### STAY FAITHFUL, PT. 4; COL. 2:11 (Ed O'Leary)

#### INTRODUCTION.

AT PRESENT, ~ WE ARE WORKING OUR WAY THROUGH ~ COL. 2:6-23.

►► As we've noted, ~ in this paragraph, ~ 77

>>>Paul lays down a series ~ of five exhortations, ~ calling believers ~ to stay faithful ~ and not buckle under ~ the pressure ~ of false teaching.

▶▶And again, ~ Paul expands on each one ~ with additional teaching.

AND WITHIN THIS LARGER CONTEXT, ~ THE PAST FEW TIMES WE HAVE BEEN zeroing in on ~ 77  $\,$ 

the second exhortation and its expansion, ~ verses 8-15.

►► As we have observed, ~ Paul spends the most time with the expansion of this exhortation.

SO FAR, ~ WE HAVE COVERED THE FOLLOWING IN THIS EXHORTATION AND ITS additional teaching.

▶ We examined ~ the second exhortation itself.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  Maintain a constant watch, ~ so that ~ no one takes you captive.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Again$ , ~ the imagery here ~ is that of false teachers ~ taking believers away from the true gospel ~ 11

 $\Rightarrow$  and into ~ the slavery of error. 11 1/14

▶ We have also looked at the means ~ by which false teachers attempt to capture believers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And i.e., ~ through hollow and deceptive doctrines, ~ which promise much, ~ but deliver nothing.

▶ Next, ~ we looked at the 2 sources of false teaching.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And i.e., ~ the human mind and demons.

►►And then, ~ as we know, ~ in verses 9-15, ~ Paul sets forth a rebuttal of the false teaching threatening these believers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 7$  assertions.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Last time, ~ we looked at the first three.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$ , ~ Paul reaffirmed ~ both ~ the deity and the humanity ~ of Jesus.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd},$  ~ Jesus' sacrifice of himself on the cross ~ was ~ 100% sufficient ~ to effect our salvation.

→ → Our salvation is complete.

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  We need ~ no one and nothing else ~ to complete it.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And 3<sup>rd</sup>, ~ there is no ~ angelic power or authority ~ that can match Jesus, ~ in any way, ~ shape, ~ or form.

 $\rightarrow$  There is no ~ angelic power or authority ~ that is independent of Jesus.

 $\rightarrow$  Jesus ~ is the Lord and Supreme Commander of heaven's armies. 11 2/14

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And although Paul did not mention it here, ~ he does elsewhere, ~ we noted that ~ 77

Jesus is, ~ and will be forever, ~ infinitely superior to all the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  There will never be a time ~ 77

 $\rightarrow$  when any demonic being, ~ Satan or otherwise, ~ in any way ~ will threaten or rival ~ the absolute supremacy ~ of Jesus.

 $\blacktriangleright$  And in closing we said, ~ that ~ neither will there ever be a time ~ 77

>>> when any human ~ being, ~ government, ~ or army ~ will threaten or rival the absolute supremacy of Jesus.

AND THAT LEAVES THE REMAINING FOUR ASSERTIONS ~ IN PAUL'S REBUTTAL.

►►Today, ~ no surprise, ~ we won't get very far ~ in Paul's assertions rebutting false teaching.

►►As I was working through the 4<sup>th</sup> assertion, ~ I kept thinking of more things to share.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And I just kept building on this.

 $\blacktriangleright$  So, ~ the 4<sup>th</sup> assertion ~ is as far as we're going this morning.

ALSO, ~ I THINK ~ YOU'LL NOTICE VERY QUICKLY ~ the somewhat ~ heavy theological content that comes with this assertion.

This is another reason ~ to spend our time today solely ~ on this  $4^{th}$  assertion. 11 3/14

## OK, ~ PAUL'S 4th ASSERTION ~ IN HIS REBUTTAL OF FALSE TEACHING.

VERSE 11.

▶▶In him also ~ you were circumcised ~ with a circumcision ~ made without hands, ~~ by ~ putting off the body of the flesh, ~ by ~ the circumcision of Christ.

