TO MAKE US RELY ON GOD; 2 COR. 1:8-11 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

THIS MORNING, ~ WE'RE GOING TO TAKE A BREAK FROM COLOSSIANS.

▶ The Lord has been doing quite a work in my heart and mind ~ through this health issue.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Making me deal with things that were long overdue to be dealt with.

▶▶Meg thought I should share with you what the Lord has done and is doing.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I$ do this, ~ not to draw attention to myself.

 \rightarrow But to draw attention to our great Savior.

▶▶In my Scripture reading and prayer time, ~ a verse in 2 Corinthians ~ jumped out at me, ~ which is quite relevant to what I'm going to share.

⊳⊳2 Cor. 1:9b.

 \Rightarrow But that ~ [i.e., ~ the situation Paul and his coworkers were in] ~ was to make us ~ rely ~ not on ourselves ~ but on God ~ who raises the dead.

►► So this is what we're going to do this morning.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I'$ m going to explain to you the overall context of 2 Cor. 1:8-11.

 \Rightarrow Not in depth. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Just to give us the context. 11 1/12

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Next, ~ we'll zero in on verse 9b.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And spend some time explaining that.

 \triangleright Then I'll use verse 9b as a springboard ~ into what the Lord is doing ~ in my heart and mind.

► Now, ~ one caveat.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In no way, ~ shape, ~ or form, ~ am I saying ~ or suggesting ~ that my situation ~ was as dire or as dangerous ~ as that of Paul's.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The only point of comparison ~ is that, ~ like with Paul, ~ 77

 \rightarrow God used my situation ~ as a springboard ~ to teach me ~ to rely not on myself ~ but on him. ~~ And deal with things long overdue to deal with.

OKAY, ~ LET'S LOOK AT AN OVERVIEW ~ OF 2 COR. 1:8-11.

AN EXPERIENCE IN ASIA ~ HAD BROUGHT PAUL ~ TO THE END OF HIMSELF.

► Apparently the Corinthians had some knowledge of this hardship, ~ possibly communicated to them by Titus,

▶ But they did not appreciate its severity.

▶ Paul did not gloss over ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ his feeling of despair and helplessness ~ in this situation. 11 2/12

▶ Paul underscored it forcefully.

 $>>1^{st}$, ~ to illustrate ~ how powerless both he and the Corinthians were apart from God.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 2nd, ~ to stress ~ how important prayer is ~ as a means ~ of effecting ~ God's gracious intervention and aid.

JUST WHAT THE HARDSHIPS WERE IS DEBATED.

► Could have been some persecution.

► Could have been a drastic illness.

►Later in this letter he writes of his various troubles.

⊳⊳2 Cor. 11:24-27.

→→Five times ~ I received at the hands of the Jews ~ the forty lashes less one. ~~ 11

→→Three times ~ I was beaten with rods. ~~ Once ~ I was stoned. ~~ Three times ~ I was shipwrecked; ~~ a night and a day I was adrift at sea;

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow \rightarrow$ on frequent journeys, ~ in danger from rivers, ~ danger from robbers, ~ danger from my own people, ~ danger from Gentiles, ~ danger in the city, ~ danger in the wilderness, ~ danger at sea, ~ danger from false brothers;

 \Box in toil and hardship, ~ through many a sleepless night, ~ in hunger and thirst, ~ often without food, ~ in cold and exposure.

► But what it was ~ that Paul was referring to ~ in 1:8-11 ~ was not the important thing. 13/12 ▶▶The point is ~ that whatever it was, ~ it was allowed & designed by God ~ to show Paul ~ 7

>>> that he needed to rely on the Lord ~ and not himself or earthly help or strength.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ David tells us ~ the attitude the Lord wants believers to have ~ in Ps. 20:6-8.

 \rightarrow Now I know ~ that the Lord saves his anointed; ~~ he will answer him from his holy heaven ~ with the saving might of his right hand. ~~ 77

→→Some trust in chariots ~~ and some in horses, ~~ but we trust ~ in the name of the Lord our God. ~~ They collapse and fall, ~~ but we rise and stand upright.

▶ Being unable to be specific ~ in identifying this experience Paul underwent ~ permits believers today ~ to apply this to themselves.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Especially ~ when they find themselves in desperate circumstances ~ where deliverance seems impossible.

PAUL BELIEVED HE AND HIS COWORKERS WOULD DIE.

