INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE CONTINUE OUR STUDY ~ OF THIS NEXT SECTION OF COLOSSIANS, ~ chapter 2, ~ verses 6-23.

► Again, ~ recall in verse 5, ~ Paul had commended these believers ~ for staying faithful in the face of false teaching.

>Now, ~ in 2:6-23, ~ he gives ~ a series of five exhortations, ~ calling them, ~ and us indirectly, ~ 77

>>> to continue to stay faithful, ~ and not buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

 \blacktriangleright As we noted, ~ basically, ~ beginning with verse 5, ~ the overarching idea ~ of verses 6-23 ~ is this.

 \triangleright For though I am absent in body, ~ yet I am with you in spirit, ~ rejoicing to see your good order and the firmness of your faith in Christ. ~~

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Consequently, ~ continue to stay faithful, ~ and do not buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

► So, ~ in 2:6-23, ~ Paul lays down a series ~ of five ~ exhortations ~~ calling believers ~ to continue ~ to stay faithful, ~ and not ~ buckle under the pressure ~ of false teachers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But not just a list of exhortation.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Additional teaching. 1/15

TO MAKE SURE ~ WE'RE ALL ON THE SAME PAGE, ~ I'LL ONCE AGAIN IDENTIFY THE bare bones ~ of the five exhortations.

▶▶And, ~ as noted, ~ we'll look at Paul's elaboration as we deal with each one.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Again$, ~ will help you outline the passage in your reading.

► Verse 6b. ~~ Stay faithful to sound doctrine in both belief and practice ~ and ~ to our commitment to Jesus.

Verses 8a. ~~ See to it ~ that no one takes you captive.

Verses 16a. let no one pass judgment on you.

Verse 18a. ~~ Let no one disqualify you.

Verse 20. ~~ why, ~ as if you were still alive in the world, ~ do you submit to regulations.

►Skeleton....

LAST WEEK, ~ WE LOOKED AT PAUL'S FIRST EXHORTATION AND PAUL'S ELABORATION.

► Stay faithful, ~ Paul urged us, ~ to sound doctrine in both belief and practice ~ and ~ to our commitment to Jesus.

▶ Then Paul spelled out ~ four safeguards ~ that will help us stay faithful.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ by having ~ a rock-solid commitment to Jesus.

 $D > 2^{nd}$, ~ by growing ~ in the knowledge ~ about Jesus. 11 2/15

 $>>3^{rd}$, ~ by being ~ well grounded ~ in God's word.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 4th, ~ by abounding ~ in thanksgiving ~ to our heavenly Father.

 \triangleright Practicing these four safeguards ~ will make it ~ much less likely ~ that we will be pulled into false teaching.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And ~ I do believe ~ we need all four ~ working at the same time ~ to give us adequate protection ~ against false teachers.

THIS MORNING, ~ WE WILL BEGIN TO LOOK AT ~ PAUL'S SECOND EXHORTATION ~ elaboration of it. ≠≠

Chapter 2, ~ verses 8-15.

▶ The passage can be outlined this way.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathbf{8a}$, ~ The exhortation.

See to it that no one takes you captive.

>>8b-15, ~ Paul expands on the exhortation.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow 8b$, ~ The means by which false teachers attempt to capture believers.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow 8c$, ~ The 2 sources of false teaching.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And 9-15, ~ Rebuttal.

▶▶Today, ~ exhortation, ~ means, ~ and the 2 sources. 11 3/15

<u>NOW LET'S LOOK AT THE SECOND EXHORTATION ~ CALLING BELIEVERS ~ to continue ~</u> <u>to stay faithful, ~ and not ~ buckle under the pressure of false teachers.</u>

VERSE 8a, ~ SEE TO IT THAT NO ONE TAKES YOU CAPTIVE.

>>"See to it" ~ is an ongoing thing, ~ calling us to be on watch at all times.

►► Could be paraphrased this way.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Maintain a constant watch, ~ so that ~ no one takes you captive.

▶ We must always ~ be on guard against false teaching.

>> Though covering every aspect of the Christian life, ~ what Peter says ~ certainly applies here.

→→1 Pet. 5:8.

→→Be sober-minded; ~~ be watchful. ~ [why:] ~~ Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, ~ seeking someone to devour.

 \triangleright We need to have ~ a high-level watchfulness and attentiveness, ~ in order ~ to not be taken by surprise and fooled ~ by false teachers.

