STAY FAITHFUL, PT. 1; COL. 2:6-7 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE BEGIN THE NEXT SECTION OF COLOSSIANS, ~ 2:6-23.

▶ Paul begins the section with the word "Therefore." ~~ Verse 6a.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ This points back ~ to verse 5.

▶ Recall in verse 5, ~ Paul had commended these believers ~ for staying faithful in the face of false teaching.

▶ Now, ~ in 2:6-23, ~ he gives ~ a series of five exhortations, ~ 77

DD calling them, ~ and ~ us indirectly, ~ to continue to stay faithful, ~ and not buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

BASICALLY, ~ BEGINNING WITH VERSE 5, ~ THE OVERARCHING IDEA ~ OF VERSES 6-23 ~ is this.

▶ For I may be absent in body, ~~ but I am with you in spirit, ~~ rejoicing ~ to see ~ how well ordered you are ~ and ~ the strength of your faith in Christ. ~~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Consequently, ~ continue to stay faithful, ~ and do not buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

AS WE NOTED, ~ IN 2:6-23, ~ PAUL LAYS DOWN A SERIES ~ OF FIVE ~ EXHORTATIONS.

Five exhortations calling believers ~ to continue ~ to stay faithful, ~ and not ~ buckle under the pressure of false teachers. 11/15

▶ But ~ we just don't get an exhortation.

▶ Paul expands on each one ~ with additional teaching..

AT THIS POINT, ~ I'LL JUST IDENTIFY THE BARE BONES ~ of the five exhortations.

▶▶And we'll look at Paul's elaboration as we deal with each one.

▶ Verse 6b. ~~ as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, ~ so walk in him.

▶ Verses 8a. ~~ See to it ~ that no one takes you captive.

Verses 16a. let no one pass judgment on you.

Verse 18a. ~~ Let no one disqualify you.

▶ Verse 20. ~~ why, ~ as if you were still alive in the world, ~ do you submit to regulations.

TODAY, ~ WE WILL LOOK AT ~ THE FIRST EXHORTATION to continue ~ 77

▶▶ to stay faithful, ~ and not ~ buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

Verses 6b.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, ~ so walk in him.

We'll also look ~ at Paul's elaboration in verse 7.

 \triangleright rooted ~ and built up ~ in him ~ and established in the faith, ~ just as you were taught, ~ abounding in thanksgiving. 11 2/15

PAUL'S LEAD-IN STATEMENT.

As you received Christ Jesus the Lord.

PAUL BEGINS ~ THE FIRST EXHORTATION ~ BY REMINDING THE BELIEVERS ~ IN Colossae and the surrounding region ~ 77

that ~ they had ~ "received ~ Christ Jesus the Lord."

▶▶Now, ~ this phrase ~ is not primarily ~ referring ~ to receiving Christ Jesus ~ as one's personal Savior and Lord.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Although$, ~ that is included.

 $\triangleright \triangleright As$ we'll see, ~ it's much broader than that.

► B&W vs. Colored TV.

►► The Greek word for ~ "received" ~ was the common word ~ for ~ receiving instruction from teachers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It has particular reference here ~ 77

→ → to the instruction ~ received by the Colossians ~ from their properly qualified teachers, ~ such as Epaphras.

► More specifically, ~ the phrase ~ "you received Christ Jesus the Lord" ~ refers ~ to the reception of the sound teaching ~ about Jesus. 11 3/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright Again$, ~ not primarily receiving him ~ as Savior and Lord.

 \rightarrow Although ~ that is implied ~ in the reception of the teaching.

 $\triangleright \triangleright But, \sim$ more broadly, \sim it means \sim embracing and believing \sim the sound teaching \sim about Jesus.

► So Paul here ~ was pointing his original readers ~ back to the experience ~ of receiving ~ the sound teaching ~ about Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ They had ~ heard, ~ understood, ~ and believed ~ the sound doctrine ~ that they had been taught ~ about Jesus.

CONSEQUENTLY, ~ WE CAN READ THE FIRST EXHORTATION THIS WAY.

▶ as you received the sound teaching about Christ Jesus, ~ the Lord, ~ so walk in him.

THE PHRASE, ~ "CHRIST JESUS THE LORD" ~ IS A UNIQUE PHRASE.

►► And it can be translated six different ways.