▶▶In verses 8b-9a, ~ he says, ~ 77

 \triangleright For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength ~~ that we despaired ~ of life itself. ~~ 77

→ →Indeed, we felt that we had received the sentence of death.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ They thought they would never live through it.

 \rightarrow In fact, ~ they expected to die. 11 4/12

He delivered us from such a deadly peril, ~~ and he will deliver us. ~~ On him ~ we have set our hope ~ that he will deliver us again.

▶ Paul does not let us know how the Lord delivered them.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But again, ~ that's not the point.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He was delivered from this menacing peril.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ This is not the first time ~ Paul has been in trouble, ~~ nor will it be the last.

►► And look at what Paul says.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ and he will deliver us. ~~ On him ~ we have set our hope ~ that he will deliver us again.

WHEN GOD HAS RESCUED YOU ONCE FROM GREAT DANGER, ~ 77

>>you are confident ~ that God ~ can ~ and will ~ rescue you again.

Let's take a few minutes ~ and look at Ps. 13.

>>How long, ~ O Lord? ~~ Will you forget me forever? ~ [felt forgotten] ~~ How long will you hide your face from me? ~ [felt abandoned]

 \triangleright How long must I take counsel in my soul ~~ and have sorrow in my heart all the day? ~ [hurting, ~ mind was in turmoil] ~~ How long shall my enemy be exalted over me?

 \rightarrow [enemy seemed to be winning] 115/12

 $\triangleright \triangleright [Look what he does] \sim [1^{st}, \sim he prays]$

→→Consider and answer me, ~ O Lord my God; ~~ light up my eyes, ~ lest I sleep the sleep of death, ~~ lest my enemy say, ~~ 77

→→"I have prevailed over him," ~~ lest my foes rejoice ~ because I am shaken.

 $\triangleright \triangleright [Now look at what he does]$

⇒⇒But I have trusted ~ [past tense] ~ in your steadfast love ~~

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ [He looks at God's past faithfulness to gain strength for the present]

→ → my heart shall rejoice in your salvation

[Based on God's past faithfulness, ~ he expected that faithfulness to continue].

→→I will sing to the Lord, ~~ because he has dealt bountifully with me.

NOW LOOK AT WHAT PAUL SAYS AT THE END OF VERSE 10.

>>On him ~ we have set our hope ~ that he will deliver us again.

▶ Paul is not simply expressing wishful thinking ~~ as one would ~~ if one says, ~ "I hope that God will deliver me."

► He voices his fundamental confidence ~ that God will deliver him.

LET'S TURN OUR ATTENTION TO VERSE 11. 11 6/12

>>You also must help us by prayer, ~~ so that ~ many will give thanks on our behalf ~ for the blessing granted us ~ through the prayers of many.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{God}$ works through the prayers of his people.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Doesn't}$ need to.

► The verb for "help" ~ means ~ "to work together with" ~ or ~ "cooperate" by means of something.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ In this case, ~~ by means of their prayers on his behalf.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Paul was calling on them ~ to work together ~ in praying for him and his team.

▶ Paul showed an untiring belief ~ in the effectiveness ~ of intercessory prayer.

▶ Paul ~ does not hide behind the facade ~ of a superman ~ 77

>>> who pretends that he can survive quite well on his own ~ without help from anyone else.

>>He has no qualms ~ about expressing ~ his desperate need for their prayers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{O}$ ften he would ask churches to pray for him.

 \Rightarrow E.g., ~ we see it in Romans, ~ Ephesians, ~ and Colossians.

▶ Paul is firmly convinced of prayer's power.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Because he knows ~ that God ~ listens, ~ responds, ~ and delivers. 11 7/12

THAT WAS OUR OVERVIEW OF THE PASSAGE.

NOW LET'S ZERO IN ON VERSE 9b.

► Let's start with verse 8.

>>8. ~~ For we do not want you to be unaware, ~ brothers, ~ of the affliction we experienced in Asia. ~~ For we were so utterly burdened beyond our strength ~~ that we despaired ~ of life itself.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 9a$. ~~ Indeed, ~ we felt that we had received ~ the sentence of death.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 9b$. ~~ But that ~ was to make us rely ~ not on ourselves ~ but on God ~ who raises the dead.

THIS WHOLE SITUATION WAS DESIGNED BY GOD ~ 77

to get Paul and his coworkers ~ to rely ~ not on themselves ~ but on God.