►►And John, ~ in his first epistle ~ points out the importance of this high-level of watchfulness and attentiveness.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ for many false prophets have gone out into the world.

PAUL SAYS, ~ MAINTAIN A CONSTANT WATCH, ~ SO THAT ~ NO ONE TAKES YOU captive. 11 4/15

Several times in Paul's letters ~ believers are warned ~ of dangers we are facing.

▶ Here ~ Paul is pointing again ~ to the danger ~ that false teachers pose.

THE PHRASE, ~ TAKES YOU CAPTIVE, ~ PROVIDES A DRAMATIC IMAGERY ~ 77

▶▶of the power ~ of those who spread false teaching.

▶▶Such imagery is similar ~ to the sayings of Jesus ~ 77

Downhen he describes the binding of the strong man and robbing him of his possessions.

▶▶In this case, ~ Paul is applying the imagery ~ 77

D to ~ false teachers taking the believers ~ away from the gospel ~ and into ~ the slavery of error.

▶▶Jesus said, ~ "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

 $\triangleright \triangleright \circ$ On the other hand, ~ false teaching, ~ like sin, ~ leads us into slavery.

ALSO, ~ THE PHRASE ~ "TAKES YOU CAPTIVE" ~ accentuates the spiritual warfare involved.

►► Always remember, ~ as Paul says (Eph. 6:12), ~ 77

Dowe do not wrestle against flesh and blood, ~~ but ~ against ~ the rulers, ~~ against ~ the authorities, ~~ against ~ the cosmic powers over this present darkness, ~~ against ~ the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

False teachers ~ are simply instruments in Satan's hands. 115/15

▶ We are in a spiritual, ~ not a physical, ~ battle.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We really need to wrap our heads around this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Satan is a master of deflection.

MAINTAIN A CONSTANT WATCH, ~ SO THAT ~ NO ONE TAKES YOU CAPTIVE, ~ PAUL exhorts.

► How is it possible ~ for false teachers to capture believers?

▶▶Simple, ~ these captives are not well-grounded in sound doctrine.

 \triangleright When a believer does not know the doctrines of the Christian faith, ~~ he/she ~ can easily ~ be captured by false teaching.

→→Because, ~~ how will you know ~ when you're being lied to?

▶▶ Spiritual immaturity ~ is a second factor, ~ which actually goes along with the first.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But it's worth highlighting on its own.

>>When we are spiritually mature, ~ we will, ~ as Paul says in Eph. 4:14, ~ CSB ~ 77

→ no longer be little children, ~~ tossed by the waves and blown around ~ by every wind of teaching, ~ by human cunning ~ with cleverness in the techniques of deceit.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We will no longer be immature ~ like children.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We won't be tossed and blown about ~ by every wind of false teaching. 11 6/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We will not be influenced ~ when heretics try to trick us ~ with lies so clever ~ they sound like the truth.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The implication, ~ of course, ~ is that spiritually immature believers ~ will ~ 77

→ → be tossed and blown about ~ by every wind of false teaching.

 \rightarrow They will be fooled and influenced ~ by the clever lies ~ of false teachers.

NOW, ~ I THINK ~ WE NEED TO PAUSE HERE ~ and point out ~ something extremely important in this context.

▶▶And that is, ~ Jesus does not want us to be immature, ~ spiritually speaking.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He does not want us to lack understanding, ~ or ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow to be highly impressionable, ~ gullible, ~ foolish, ~ and childish ~ in biblical doctrine and behavior.

→→Rather, ~ Jesus wants us to constantly be moving forward in spiritual growth.

► How know this?

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Paul} \ldots \Rightarrow \Rightarrow \mathsf{Hebrews} \ldots \Rightarrow \Rightarrow \mathsf{Peter} \ldots$

OK, ~ THE SECOND EXHORTATION ~ CALLING BELIEVERS TO CONTINUE ~ TO STAY faithful, ~ and not ~ buckle under the pressure of false teachers.

Verse 8a, ~ Maintain a constant watch, ~ so that ~ no one takes you captive. 11 7/15

THEN, ~ AS NOTED, ~ PAUL EXPANDS ON THE EXHORTATION.

IN VERSE 8b, ~ PAUL NOTES THE MEANS BY WHICH ATTEMPT TO CAPTURE BELIEVERS.

MAINTAIN A CONSTANT WATCH, ~ SO THAT ~ NO ONE TAKES YOU CAPTIVE BY philosophy and empty deceit.

▶ 1^{st} glance - 2 things. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Not.