⊳⊳Don't panic

>> The translation ~ depends on whether ~ "Christ" ~ functions as a proper name or title.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Based on my research ~ of the grammatical structure of the phrase, ~ 77

 \rightarrow it seems the best way to view it ~ is ~ as a title ~ and not ~ a personal name.

 \triangleright The translation, ~ then, ~ is ~ "the Christ/Messiah, ~ Jesus, ~ the Lord." 11 4/15

▶▶So, ~ we can read the first exhortation this way.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ as you received the sound teaching about ~ the Messiah, ~ Jesus, ~ the Lord, ~ so walk in him.

▶▶Notice ~ that ~ the Person and work of Jesus is in view here.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Messiah = Savior. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Jesus = humanity. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Lord = his deity.

►►Of course, ~ Paul is summarizing here.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Teaching would've been much more extensive.

 \rightarrow Messiah = Savior. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Jesus = humanity. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Lord = his deity.

► So, ~ the sound teaching they had heard, ~ understood, ~ and believed ~ was specifically ~ about ~ the Person and work of Jesus.

► So basically, ~ the first exhortation to continue ~ to stay faithful, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ and not ~ buckle under the pressure of false teachers is this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ as you received the sound teaching ~ about ~ the Person and work of Jesus, ~ so walk in him.

►► And notice ~ that Paul ~ puts Jesus ~ in the center ~ of the phrase.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He says, ~ the Messiah, ~ Jesus, ~ the Lord.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ No doubt for emphasis, ~ underscoring exactly ~ who Jesus is. 11 5/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Paul makes it very clear ~ just who ~ is ~ Messiah ~ and Lord.

→→Jesus of Nazareth.

>>1 Tim. 2:5 (CSB). ~~ For there is ~ one God ~ and one mediator between God and humanity, ~~ the man Christ Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In Acts, ~ Peter, ~ speaking of Jesus, ~ says that ~ God has given ~ no other name under heaven ~ by which we must be saved.

THE PHRASE, ~ "THE MESSIAH, ~ JESUS, ~ THE LORD," ~ REFUTES ~ 77

▶▶at least two ~ of the tenets ~ of the false teaching ~ that was plaguing these believers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ the notion that God could not become human.

 \rightarrow Recall that ~ based on their belief that all matter is evil, ~ the heretics taught that ~ God, ~ in Jesus, ~ never could have become a human person.

→→Their thinking was, ~ if matter is evil, ~ how could God ~ ever be united ~ with a human body?

 \rightarrow Thus, ~ the heretics denied ~ either ~ the humanity ~ or the deity ~ of Christ.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow In their view, ~ he couldn't have been both.

→ Paul refuted this within his list ~ of sweeping and profound assertions about Jesus.

 \rightarrow And now ~ he refutes it again. 11 6/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 2nd, ~ the false teachers ~ were making Jesus out ~ to be less ~ than what he truly is.

→→Paul declares unequivocally, ~ Jesus is ~ both ~ Lord and Christ.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The heretics were distorting the Person and work of Jesus.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And it's like that in ~ every generation.

→→False teachers ~ always ~ distort ~ Jesus' Person and work.

 \Rightarrow False teachers ~ proclaim a Jesus ~ who is not quite God ~ and never quite saves, ~ as the cults teach; ~~ 77

→ → a Jesus ~ who wants you healthy and wealthy, ~ as preached by many televangelists; ~~ or a Jesus ~ whom you ask into your life to make you feel good.

OK, ~ HAVING LAID THE GROUNDWORK, ~ NOW LET'S LOOK AT THE 1st EXHORTATION.

SO WALK IN HIM.

▶ The form of the Greek verb is continuous.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So the exhortation to us ~ is ~ Continue ~ to walk in him.

▶▶Now, ~ we're talking about the sound teaching ~ about ~ the Person and work of Jesus

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So, ~ the phrase ~ is referring primarily ~ to staying faithful ~ to this correct teaching ~ about Jesus. 11 7/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright IOW$, ~ Paul is saying, ~ "Continue to stay faithful ~ to sound doctrine ~ in the face of false teaching."

