STAY FAITHFUL, PT. 3; COL. 2:9-10 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

WE ARE CURRENTLY MOVING THROUGH COL. 2:6-23.

- ►► As we've noted, ~ in this paragraph, ~~ Paul lays down a series ~ of five exhortations, ~ calling believers ~ to stay faithful ~ and not buckle under the pressure ~ of false teaching.
- ▶▶And again, ~ Paul expands on each one ~ with additional teaching.

AND WITHIN THIS LARGER CONTEXT, ~ WE ARE NOW ZEROING IN ON THE SECOND exhortation and its expansion.

- ▶▶This section is quite lengthy.
- ▶▶And to keep the big picture in mind, ~ let's review the overall outline.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 8a$, ~ The exhortation.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 8b-15$, ~ Paul expands on the exhortation.


 $\rightarrow \rightarrow 8b$, ~ The means by which false teachers attempt to capture believers.

⇒⇒8c, ~ The two sources of false teaching.

→ And 9-15, ~ Rebuttal. ⇒⇒ 2nd.

LAST TIME, \sim WE LOOKED AT THE SECOND EXHORTATION \sim AND THEN BEGAN \sim TO look at Paul's additional teaching on it. 1115

▶▶In the second exhortation, ~ Paul calls believers to ~ "Maintain a constant watch, ~ so that ~ no one takes you captive." >> As noted, ~ we need to have ~ this high-level watchfulness and attentiveness, ~ in order ~ to not be taken by surprise and fooled ~ by false teachers. >> The imagery Paul uses, as we observed, ~ is that of false teachers ~ taking believers away from the gospel ~ and into ~ the slavery of error. → False teaching, ~ like sin, ~ leads us into slavery. >>A couple of factors ~ that ~ will put us into danger ~ are not being well-grounded in God's word ~ and spiritual immaturity. → These factors in the life of a believer ~ make them easy prey for false teachers. ▶▶The means by which false teachers attempt to capture believers ~ is through hollow and deceptive doctrines ~ that promise much ~ but deliver nothing. >> The heretics' hollow and deceptive ideas ~ might appear reasonable, ~ and even compelling, ~ 77 → until one examines them carefully ~ and discovers ~ there is absolutely no substance. >> The whole system is designed ~ to fool the unwary. >> We can find an apt analogy ~ in modern advertising. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Think about it. →For that is precisely ~ what false teaching is: ~~ deceptive marketing ~ meant ~ to trap gullible people ~ looking for a quick fix. 11 2/15



⊳⊳In crystal-clear words, ~ Paul once again ~ lays out sound doctrine.
▶▶Paul makes ~ 7 assertions ~ in his rebuttal.
$\triangleright \triangleright$ Today, ~ we'll focus our attention ~ on the first three.
THE 1st ASSERTION. ⇒⇒ Vs. 9.
FOR IN HIM ~ THE WHOLE FULLNESS OF DEITY ~ DWELLS BODILY.
▶▶Here Paul reaffirms ~ both ~ the deity and the humanity ~ of Jesus.
ACCORDING TO THE FALSE TEACHERS, ~ GOD WAS GOOD ~ BUT MATTER WAS EVIL.
▶▶Because the good God could not have created evil matter, ~~ a series of intermediary spirit beings emanating out of God ~ was postulated.
$\triangleright \triangleright$ And each one, ~ they taught, ~ was less God than the one preceding.
ho hdIt was one of the lesser emanations, ~ far removed from God, ~ that created matter.
ho hdIn such a scheme, ~ Jesus ~ was simply ~ one ~ of the higher emanations.
⊳⊳Thus, ~ they denied his full deity.
▶▶But because of their belief that matter was evil, ~ they also denied his humanity.
$>>$ Since matter was viewed as evil, \sim it was inconceivable in their thinking \sim that a good emanation \sim could take up a human body. 11 4/15

▶▶The false teachers ~ also denied ~ the sufficiency of Christ for salvation. >> Said ~ to be complete, ~ a person needed more. ▶▶Furthermore, ~ angels were objects of worship ~ because of the belief ~ that their help was essential for salvation. >> All of these ~ are hollow and deceptive doctrines. THERE ARE NO EMANATIONS FROM GOD. ▶▶No series of intermediary spirit beings, ~ each one being less God than the one preceding. ▶▶The gulf between heaven and earth ~ was bridged ~ in the incarnation of Jesus Christ. ▶▶He is declared to be ~ "Emmanuel, ~ God with us." $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ God the Son, \sim in his full and complete deity, \sim stepped onto the historical scene \sim as a human being. ▶▶In the beginning ~ was the Word, ~~ and the Word ~ was with God, ~~ and the Word ~ was God. ~~ And the Word became flesh ~ and dwelt among us. ▶▶Jesus ~ is fully God. >>He's not some intermediary angel, ~ sharing deity. >> One mediator THE PHRASE, ~ "IN HIM" ~ IN VERSE 9 ~ IS EMPHATIC.

