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▶ By letting his readers know ~ 77
   → Paul conveyed to them ~ the seriousness and danger ~ of their situation.
▶▶The seriousness and danger ~ of false teaching.
▶ We talked about this last week.
▶▶And ~ since Paul points this out again, ~ it no doubt ~ bears briefly reviewing.
▶▶As said, ~ warning believers against false teaching ~ and its dangerous consequences ~ 77
   \triangleright \triangleright is part and parcel ~ 77
      → of ~ a Bible teacher's or preacher's ministry, ~ 77
         → of the ministry ~ of the local church, ~ 77
            → and ~ of an elder's ministry ~ to the church he serves.
► Furthermore, ~ 77
   Down noted that ~ warning against false teaching ~ is a recurrent theme ~ in the NT.
▶▶And we noted that ~ both ~ implicitly ~ and explicitly ~ 77
   bthe NT ~ points out ~ the dangerous consequences ~ of false teaching.
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►► Again, ~ false teaching ~ is ~ destructive. 11 8/14

NOW LET'S LOOK ~ AT THE BELIEVERS ~ ON WHOSE BEHALF ~ Paul was interceding, ~ 2:1b

FOR YOU [I.E., ~ THE COLOSSIANS] ~ AND ~ 77

- ▶▶ for those at Laodicea ~ and ~ for all who have not seen me face to face.
- ▶▶Laodicea ~ was a neighboring city ~ ten miles to the west ~ of Colossae.
 - >>Apparently ~ the same doctrinal errors ~ were being promoted there.
- ▶▶But Paul's concern ~ did not stop ~ with the churches at Laodicea and Colossae.
- The phrase \sim for all who have not seen me face to face \sim no doubt included \sim 77 \sim 21 the other believers and churches \sim in that vicinity.
- ▶▶Apparently ~ the same doctrinal errors ~ were being promoted ~ throughout that region.
- ▶▶So, ~ the heresy ~ and the danger included with it ~ was quite wide spread.

JUST THINK HOW MUCH MORE ~ WIDESPREAD ~ HERESY IS TODAY.

- ▶ Just think ~ of all the books, ~ the radio and TV programs, ~ 77Dand what goes out over the internet, ~ all claiming to speak in the name of Christ.
- ▶▶And yet ~ Christ has not sent them ~ to speak for Him.
- ▶▶Heresy ~ is a real ~ and widespread ~ danger ~ in our day. ▶▶ 9/14

▶▶Therefore, ~ we need to be discerning. ▶ We need to ~ "test the spirits," ~ as John says. ▶▶Like the Bereans, ~ we need ~ to examine the Scriptures ~ daily ~ to see if these things are so. ▶▶And we need ~ to expend great energy in prayer ~ for ourselves, ~ and on other believers' behalf. >> So that ~ none of us ~ will get sucked in ~ by charlatans. VERSE 2-3 ~ CONTAIN THE CONTENT OF PAUL'S INTERCESSORY PRAYER. IT LOOKS LIKE ~ THERE ARE FOUR REQUESTS HERE ~ ON BELIEVERS' BEHALF. ▶▶We're just going to look at the first request, ~ and then we'll be done for today. ▶▶And then next week, ~ we'll finish them ~ and also look ~ at verses 4-5. THE FIRST REQUEST, ~ VERSE 2a THAT THEIR HEARTS MAY BE ENCOURAGED. ▶▶Now, ~ I need to spend some time talking about this word. >> Because ~ not everyone uses the same translation. $\triangleright \triangleright$ And I don't want ~ anyone ~ confused by this. 11 10/14

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>>I want you ~ to get a good understanding of this.
   \triangleright \triangleright So please, ~ bear with me.
▶▶The Greek word for ~ "encouraged," ~ literally means ~ "to call to one's side."
   \trianglerightAnd ~ because ~ a person can be called alongside ~ for many purposes, ~ 77
       → the word ~ has ~ a wide range of meanings.
   >>It signifies ~ such ideas as ~ comfort, ~ encouragement, ~ exhortation, ~ admonish, ~
   and strengthen.
       →→ All depending ~ on the context ~ in which it is found.
   \triangleright \triangleright And, \sim if I understand it correctly, \sim it's hard to express it \sim in English.
       → Probably ~ because ~ of the wide range in meanings.
   \triangleright \triangleright So, ~ when it comes down to it, ~ 77
       → it looks like it's an interpretive decision ~ on the part of translators ~ 77
           → as to how to translate the word here ~ in Col. 2:2a.
   >> And that's why ~ you see different English words ~ used in different translations ~ of
   this verse.
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WITHIN THE CONTEXT OF COLOSSIANS, ~~ THE IDEA OF STRENGTHEN ~ SEEMS ~ TO fit best.