► Word for word translation => Drawbacks => Nuances

► Grammar: ~~ empty deceit ~ describes philosophy.

►►NIV: ~~ See to it ~ that no one takes you captive ~ through hollow and deceptive philosophy.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Digress. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Have word for word and a meaning for meaning.

►►Not slamming philosophy.

 $\triangleright \triangleright A$ horrible mistake

►►Literally means "love of wisdom."

▶▶It is said ~ that Paul ~ was a gifted philosopher.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{So}$, ~ he was not condemning education ~ or the study of philosophy.

→→Instead, he was condemning ~ a certain type ~ of philosophy, ~ one that was hollow and deceptive. 11 8/15

▶▶Of course, ~ Paul is talking ~ about ~ the doctrines of the false teachers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{O}$ verarching reason for writing.

The heretics' hollow and deceptive ideas ~ might appear reasonable, ~ and even compelling, ~ 77

>>> until one examines them carefully ~ and discovers ~ there is absolutely no substance.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The whole system is designed ~ to fool the unwary.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We can find an apt analogy ~ in modern advertising. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Think about it.

 \rightarrow For that is precisely ~ what false teaching is: ~~ deceptive marketing ~ meant ~ to trap gullible people ~ looking for a quick fix.

▶ Peter and Jude ~ use very descriptive language ~ in describing false teachers, ~ in 2^{nd} Peter and Jude respectively.

>>Peter says that the false teachers exploit people "with false words."

→→ "false" refers to ~ fictitious and deceitful.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He also describes them ~ as "waterless springs."

 \rightarrow False teachers give nothing because they have nothing to give.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow What good is an empty spring when you're thirsty?

 \Rightarrow False teachers cannot quench ~ the spiritual thirst of people. 11 9/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Peter further describes them ~ as "mists driven by a storm."

→→"mists" refers ~ to the Palestinian haze ~ that precedes dry weather ~ 77

→ → and suggests ~ the false appearance of moisture.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Their teachings are not what they appear to be.

 \rightarrow They appear good; ~ but in reality, ~ they are ~ fictitious ~ and deceitful ~ and destructive.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Jude}$ calls false teachers "waterless clouds, ~ swept along by winds."

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Like waterless clouds, ~ false teachers and their doctrines ~ are all show ~ but no substance.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Their doctrines ~ are founded ~ on emptiness.

>>And Jude also calls them "fruitless trees in late autumn."

→→He compares false teachers ~ to trees promising fruit ~ but giving none.

▶ To sum up, ~ the hollow and deceptive doctrines of the false teachers ~ 77

▷▷promise much ~ but deliver nothing.

THE DESCRIPTION ~ HOLLOW AND DECEPTIVE ~ SETS UP A CONTRAST ~ FIRST ~ WITH Jesus.

►► As Paul said in 1:19, ~ God, ~ in all his fullness, ~ became human. 11 10/15

 \blacktriangleright And as we saw in 2:3, ~ all that a person needs to know ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in order ~ to establish an eternal relationship with God ~ can be found ~ in Jesus ~ and His accomplishment for mankind.

FURTHERMORE, ~ THE DESCRIPTION ~ HOLLOW AND DECEPTIVE ~ sets up a contrast with the gospel.

► The gospel ~ is the word of truth.

►►And the gospel ~ is the living and enduring word of God ~ and bears fruit.

>>I.e., ~ it produces salvation in all who call upon Jesus for salvation.

▶ False teaching ~~ is deceptive, ~ destructive, ~ hollow, ~ detrimental, ~ and deadly.

► Jesus and the gospel ~~ are ~ true, ~ substantive, ~ beneficial, ~ life-giving, ~ and life-transforming.

 $\triangleright \triangleright My \dots$, ~~ accept ~ no substitutes.

IN VERSE 8c, ~ PAUL IDENTIFIES ~ THE TWO SOURCES ~ OF FALSE TEACHING.

ACCORDING TO HUMAN TRADITION, ~ 77

▶ according to the elemental spirits of the world.

 $\blacktriangleright 1^{st}$, ~ according to human tradition.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$, ~ they come from the human mind. 11/15

▷▷Jeremiah, ~ chapter 14, ~ verse 14, ~ "And the Lord said to me: "The prophets are prophesying lies in my name. ~~ I did not send them, ~ nor did I command them or speak to them. ~~ They are prophesying to you a lying vision, ~ worthless divination, ~ and the deceit of their own minds."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jeremiah, ~ chapter 23, ~ verse 16, ~ The false prophets "speak visions of their own minds, ~ not from the mouth of the Lord."

