>>TPID, ~ general rules ~ governing ~ a believer's relationships.

→→Obviously not all. ⇒⇒ Some specific groupings

PAUL ALSO COVERS PRINCIPLES FOR RELATIONSHIPS ~ IN EPH. 5:21 - 6:9.

- ▶▶He deals with the same groups ~ except for one.
- ▶▶In Eph., ~ also deals ~ with relationships between ~ believers in general. ⇒⇒ Not Col.

AND THERE ARE OTHER DIFFERENCES ~ IN THE TWO SECTIONS.

 \blacktriangleright Gives more details in Eph.

IN ORDER FOR US $^{\sim}$ to get the fullest picture possible $^{\sim}$ of the precepts $^{\sim}$ governing these relationships, $^{\sim}$ 77

we're going ~ to combine the two sections, ~ and go back and forth.

 \triangleright Today, ~ we'll look at Paul's commands ~ to believers in general ~ & to wives.

⇒⇒1 for general, ~ mutual submission. ⇒⇒ 2 for wives, ~~ submit, ~ respect. 11 1/14

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- ► Submit ~ to one another.
- ► Submitting to one another means ~ 77
 - Dhaving a mindset ~ of being ~ meek, ~ gentle, ~ and humble ~ toward one another.
- ▶▶It consists ~ of a willingness to respect and honor ~ the needs of other believers, ~ 77
 - Deven giving them precedence ~ over our own needs.
- ▶▶It also involves ~ a willingness ~ to serve, ~ to learn from, ~ and ~ to be corrected ~ 77
 - DD by any other believer.
- ▶▶By nature, ~ I believe we are hard-wired ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ to ~ promote ourselves, ~~ to ~ build ourselves up, ~~ to ~ look out primarily for ourselves.
- ▶ But ~ in the family of God, ~ that's ~ not the way ~ it's supposed to be.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ Jesus ~ makes this ~ quite clear.

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→ → Mk. 10:42-44 . . . . 11 2/14
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- ▶►how important ~ this mutual submission by believers is ~~ and how much ~ Jesus wants us ~ to practice it.
- ▶▶In the context of how believers are to treat one another, ~ Peter, ~ in 1 Pet. 3:8, ~ writes, ~ 77

>> "Finally, ~ all of you, ~ have ~ unity of mind, ~ sympathy, ~ brotherly love, ~ a tender heart, ~ and ~ a humble mind."

 \triangleright Basically, \sim Peter is calling us \sim to live in harmony \sim and \sim to be united \sim in purpose and attitude \sim with our fellow believers.

 \triangleright He is telling us ~ to share the feelings of our brothers and sisters in Christ, ~ 77

→whether these feelings are ~ joyful ~ or ~ painful.

 \rightarrow As Paul exhorts us ~ in Rom. 12:15, ~~ Rejoice ~ with those who rejoice, ~~ weep ~ with those who weep.

 \triangleright (Back) ~ He's exhorting us ~ to love our fellow believers ~ with Christ-like love.

 \triangleright \vdash He is calling us to be deeply touched ~ and moved ~ by ~ 77

 \rightarrow the hurts, \sim pain, \sim needs, \sim and adversity of fellow believers \sim and then act \sim to alleviate them.

→ Compassionate hearts ⇒ Crowd ~ Nain ~ Samaritan

 \triangleright And Peter ~ is urging us ~ to be humble ~ toward our fellow believers. 11 3/14