▶▶Always keep in mind the overarching reason Paul wrote Colossians. 11/14

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▶▶These believers ~ were beset ~ by false teachers ~ and most likely ~ 77
    Doneeded strengthening ~ the most.
 ▶▶Rather ~ than ~ comfort, ~ encouragement, ~ exhortation, ~ or ~ admonishment.
 ▶▶What made Paul concerned ~ for these believers ~ was the danger ~ 77
    Dof their being carried away by the heretical teaching ~ that was threatening them.
 ►► And he wanted ~ these believers ~ enabled ~ 77
    Do meet ~ this difficult situation ~ bravely ~ and ~ with confidence.
 ▶▶Briefly put, ~ they needed strength ~ in order ~ 77
    >> to equip them to stand strong ~ against ~ the error they faced.
OK, ~ HERE'S THE POINT OF APPLICATION FOR US.
 ▶ We too ~ need strength ~ to equip us ~ to stand strong ~ against error.
 ►►And, ~ although ~ it almost goes without saying, ~ 77
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- ▶▶And, ~ although ~ it almost goes without saying, ~ 77 DD the strength we need ~ comes from the Holy Spirit.
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ We'll see that at verse 4, ~ where Paul shows us ~ 77

▶▶False teachers ~ are quite proficient ~ at what they do.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ that the false teachers ~ use arguments ~ that sound ~ reasonable. 11 12/14

▶▶Paul, ~ I would suggest, ~ is sending us a clear message ~ ~ 77 Down need God's resources ~ to prevent us ~ from buying into ~ what false teachers are selling. WE JUST TALKED LAST WEEK ~ ABOUT ~ NOT BEING ABLE TO DO ANYTHING ~ without Jesus. ▶►And here it is again. >> And ~ since Paul has brought it up again, ~ no doubt we should briefly look at it again. >>Last time ~ it was in the context of ministry and the Christian life. >>Here ~ it's in the context of not falling for false teaching. $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ We need God the Holy Spirit ~ to give us the strength we need ~ in order for us ~ 77 Do stand strong against false teaching ~ and to see through the lies ~ of those spreading it. WE NEED TO WRAP OUR HEADS AROUND THIS. ▶▶The guicker ~ we understand and acknowledge this, ~ the better off we will be in life. ▶▶The enemy ▶▶Then sinful pride kicks in.

▶ Remember what Paul said about his thorn in the flesh? ⇒⇒ 2 Cor. 12:8-10. 11 13/14

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\triangleright \triangleright^8 Three times ~ I pleaded with the Lord about this, ~~ that it should leave me. ~~ ^9
     But he said to me, ~~ "My grace ~ is sufficient for you, ~~ for my power ~ is made perfect
     in weakness." ~~ Therefore ~ I will boast all the more gladly ~ of my weaknesses, ~ 77
        ⇒ ⇒ so that ~ the power of Christ ~ may rest upon me ~ [i.e., ~ so that Christ's power
        may reside in me]. ~~ [Paul continues,] ~~ 77
            →→<sup>10</sup> For the sake of Christ, ~ then, ~ I am content ~ with ~~ weaknesses, ~~
           insults, ~~ hardships, ~~ persecutions, ~~ and calamities. ~~ For when I am weak, ~
           then ~ I am strong.
 ▶▶My . . . ~~ we need ~ to get to the same place ~ that Paul was at.
    \triangleright \triangleright To gladly boast ~ in our weaknesses, ~ so that ~ 77
        \rightarrow God's power ~ can work ~ in us ~ and through us ~ and for us.
     >> And ~ we should not delay ~ in getting to that place.
CONCLUSION.
AS MARTIN LUTHOR WROTE, ~ 77
 ▶▶Did we ~ in our own strength confide, ~~ our striving ~ would be losing. ~ 77
     Dewere not the right Man on our side, ~ The Man ~ of God's own choosing; ~~ 77
        → Dost ask ~ who that may be? ~~ Christ Jesus, ~ it is He; ~~ 77
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→ Lord Sabaoth, ~ His name, ~ From age to age ~ the same, ~~ And He ~ must win

the battle.