► We can read it this way. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ in Him ~ and in Him alone ~ the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily. 11 5/15

ALL THAT GOD IS ~ IN HIS ~ CHARACTER, ~ ATTRIBUTES, ~ POWER, ~ AND BEING, ~ this ~ is who Jesus is.

- ▶ When we think ~ of the infinite nature ~ of divine mercy, ~ grace, ~ and love, ~ it is found in all its fullness ~ in him.
- ►►Or ~ if we consider ~ the divine wrath, ~ justice, ~ and righteousness, ~ they are found without limit ~ in Jesus.

IN THE 12th CHAPTER OF HIS GOSPEL, \sim JOHN WRITES \sim THAT ISAIAH \sim SAW JESUS' glory.

- ► He was referring back ~ to Is. 6:1-3.
- ▶▶In the year that King Uzziah died ~ I saw the Lord ~ sitting upon a throne, ~~ high and lifted up; ~~ and the train of his robe ~ filled the temple. ~~ Above him ~ stood the seraphim. ~~ Each had six wings: ~~ with two he covered his face, ~~ and with two he covered his feet, ~~ and with two he flew. ~~ And one called to another ~ and said: ~~ "Holy, ~ holy, ~ holy ~ is the Lord of hosts; ~~ the whole earth is full of his glory!"
- ▶►This ~ is Jesus.

THE WRITER OF HEBREWS TELLS US ~ THAT ~ IN ORDER TO ACCOMPLISH OUR salvation, ~ he had to become human.

► Heb. 2:14-17 (CSB).

Now since the children have flesh and blood in common, ~ Jesus also shared in these, ~~ so that ~ through his death ~ he might destroy the one holding the power of death ~ that is, ~ the devil ~~ and free those who were held in slavery all their lives by the fear of death. \sim For it is clear ~ that he does not reach out to help angels, ~ but to help Abraham's offspring. \sim Therefore, ~ he had to be like his brothers and sisters ~ in every way, \sim so that ~ he could become a merciful and faithful high priest ~ in matters pertaining to God, \sim to make atonement for the sins of the people. 11 6/15

- ▶▶dwells here ~ means ~ permanently dwells.
- ▶▶Jesus ~ did not lay aside his humanity ~ when he ascended back to heaven.
- ▶▶He possesses ~ a glorified body to be sure, ~ but it is a real body.
- ▶▶After His resurrection, ~~ our Lord was careful to assure His disciples ~ that He was the same Person in the same body.
 - >>He was not ~ a ghost or a spirit.
- ▶▶There is a glorified Man in heaven! ~~ The God-Man, ~~ the Messiah, ~ Jesus, ~ the Lord.
- ▶▶But, ~ he still has the scars of crucifixion.
 - \triangleright Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, ~~ and place my finger into the mark of the nails, ~~ and place my hand into his side, ~~ I will never believe.
 - \triangleright Put your finger here, ~ and see my hands; ~~ and put out your hand, ~ and place it in my side. ~~ Do not disbelieve, ~ but believe.
 - \triangleright His scars ~ will be an eternal reminder to us ~ of the sacrifice of himself ~ he made on our behalf.

THE 2nd ASSERTION OF PAUL'S REBUTTAL.

VERSE 10a, ~~ AND YOU HAVE BEEN FILLED IN HIM.

▶▶This speaks of the sufficiency of Christ's work on the cross. 11 7/15

►► His sacrifice of himself ~ on the cross on our behalf ~ was ~ 100% ~ sufficient ~ to effect our salvation.

>>Need ~ no one and nothing else ~ to complete our salvation.

FURTHERMORE, ~ THE GREEK GRAMMAR INDICATES ~ 77

- ▶▶that ~ the work has been done ~ and the resulting condition continues.
- ▶►IOW, ~ there will ~ never ~ be a time ~ when we need something further for our salvation.
- ▶ The author of Hebrews, ~ in 10:18, says, ~ Where there is forgiveness of these, ~~ there is no longer ~ any offering for sin.
 - \triangleright I.e., ~ when sins have been forgiven, ~ which they have through Christ, ~ there is ~ no need ~ to offer any more sacrifices.
 - \triangleright The author of Hebrews tells us ~ that ~ But when Christ had offered for all time ~ a single sacrifice for sins, ~ he sat down at the right hand of God. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Twice
 - →→This signifies ~ that ~ the work was complete ~ and portrays his exalted position.
 - \rightarrow Earthly priests would stand and keep offering sacrifices. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Their work was never finished.
 - → → Jesus' sacrifice ~ was final and complete.