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▶▶The importance ~ of mutual submission ~ is also observed ~ Rom. 12:10 (NIV) ~ 77
    DDBe devoted ~ to one another in love. ~~ Honor one another ~ above yourselves.
    >>Paul is calling us here ~~ to love one another ~ warmly and genuinely, ~ 77
        → to be eager and to take delight ~ in honoring other believers, ~~ 77
           → and ~ to give them more respect ~ than we give ourselves.
 ▶▶And the importance ~ of mutual submission by believers ~ is clearly seen ~ in Gal. 5: ~ 13.
    → For you were called to freedom, ~ brothers. ~ Only ~ do not use your freedom ~ as an
    opportunity for the flesh, ~~ but through love ~ serve ~ one another.
OF COURSE, ~ WHEN IT COMES TO SUBMISSION, ~ JESUS ~ has set the example for us.
 ▶►Mk. 10:45 ⇒⇒ For even the Son of Man ~ came not ~ to be served ~~ but ~ to serve, ~~
 and ~ to give his life ~ as a ransom for many.
 ▶▶We see His servanthood ~ when He washed the disciples' feet ~ in the upper room ~ the
 night He was betrayed.
    ⊳⊳Jn. 13:3-5 . . . .
 ▶▶And of course, ~ the most powerful demonstration ~ of Jesus' servanthood was ~ 77
    Dwhen "he humbled himself ~~ by becoming obedient ~ to the point of death, ~~ even
    death on a cross." 11 4/14
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- ▶▶and ~ how much God ~ wants us to practice it.
 - → → And we also see ~ whose example of servanthood ~ we are to follow.
- IN VERSE 21b, ~ PAUL SAYS ~ THAT IT'S ~ "OUT OF REVERENCE FOR CHRIST" ~ 77
 - ▶▶that we ~ are to ~ "Submit to one another."
 - ▶▶The idea here ~ seems to be ~ that ~ believers' respect for Jesus ~ will lead us ~ 77
 - DD to submit ~ to one another.
 - ▶▶When we ~ truly ~ respect someone, ~ we care ~ about pleasing them.
 - >>And we don't want ~ to disappoint them.
 - → And mutual submission ~ between believers ~ is pleasing to Jesus.
- NOW LET'S TURN ~ TO THE FIRST ~ OF THE TWO PRECEPTS FOR A WIFE ~ in relation to her husband.
- COL. 3: ~ 18a, ~~ WIVES, ~ SUBMIT TO YOUR HUSBANDS. (Wives who are believers)
 - ► The Greek verb for "submit" ~ means ~ to voluntarily place yourself ~ under another person.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ And, ~ as we'll see, ~ it is dealing with the leadership role of the husband. 11 5/14

▶▶In the NT, ~ the verb "submit" ~ is consistently used ~ for subordination ~ to an authority figure.

 \triangleright It can be used, ~~ e.g., ~ 77

to denote subordination to ~ older people, ~ one's parents, ~ governing authorities, ~ and local church leaders.

▶▶Basically, ~ Paul is calling wives ~ to voluntarily ~ recognize, ~ accept, ~ and yield ~ 77

>> to the authority and leadership ~ of their husbands.

WE'LL EXPLORE THIS FURTHER ~ AS WE GO.

- ▶▶But at this point, ~ it might be good ~ to point out the following
- $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright 1^{st}$, ~ Paul's apostolic injunction ~ does <u>not</u> imply ~ the inferiority ~ of the wife.

 \triangleright It is a case ~ of <u>voluntary</u> submission ~ in recognition ~ of the God-appointed authority and leadership ~ of the husband.

- ▶▶Furthermore, ~ the term, ~ submit, ~ does not suggest slavery or servitude.
- ▶▶Also, ~ it certainly ~ never calls for the husband ~ to make his wife submit.

 \triangleright If he could, ~ her heart ~ would not be in it. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ The Lord wants

>>Besides, ~ Paul addressed wives here, ~ not husbands.