►► The false teachers at Colosse ~ may have emphasized ~ the importance of Jewish circumcision.

>>Perhaps that it was necessary ~ in order to ~ complete or help bring about ~ salvation.

► As we noted at the beginning of our study of Colossians, ~~ the false teaching ~ contained a mixture ~ of Jewish ritual practices.

► False teachers in Galatia ~ had also urged physical circumcision. ⇒⇒ Trace Gal. 5:1-12.

▶ Paul's reply to the Colossians ~ was that ~ 77

DD they had already been circumcised, ~ even though most of the Christians there were Gentiles.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And this applies to all believers.

This circumcision ~ had not been a physical operation, ~ however, ~ for it had occurred ~ "without hands."

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$ , ~ it was not ~ a physical procedure.

▶ Paul is referring here ~ to ~ spiritual ~ circumcision. 11 4/14

▶▶That elsewhere ~ he called a circumcision of the heart.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Rom. 2:29a, ~ But a Jew is one inwardly, ~ and circumcision is a matter of the heart, ~ by the Spirit.

PAUL DEFINED IT ~ NOT ~ AS MERELY A REMOVAL OF A PORTION OF FLESH, ~ 77

but removal ~ of "the body of the flesh."

► Since we just indicated ~ that physical flesh and its removal ~ is not meant here, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  the reference ~ must be to flesh as a metaphor ~ for our sin nature.

▶ For your homework, ~ you can compare the similar use of "flesh" in Gal. 5:19-21.

► We also see it in Romans 7:18a.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  There Paul says, ~ For I know ~ that nothing good ~ dwells in me, ~~ that is, ~ in my flesh.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Sin nature.$ 

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  The NIV brings out the meaning quite well here.

→→For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature.

▶ This refers to our sinful nature ~~ and applies to all believers.

AND "THE BODY OF THE FLESH" ~ MEANS ~ THE ENTIRE "OLD SELF." 11 5/14

▶▶This removal ~ occurs at conversion ~ when the miracle of new birth ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  strips away ~ the old nature as the dominating force in our life, ~ and "the new self" is created.

► We see the description in Ezekiel.

⊳⊳Ezek. 36:26.

→ And I will give you a new heart, ~ and a new spirit I will put within you. ~~ 77

→ And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh ~~ [i.e., ~ a tender, ~ responsive heart]."

 $\triangleright$  This happens ~ when we accept Jesus as Savior and Lord.

 $\triangleright \triangleright At$  that moment, ~ God, ~ by His immeasurably great power, ~ 77

→ → removes our sin-hardened hearts, ~ gives us "a new heart," ~ and puts "a new spirit within" us.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  "a new heart" and "a new spirit," ~ which by instinct ~ wish ~ to please, ~ to live for, ~ and to serve God.

▶ Believers ~ are new persons ~ with brand new natures.

▷▷As Paul says in 2 Cor. 5:17, ~ 77

→→Therefore, ~ if anyone is in Christ, ~ he is a new creation. ~~ The old has passed away; ~~ behold, ~ the new has come. 11 6/14

RECALL PAUL'S DESCRIPTION IN EPHESIANS ~ OF OUR UNSAVED LIFE, ~ particularly regarding our sinful nature.

▶ When we were spiritually dead, ~ Paul said ~ that ~ 77

>>> we were dominated on a daily basis ~ by our sinful nature and its sinful desires.

▶▶In brief, ~ when we were spiritually dead, ~ we were slaves to our sinful nature and its sinful desires.

▶▶And he goes on to say ~ that we habitually ~ carried those sinful desires out.

WE WERE ENSLAVED, ~ BUT, ~ HERE'S THE GOOD NEWS, ~ MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS in Christ.

▶ But God, ~ being rich in mercy, ~~ because of the great love ~ with which he loved us, ~~ even ~ when we were dead in our trespasses, ~ made us alive together with Christ ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  by grace you have been saved. (Eph. 2:4-5)

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  We have been delivered from this slavery.