OUR UNDERSTANDING OF SALVATION ~ MAY GROW.

▶▶And the appropriation ~ of the blessings of salvation ~ may increase. 11 8/15

- ▶ But in Christ, ~ we have ~ the fullness of salvation. ▶▶And this goes on to cover every spiritual need we have. $\triangleright \triangleright E.g.$, ~ the grace we need ~ to sustain us in trials. >> The grace ~ to aid us in living the Christian life. >> And the wisdom ~ that is needful to guide us ~ in this present evil age. JESUS PAID IT ALL, ~~ NOT JUST SOME OF IT. ▶▶There is no need to turn ~ in addition ~ to ~ hollow and deceptive doctrines, ~ religious rituals, ~ or angels. ▶▶It is not ~ Christ plus something else. >>It is not ~ Christ plus baptism, ~~ or ~ Christ plus going to church, ~~ or ~ Christ plus church membership, ~ 77 → or ~ Christ plus giving money ~~ or ~ Christ plus good works. ▶▶It is not, ~ as I've noted before, ~ "Jesus paid ~ almost ~ all of it. >>No, ~ it's, ~~ "Jesus paid it all, ~ All to Him I owe; ~~ Sin had left a crimson stain, ~~ He washed it white as snow." ▶ But what about things like baptism, ~ attending church, ~ church membership, ~ giving money, ~ and good works?
 - \triangleright They are all the outflow of salvation. 11 9/15

 \triangleright E.g., ~ Eph. 2:10. \Rightarrow For we are his workmanship, ~ created in Christ Jesus ~ for good works, ~ which God prepared beforehand, ~ that we should walk in them.

WE SHOULD CONSIDER THIS AS WELL.

▶▶Millions of people today are trusting in their religion to get them into heaven.

>> They may think ~ that practicing their religion and its rituals ~ will get them into heaven.

 \triangleright They believe ~ that just because they were baptized ~ as an infant ~~ or as a child ~~ or as a teenager ~~ or as an adult ~ they are going to heaven.

 \triangleright They think that ~ church attendance ~ or receiving communion ~ will get them into heaven.

 \triangleright They think that \sim just because they are a member of a particular denomination or religion \sim that they're going to heaven. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ List could go on and on.

>>These things ~ will not get anyone into heaven.

→→These too ~ are hollow and deceptive doctrines.

 \rightarrow Only saving faith in Jesus Christ, \sim and in Jesus Christ alone, \sim will get a person into heaven.

▶▶We need to understand ~ two things ~ from this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ these people ~ who are trusting in their religion ~ and all that goes with it ~ are lost, ~ in bondage, ~ 77

→ and need the light of the true gospel of Jesus Christ, ~ to set them free. 11 10/15

 \triangleright The 2nd thing we need to understand ~ is this. ⇒⇒Satan ~ loves religion. → And he will give people ~ as much religion as they want, ~ as long ~ as it keeps them from Christ. >> So, ~ we need to do all we can ~ to bring the true gospel into their lives. THE 3rd ASSERTION OF PAUL'S REBUTTAL. VERSE 10b, ~ WHO ~ [I.E., ~ JESUS] ~ IS THE HEAD OF ALL RULE AND AUTHORITY. ▶▶Once again, ~ the spiritual realm ~ is in view. ▶ Earlier, ~ Paul had demons in view. >> And later he will have them in view again. >>And in those two places, ~ it's clear that demons are in view. ▶ Here though, ~ it's not so clear. ▶▶But I believe he may have angels in view and not demons. >>Remember, ~ angels were objects of worship ~ because of the belief ~ that their help was essential for salvation. ►► And Paul is setting the record straight ~ in this paragraph. 11/15

JESUS ~ WAS NOT JUST ONE OF MANY INTERMEDIARIES OR ANGELS ~ who must be worshiped, ~ as the heresy maintained.

- ▶▶Instead, ~ he is the head of every angelic being.
- \blacktriangleright Because Jesus is the head \sim and is superior to any angel or archangel, $\sim\sim$ it would be absurd \sim to worship any angel.
- ▶▶And no angel ~ would accept such worship.
 - >>E.g., ~ twice ~ John fell down at the feet of the angel who was speaking to him.
 - \rightarrow Perhaps he got too caught up in what he was witnessing as he recorded the book of Revelation.
 - →→Plus, ~ angels in their natural state ~ are probably awesome in sight.
 - >>Anyway, ~ the angel rebuked John.
 - → The angel referred to himself ~ as a fellow servant.
 - \rightarrow And told John to worship God.