▶ We need to consider that ~ when tough or horrible situations ~ arise in our lives.

► He wants us to rely on him. ⇒⇒ Why?

 \triangleright Because is trying to save us ~ from ~ the futility, ~ stress, ~ and frustration ~ of trying to do things ~ apart from him.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ This, ~ I believe, ~ is Jesus' point ~ in telling us ~ that without him, ~ we can do nothing.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And personally, ~ I am beginning to view whatever is going on with my physically, ~ that the Lord designed it to get me to deal with some issues. 1 8/12

▶▶ to place his confidence ~ on his own powers ~ rather than on God.

▶▶The roots of human pride grow deep, ~ and are not easily dislodged.

► We frequently ~ need a good dose of helplessness, ~~ 77

>>> when we are reduced to extremities ~ and stripped of all false self-confidence, ~~ 77

→ → before we ~ learn humility ~ and open ourselves up to God's power.

▶ Deep certainty of death for Paul ~ led to a deeper trust in God.

THIS BRUSH WITH DEATH ~ AND GOD'S DELIVERANCE ~ TAUGHT PAUL ~ 77

that we cannot rely on our own puny strength ~ but on the God who raises the dead.

▶ Those who rely on themselves ~ for their strength ~ and for their wisdom ~ 77

>> cannot rely entirely on God ~~ and thus doom themselves to failure.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Isaiah warned the Israelites about this. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Is. 31:1.

→→Woe to those who go down to Egypt for help ~ and rely on horses, ~~ who trust in chariots because they are many ~~ and in horsemen because they are very strong, ~ 77

 \rightarrow but do not look to the Holy One of Israel ~ or consult the Lord! 11 9/12

 \rightarrow \rightarrow The reason for failure is lamentably simple.

→→Men ~ are mere men.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow And horses ~ are mere horses.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow But God ~ is God.

↔ ↔ Isaiah is demonstrating God's superiority.

 \rightarrow Disaster awaits those who trust ~ in human strength ~ rather than in God.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And in Prov. 3:5, ~ Solomon exhorts us to trust in God.

 \Rightarrow \Rightarrow Trust in the Lord ~ with all your heart, ~~ and do not rely ~ on your own understanding. \Rightarrow \Rightarrow Why?

1.→+Finite....

2.→→Understanding is faulty. ⇒⇒ Opposite page

3.→→And influenced ~ by our sinful nature.

→ → Deceitful above all things, ~ and desperately sick, ~ who can understand it?

▶▶Those who rely on God ~ may appear to be weak ~~ and even to be failures, ~~ but God does not fail to deliver them.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{David}$, ~ Ps. 28. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ The Lord is my strength and my shield; ~~ in him my heart trusts, ~ and I am helped. 11 10/12

AND THAT ~ BRINGS US BACK ~ TO WHERE WE STARTED.

▶ The Lord has been doing quite a work in my heart and mind ~ through this health issue.

▶▶In my Scripture reading and prayer time, ~ a verse in 2 Corinthians ~ jumped out at me, ~ which is quite apropos to what I'm going to share.

⊳⊳2 Cor. 1:9b.

 \rightarrow This whole situation that Paul was in ~ was allowed and designed by God ~ to get Paul and his coworkers ~ to rely ~ not on themselves ~ but on God.

►► And I'm beginning to come to the conclusion ~ 77

>> that the Lord has allowed and designed my health issue ~ to get me to deal with things ~ that were long overdue to be dealt with.

►►My health issue.

>>Lower-abdominal pressure and other weird and worrisome symptoms.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Anxiety.$

Enemy attacked.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Mind became battlefield

 $\triangleright \triangleright A$ spiritual battle ensued.

►►Drove me into really praying through and reading. ↓↓ 11/12

► Spiritual battle raging, ~ God decides to deal with me on four fronts.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ More renewal than it's had.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 99.9\%$ of time for prep.

▷▷Trust issue. ⇒⇒ Control freak.

►►Led to much repentance.

▶▶Led me to repent that I did not really believe that the Lord has what is best for us at heart.

►►And all of this is starting to lead me into even more of praying through and reading Scripture.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Speak the name of Jesus.

►► And now I'm starting to take little, ~ shaky ~ steps into really trusting in the Lord.

►► And spending a lot of time in God's word for prayer and spiritual growth.

►► All of this was almost derailed on Friday afternoon.

►► Conclusion ~ obvious really.

▶ Pray for us.