▶▶In Rom. 6:14, ~ Paul says, ~ "For sin will have no dominion over you, ~ since you are not under law but under grace."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Because we are now under God's grace, ~ neither sin ~ nor our sin nature and its sinful desires ~ is master over us any more.

And in Rom. 8:2, ~ Paul writes, ~ 77

DD "For the law of the Spirit of life ~ has set you free ~ in Christ Jesus ~ from the law of sin and death." 11 7/14

HOWEVER, ~ IN THIS LIFE, ~ WE STILL HAVE THE PRESENCE OF OUR SIN NATURE.

► So, ~ it is still possible ~ for believers ~ to allow themselves ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  to be dominated by the sinful nature and its sinful desires ~ and to carry out those desires.

►► And we must reject this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  The old life ~ has no business intruding ~ into the new life.

AS WE'LL SEE, ~ PAUL ADDRESSES THIS ISSUE AS IN COL. 3.

►► A preview.

▶ 3:5, ~ CSB ~~ Therefore, ~~ put to death ~ what belongs to your earthly nature.

► And then in verses 8-10, ~ CSB.

 $\triangleright$ But now, ~ put away ~ all ~ the following: ~~ anger, ~ wrath, ~ malice, ~ slander, ~ and filthy language ~ from your mouth. ~~ 77

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  Do not lie to one another, ~~ since you have put off the old self with its practices ~~ and have put on the new self. ~~ 77

→ → You are being renewed ~ in knowledge according ~ to the image of your Creator.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Now}$ , ~ this is not a comprehensive list.  $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow \mathsf{Representative list}$ .

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  things like these. 11 8/14

OVER IN EPH. 4:24a, ~ Paul says ~ THAT BELIEVERS ARE TAUGHT ~ "TO PUT ON THE NEW self."

▶▶Again, ~ believers ~ are new persons ~ with brand new natures.

▶ And Paul is saying here ~ that believers are taught ~ to be that new person, ~ to live as that new person, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  and to be guided by that new nature, ~ which by instinct desires to please, ~ to live for, ~ and to serve Jesus.

► My . . ., ~~ the old life ~ must go.

AND PETER ADDRESSES THIS ISSUE AS WELL ~ IN 1 PET. 1:14.

► He writes, ~ "As obedient children, ~ do not be conformed to the passions of your <u>former</u> <u>ignorance</u> ~ [refers unsaved life]."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And the implication ~ is that ~ it is possible ~ for us to still ~~ be conformed to the passions of [our] former ignorance."

▶ When Peter commands this, ~ he is issuing a call to believers ~ to totally ~ leave our unsaved way of life, ~ 77

DD including our thought processes and attitudes ~ behind.

#### A CALL PETER REPEATS IN 4:3.

► For the time that is past suffices for doing what the Gentiles [unbelievers] want to do, [then gives examples] ~~ living in sensuality, ~ passions, ~ drunkenness, ~ orgies, ~ drinking parties, ~ and lawless idolatry. 11 9/14 ▶ ▶ Peter declares, ~ "Don't involve yourselves ~ in the things you did in your unsaved life."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  "You have had enough in your past life ~ of the evil things ~ that non-Christians desire."

▶ Basically, ~ Peter is saying, ~ "Enough already, ~ Put sin in your rearview mirror."

▶ Peter is driving the point home ~ that the past is the past.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It is over and done with.

► There must be no going back ~ to the things we were involved in before we came to Christ.

▶ There must be a complete break ~ with every part ~ of our unsaved lifestyle.

## AFTER THE EXODUS, ~ THE ISRAELITES WERE OFTEN TEMPTED TO RETURN TO EGYPT

►► So we might be tempted to return to our unsaved lifestyle.

▶ However, ~ both Peter and Paul clearly warn us ~ that ~ that ~ is not a valid option for us.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  We are not to look back ~ but rather forward.

► As the author of Hebrews says in 12: ~ 1-2a CSB, ~ "let us lay aside every hindrance."