THERE IS NO ~ ANGELIC POWER OR AUTHORITY ~ THAT CAN MATCH JESUS, ~ in any way, ~ shape, ~ or form.

- ▶▶There is no ~ angelic power or authority ~ that is independent of Jesus.
- ▶▶Jesus ~ is the Lord and Supreme Commander of heaven's armies. 11 12/15

AND THEY WORSHIP HIM.

► Rev. 5:11-12 (NIV).

>> Then I looked ~~ and heard the voice of many angels, ~~ numbering thousands upon thousands, ~~ and ten thousand times ten thousand. ~~ They encircled ~ the throne and the living creatures and the elders. ~~ In a loud voice ~ they were saying: ~~ "Worthy is the Lamb, ~ who was slain, ~ to receive ~ power ~ and wealth ~ and wisdom ~ and strength ~ and honor ~ and glory ~ and praise!"

NOW, ~ EVEN THOUGH PAUL DOES NOT MENTION THEM HERE, ~ we should not ~ leave demons out ~ of this discussion.

JESUS ~ IS SOVEREIGN OVER THEM AS WELL.

- ▶▶There is no demonic power or authority ~ that can rival Jesus. ⇒⇒ No cosmic dualism.
- ▶ None that is independent of him. ⇒⇒ Can only do what he allows.
- ▶► And terrified of Jesus.

PAUL WRITES IN EPH. 1:21, ~ 77

▶▶that Jesus ~ is ~~ far above ~ all rule and authority and power and dominion, ~~ and above ~ every name that is named, ~ not only in this age ~ but also in the one to come.

FIRST, \sim IN VERSE 21a, \sim PAUL SAYS THAT JESUS IS \sim "far above \sim all \sim rule \sim and authority \sim and power \sim and dominion \sim and every name that is named."

▶▶"above," ~ or "far above," ~ does not indicate distance.

 \triangleright The Greek word is a marker of superior status, ~ suggesting an additional factor of degree. 11 13/15

- → infinitely superior ~ to all ~ rule ~ and authority ~ and power ~ and dominion ~ and every name that is named, ~~ not only in this age ~ but also ~ in the coming one."
- ► Concerning the terms "rule and authority and power and dominion and every name named, ~ fallen angels, ~ or demons, ~ are in view here.
 - \triangleright Elsewhere, ~ when Paul speaks of many of these beings ~ he is referring ~ to hostile spiritual forces. (E.g., ~ 1 Cor. 15:24-25, ~ Eph. 6:12, ~ Col. 2:15)
 - → Therefore, ~ I take it to be the same here in Eph. 1:21.
 - >> And the terms Paul uses ~ seem to simply refer ~ to categories ~ of demonic beings.
 - → We must not get hung up ~ on the individual ~ terms and meanings.
 - \rightarrow Paul was not teaching a class on demons \sim but making a point about the infinite superiority of Jesus over them.
 - \rightarrow Furthermore, ~ although the terms may imply some form of order and hierarchy within the demonic realm, ~ 77
 - →→there is no way for us to determine what that is.
- ►► As far as the phrase "every name named," ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ rather than continuing to list every conceivable category, \sim Paul summarizes all of them with this phrase.
 - \triangleright And the point being ~ that no demonic being ~ has been excluded. 11 14/15

▶ Paul's overall point here ~ is that Jesus ~ is infinitely superior ~ to all of His, ~ and our, ~ spiritual enemies.

>>I.e., ~ Satan and his fellow fallen angels.

THEN IN VERSE 21b, \sim PAUL SAYS THAT JESUS \sim is infinitely superior \sim "not only in this age \sim but also in the coming one."

▶► Simply put, ~ Jesus will be ~ "infinitely superior to all rule and authority and power and dominion and every name that is named" ~ forever.

 \triangleright Paul emphasizes that Jesus is now ~ and always will be ~ infinitely superior ~ to Satan and all his fellow demons.

 \rightarrow Paul assures us ~ that ~ there will never be a time ~ when any demonic being, ~ Satan or otherwise, ~ 77

→ in any way ~ will threaten or rival ~ the absolute supremacy ~ of Jesus.

CONCLUSION.

AND, ~ WE SHOULD MENTION, ~ NEITHER ~ CAN ANY HUMAN ~ being, ~ government, ~ or army.