▶▶In broader terms, ~ however, ~ walking ~ would include ~ living in conformity ~ with the sound teaching about Christ.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Sound doctrine contains within it ~ a demand ~ to live in a particular way.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow It includes ethics.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Sound doctrine ~ teaches and leads us ~ to live godly lives.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And we are to live ~ under ~ the control and influence ~ of sound doctrine.

⊳⊳Titus 2:11-12.

SO, ~ MOST LIKELY THEN, ~ THE BROADER IDEA HERE IS THIS.

Continue to stay faithful to sound doctrine ~ in ~ belief ~ and ~ practice.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And of course ~ this continual faithfulness would include ~ remaining faithful ~ in our commitment ~ to Jesus.

▶ Paul wants us ~ to never waver ~ in our commitment to Jesus ~ or ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in the face of instruction ~ that contradicts sound doctrine, ~ whether in belief or practice. 1 8/15

FALSE TEACHERS ~ NOT ONLY ~ DISTORT SOUND DOCTRINE ~ BUT ALSO ~ SOUND practice.

►► As we've discussed before, ~ while there may be some exceptions to this, ~ 77

DDI would suggest ~ that often ~ false teaching ~ leads ~ to ungodly living.

Scripture ~ definitely shows us ~ that ungodly living often goes along with false teaching.

>>In 1 Tim., ~ Paul calls on Tim. to hold firmly to sound doctrine and a good conscience.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Then he goes on to say ~ that the cause ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow of some making shipwreck of their faith ~ was their rejection ~ of ~ sound doctrine ~ and ~ a good conscience.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In his second epistle, ~ Peter says that ~ not only do false teachers teach false doctrine, ~ they ~ also ~ are ~ immoral, ~ greedy, ~ and exploit people.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jude says that ~ along with denying Jesus, ~~ false teachers say ~ that God's marvelous grace ~ allows us to live immoral lives.

► Ungodly living often goes along with false teaching.

 \blacktriangleright So not only ~ is there the danger ~ of abandoning sound doctrine because of false teaching, ~ 77

DD there is the added danger ~ of adopting ~ an ungodly lifestyle.

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PAUL'S FIRST EXHORTATION CALLING US ~ TO CONTINUE TO STAY FAITHFUL, ~ AND to not buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

▶ Never waver ~ in your commitment to Jesus ~ or ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in the face of instruction ~ that contradicts sound doctrine, ~ whether in belief, ~ or practice.

IN VERSE 7, ~ PAUL TELLS US HOW ~ TO STAY FAITHFUL.

ROOTED ~ AND BUILT UP IN HIM ~ AND ESTABLISHED IN THE FAITH, ~ JUST AS YOU were taught, ~ abounding in thanksgiving.

▶ Here he gives us four safeguards, ~ that will ~ protect us ~ from false teaching ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ and ~ from abandoning our commitment to Jesus ~ and sound doctrine, ~ both in belief and practice.

THE FIRST SAFEGUARD.

▶ Being rooted in Jesus.

▶▶I.e., ~ being ~ established and stable ~ in Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Since the exhortation includes ~ being faithful to our commitment to Jesus, ~ 77

→ → most likely ~ our commitment to him ~ is in view here.

 \triangleright So, ~ the first safeguard against false teaching, then, ~ would be ~ a commitment to Jesus ~ that is established and stable. 11/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ TPID, ~ a rock-solid commitment to Jesus ~ will protect us ~ 77

 \rightarrow -from false teaching ~ and ~ prevent us ~ from abandoning ~ sound doctrine ~ and Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Some questions ~ to test ~ our commitment to him.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Is Jesus the center of my life?

 \rightarrow J.e., ~ is my life all about ~ me ~ or ~ Jesus?

→→How much do I really love Him?

→→And, ~ is it my desire ~ to worship him, ~ live for him, ~ and to serve him?

▶▶Remember, ~ because of the presence of our sin nature within us, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ we can still be attracted back ~ to the domain of darkness.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And a strong attraction to it ~ will make us vulnerable ~ to false teachers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But ~ the stronger our commitment to Jesus, ~ the less likely ~ we will be pulled into false teaching.

THE SECOND SAFEGUARD ~~ THAT WILL ~ PROTECT US ~ FROM FALSE TEACHING ~ 77

and ~ prevent us ~ from abandoning sound doctrine ~ and ~ commitment to Jesus.