>>"every hindrance" ~ refers to hindrances ~ which may not be sinful in themselves ~ 77

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  but ~ which would prevent or hinder ~ our spiritual growth. 11 10/14

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  The author of Hebrews tells us, ~ 77

→→Therefore, since we also have such a large cloud of witnesses surrounding us, let us lay aside every hindrance and the sin ~ [in general] ~ that so easily ensnares us. ~~ 77

 $\rightarrow$  -Let us run with endurance the race that lies before us, ~ keeping our eyes on Jesus, ~ the source and perfecter of our faith.

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  When Jesus walked on water ....

 $\rightarrow$  But when he saw the strength of the wind, ~ he was afraid, ~~ and beginning to sink ~ he cried out, ~~ "Lord, ~ save me!" (CSB)

COMING BACK TO COLOSSIANS, ~ 77

▶ Paul further explains this spiritual circumcision ~ as occurring ~ "by the circumcision of Christ."

▶ This refers ~ to the spiritual circumcision ~ that Christ performs.

►► And is another name for regeneration.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I.e.$ , ~ the work of God ~ in which he imparts new spiritual life ~ to the believing sinner, ~ effecting the new birth.

 $\triangleright$  That ~ it is another name for regeneration ~ seems clear ~ from the fact ~ 77

++ that ~ 2:13 indicates ~ uncircumcision to be ~ the state of spiritual death.

 $\blacktriangleright$  Spiritual circumcision must therefore refer ~ to the imparting of spiritual life. 11 11/14

▶▶It is Christ's act that is in view, ~ not the physical rite imposed by the Mosaic legislation.

PHYSICAL CIRCUMCISION ~ WAS A SIGN ~ OF GOD'S COVENANT WITH THE JEWISH people.

>>Though it was a physical operation, ~~ it had a spiritual significance.

 $\triangleright$  The trouble was ~ that the Jewish people depended on ~ the physical ~ and not the spiritual.

 $\triangleright \triangleright A$  mere physical operation can never ~ convey spiritual grace.

>>Often in the Old Testament, ~~ God warned His people ~ to turn from their sins ~ and experience a spiritual circumcision of the heart.

 $\rightarrow$  E.g., ~ Deut. 10:16 ~ CSB. ~~ Therefore, ~ circumcise your hearts ~ and don't be stiff-necked any longer.

▶▶People make the same mistake today ~ when they depend on some religious ritual to save them, ~~ such as baptism.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Baptism is the symbol ~ of what has already occurred in the heart and life ~ of one who has trusted Christ as Savior and Lord.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It is simply a declaration of salvation.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  To attach saving significance to baptism ~ is an attack ~ on the sufficiency of the work of Jesus on the cross.

AS WE OBSERVED LAST WEEK, ~ MILLIONS OF PEOPLE TODAY ~ are trusting in their religion ~ to get them into heaven. 11 12/14

▶ They may think ~ that practicing their religion and its rituals ~ will get them into heaven.

▶ These things ~ will not get anyone into heaven.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  These too ~ are hollow and deceptive doctrines.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Only saving faith in Jesus Christ, ~ and in Jesus Christ alone, ~ will get a person into heaven.

CONCLUSION.

# OK, ~ LET'S BRING THIS HOME.

► Paul's 4<sup>th</sup> assertion.

▶ This is the truth of the matter.

 $\blacktriangleright$  At conversion, ~ our old nature ~ 77

Das the dominating force in our life ~ was stripped away ~ and the new self was created.

 $\triangleright \triangleright A$  finished act.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  We need to do nothing else.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  There are no religious rituals needed ~ to complete this act ~ or to help create this new self. 13/14

►►And Paul makes it very clear ~ that ~ it was Jesus who brought this spiritual circumcision about.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Being}$  a spiritual circumcision ~ there is no way ~~ any of us could have brought this about.

 $\rightarrow$   $\rightarrow$  Or ~ even helped ~ to bring this about.

▶ My ..., ~ believe no teaching ~ that says otherwise.