 $\triangleright \triangleright \vdash Ezekiel$, ~ chapter 13, ~ verse 6, ~ "They say, ~ 'Declares the Lord,' ~ when the Lord has not sent them, ~ and yet they expect him to fulfill their word."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ False teachers claim to speak for God.

 \Rightarrow But in reality, ~ they teach and preach deceptive, ~ man-made stories ~ that have ~ no basis in reality ~ and ~ no value whatsoever.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Furthermore, ~ they may claim to speak for Jesus, ~ 77

→ → but Paul tells us in Philippians ~ that ~ they are actually enemies of the true gospel.

→→Phil. 3:18. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ For I have often told you, ~ and now say again with tears, ~ that many live ~ as enemies ~ of the cross of Christ.

>>And within this context, ~ perhaps we would be remiss ~ to not look at John's warning.

→→1 Jn. 4:1a, CSB.

→→Dear friends, ~ do not believe every spirit ~ [i.e., ~ every teacher], ~~ but test the spirits ~~ to see if they are from God.

→ The forms of the verbs for "do not believe" and "test" ~ indicate ~~ that this is not ~ something that can be done ~ once and for all. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Habit 11 12/15

→→"test" means ~~ to make a critical examination of something; ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow to determine genuineness, ~ put to the test, ~ examine.

 \Rightarrow \Rightarrow We are ~ to constantly ~ examine ~ 77

→→to see ~ whether a person who is preaching or teaching God's word ~ is genuinely
~ speaking for God.

TO NOT LOSE SIGHT OF THE FOREST FOR THE TREES, ~ 77

>>we are discussing the two sources of the hollow and deceptive philosophy of false teachers.

 \blacktriangleright The 2nd source of false teaching.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ according to the elemental spirits of the world.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The phrase ~ elemental spirits of the world ~ is hard to understand.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Four principal meanings have been given to it. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Don't panic.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow I'm only going to give you what seems the most likely one.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The most likely meaning here ~ is that it refers ~ to the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places, ~ as Paul puts it in Ephesians.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Demons. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ the evil spiritual powers of this world.

 \triangleright They seek ~ to control and destroy ~ people's lives. 11 13/15

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ For the following three reasons ~ it is best ~ to view "the elemental spirits" ~ as fallen angels.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow 1st, ~ In light of numerous references to the angelic powers in the overall context of Colossians, ~ most likely ~ demonic powers are in view here.

 \Rightarrow \Rightarrow 2nd, ~ in the immediate context of verses 8-15, ~ they are ~ most likely ~

→ → the "rulers and authorities" ~ that Jesus disarmed ~ on the cross.

 \hookrightarrow We'll see that in verse 15.

 \rightarrow And 3rd, ~ the NT ~ regularly links false teaching ~ with the demonic.

→→E.g., ~ 1 Tim. 4:1.

 \rightarrow Now the Spirit ~ expressly says ~ that ~ in later times ~ some will depart from the faith ~~ by devoting themselves ~ to ~ deceitful spirits ~ and ~ teachings of demons.

→ And Jesus says in Matt. 24:24, CSB, ~ 77

rightarrow For false messiahs and false prophets ~ will arise ~ and perform great signs and wonders ~ to lead astray, ~ if possible, ~ even the elect.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Again$, ~ we come back to the reality of the spiritual realm, ~ and it's activity and influence ~ in this world.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow We need to really grasp this.

THEN, ~ IN VERSE 8d, ~ NOT THAT HE REALLY NEEDED TO, ~ WE'VE ALREADY GOTTEN the point, ~ 77

>>Paul adds, ~ that ~ false teaching ~ does not originate with Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ and not according to Christ.

▶ Driving the point home

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The implication ~ is that ~ false teaching ~ in no ~ way, ~ shape, ~ or form ~ is ever approved by Jesus.

CONCLUSION.

MY ..., ~~ LET US MAINTAIN ~ A CONSTANT WATCH, ~ 77

>> so that ~ no one takes us captive ~ through hollow and deceptive doctrines.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In addition ~ never forget, ~ the two sources ~ of false teaching ~ are ~ demons ~ and the human mind.

 \rightarrow And always remember, ~ in no way, ~ shape, ~ or form ~ is false teaching ~ <u>ever</u> ~ approved by Jesus.