▶▶Being built up in Jesus. ↓↓ 11/15

► Since the exhortation calls us to be faithful to sound doctrine, ~ 77

DD most likely this refers ~ to being ~ built up ~ in the sound teaching ~ about Jesus' Person and work.

►►And this is exactly ~ what Peter exhorts us to do in 2 Pet. 3:18a.

▷▷But grow ~ in the grace and knowledge ~ of ~ [i.e., ~ about] ~ our Lord and Savior ~ Jesus Christ.

→→Since Paul has growth in knowledge, ~ we'll focus on this aspect here.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And since the grace aspect is beyond the scope of our study here, ~ you can trace that out on your own.

▶ The greater our knowledge about Jesus, ~ the less likely it will be ~ that we will be pulled into false teaching.

► And, ~ obviously, ~ the way we grow ~ in the "knowledge about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" ~ is ~ 77

>>> by reading and studying the Scriptures, ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow by listening to sound teaching and preaching, \sim and \sim by reading material \sim that adheres \sim to sound teaching about Jesus.

►►And this growth ~ is to be an ongoing thing. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Always more to learn.

THE THIRD SAFEGUARD ~~ THAT WILL ~ PROTECT US ~ FROM FALSE TEACHING ~ and ~ prevent us ~ from abandoning sound doctrine ~ and ~ commitment to Jesus.

\blacktriangleright Being established in the faith. **11** 12/15

► Now Paul broadens his scope.

>>First, ~ he was more specific, ~ referring to sound teaching about Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Now he makes it comprehensive.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Referring}$ to all sound doctrine.

▶ "faith" here ~ refers to, ~ as Jude says, ~ "the faith ~ that was once for all ~ delivered to the saints."

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$, ~ the special revelation of God that Scripture contains.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ TPID, ~ what God has said and revealed from Genesis to Revelation.

►►So, ~ Paul is saying here ~ that the third safeguard against false teaching is ~ being wellgrounded in Scripture.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ When we're well-grounded in God's word, ~ we will quickly recognize the lies of the false teachers.

>>Speaking of the righteous person, ~ 77

→ → David says in Ps. 37:31, ~ "The law of his God is in his heart; ~~ his steps do not slip.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow David says ~ the righteous person ~ has learned God's word, ~ remembers its teachings, ~ and it controls their thinking.

 \rightarrow And as a result, ~ they do not slip into sin. 11 13/15

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Applied to the current context, ~ 77

→ → when we have learned God's word, ~ remember its teachings, ~ and it controls our thinking, ~ we will not fall prey to false teachers.

►► And here's why ~ this is so important.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Paul, ~ in In 2 Cor. 11:15, ~ states that, ~ just like their evil leader, ~ 77

Satan's servants, ~ in the present context false teachers, ~ disguise themselves as servants of righteousness."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Peter

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Jude} \ldots$

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ If we're not well-grounded in God's word, ~ how will we know ~ when the lies are being introduced?

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So there is a great need ~ for believers to be well-grounded ~ in God's word.

AND THE FOURTH SAFEGUARD ~~ THAT WILL ~ PROTECT US ~ FROM FALSE TEACHING ~ and ~ prevent us ~ from abandoning sound doctrine ~ and ~ commitment to Jesus.

► Abounding in thanksgiving. => Interesting safeguard

► God's people are called to be a thankful people.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And rightly so.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 6x$ in Col. **11** 14/15

 \triangleright When we think of how much God loves us ~ and all that he has done for us, ~ given us, ~ and will give us, ~ 77

→ → how could we ~ not ~ be thankful?

▶ What Paul is implying here, ~ when he says ~ abounding in thanksgiving, ~ is that ~ 77

>>> believers ~ who lack a deep sense of thankfulness to God ~ are especially vulnerable ~ to false teaching.

► When we abound in thanksgiving to our heavenly Father ~ it's less likely ~ that we will be pulled into false teaching.

CONCLUSION.

STAY FAITHFUL, ~ PAUL SAYS, ~ to sound doctrine ~ and ~ to your commitment to Jesus.

b By having ~ a rock-solid commitment to Jesus. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ By growing ~ in the knowledge about Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ By being ~ well grounded in God's word. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ And ~ by abounding ~ in thanksgiving to our heavenly Father.

►►And ~ I do believe ~ we need all four ~ working at the same time ~ to give us adequate protection against false teachers.