⇒⇒It's ~ Wives, ~ submit yourselves ~ to your husbands. 11 6/14

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►►And, ~ in this context, ~ 77
    >> the word, ~ submit, ~ differs radically ~ from the word ~ 77
        → which describes the role ~ of children and slaves ~ who are to obey.
           → Verse ~ 20a, ~ Children, ~ obey ~ your parents.
           → And verse 22a, ~ Bondservants, ~ obey in everything ~ those ~ who are your
           earthly masters
NOW, ~ BETWEEN COL. AND EPH., ~ PAUL GIVES ~ THREE REASONS ~ FOR THIS
submission
 ▶▶1st, ~ in Col. 3:~ 18b; ~~ 18a Wives, ~ submit to your husbands, ~~ 18b as is fitting ~ in the
 Lord.
    >> The phrase, ~ "as is fitting in the Lord," ~ denotes ~ a sense ~ of propriety.
       → The resulting sense is therefore: ~~ ~ 77
           → submit ~ in a manner ~ that is appropriate ~ for those ~ who are in the Lord.
              → ¬I.e., ~ believers.
        → Paul is saying, ~ 77
           →→Wives, ~ willingly ~ recognizing, ~ accepting, ~ and ~ yielding ~ to the authority
           and leadership ~ of your husbands ~ 77
              \rightarrow is fitting behavior ~ for those who belong ~ to the Lord. 11 7/14
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>>Understood in this way, ~ and we'll get more into this as well, ~ 77
      → this clause ~ points to Jesus ~ as the pattern ~ of humility and submission.
▶ The 2^{nd} reason ~ for this submission.
   ▷▷In Eph. 5: ~ 22b, ~ Paul says ~ that this submission ~ is to be ~ "as to the Lord."
   >> This does not mean ~ that the wife ~ is to treat her husband ~ as though ~ he were
   the Lord.
   >>Neither ~ is it ~ an arbitrary capitulation ~ to a husband's will.
   >>Rather, ~ what Paul is saying ~ is that ~ this submission ~ is a means ~ of honoring the
  Lord. ⇒⇒ Submission = God-honoring behavior.
▶▶In Eph. 5: ~ 23a, ~ Paul gives ~ the third reason ~ wives are to submit to their husbands.
   DDFor the husband is the head of the wife. ⇒⇒ More time than the first two.
   >>Now, ~ Paul is not saying ~ women ~ 77
      →are second-class citizens ~ or ~ inferior to men, ~~ or ~ that our wives ~ are our
      slaves.
   \trianglerightPaul is saying ~ that God ~ has set up a leadership structure ~ in marriage.
      → And the husband, ~ not the wife, ~ 77
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→ is the God-ordained leader ~ of the marriage. 11 8/14

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>> Wives who are believers ~ enjoy all ~ the privileges, ~ obligations, ~ and inheritance
rights ~ of God's children.
   ⇒ In Gal. 3:28, ~ Paul writes, ~ 77
       →→"There is neither ~ Jew nor Greek, ~~ there is neither ~ slave nor free, ~~
      there is no ~ male and female, ~~ for you are all ~ one ~ in Christ Jesus."
      → Being citizens of heaven ~ makes us all ~ united and equal.
      →→In God's kingdom ~ there is no spiritual ~ superiority ~ or inferiority.
      → A man ~ is not more accepted in Christ ~ than a woman, ~ 77
          → nor is the Jew ~ more justified ~ than the Gentile.
      → → All citizens of heaven ~ share the same standing ~ before God.
>> But God has set up leadership structures.
   \triangleright \triangleright In the church . . . .
   >>In relation to parents and children ....
   \triangleright \triangleright And in marriage . . . .
      → And God calls upon wives ~ 77
          → to willingly ~ recognize, ~ accept, ~ and yield ~ to the authority and
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leadership ~ of their husbands. 11 9/14

NOW, \sim OBVIOUSLY, \sim THE SOCIETY IN WHICH WE LIVE \sim does not look favorably \sim on this doctrine.

- ▶▶But ~ we ~ do not get our marching orders ~ from society.
- ▶▶Our marching orders ~ come ~ from Scripture.

>> As Acts 5: ~ 29 says, ~~ But Peter and the apostles answered, ~~ "We must obey God ~ rather ~ than men."

THIS IDEA OF SUBMISSION ~ IS EVIDENT ~ IN JESUS' SUBMISSION ~ to his parents.

▶▶Lk. 2: ~ 51 says ~ that Jesus ~ 77

▶ The sovereign creator of the universe, ~ the eternal Son of God, ~ the Second Person of the Trinity, ~ 77

→ recognized, ~ accepted, ~ and yielded Himself to the authority and leadership of His parents.

ALSO EVIDENT IN HIS SUBMISSION THE FATHER.

▶▶John 5:30.

 \triangleright I can do nothing on my own. ~~ As I hear, ~ I judge, ~~ and my judgment is just, ~~ because ~ I seek not my own will ~ but the will ~ of him who sent me. 11 10/14

 \triangleright Consequently, \sim when Christ came into the world, \sim he said, \sim "Sacrifices and offerings \sim you have not desired, \sim but a body \sim have you prepared for me; \sim in burnt offerings and sin offerings \sim you have taken no pleasure. \sim Then I said, \sim 'Behold, \sim I have come \sim to do your will, \sim O God, \sim as it is written of me \sim in the scroll \sim of the book."

▶▶And of course, ~ Jesus' prayer in the garden, ~ LK. 22:42.

>> Father, ~ if you are willing, ~ remove this cup from me. ~~ Nevertheless, ~ not my will, ~ but yours, ~ be done.

ACROSS THE BOARD, ~ BELIEVERS ARE TO FOLLOW ~ JESUS' EXAMPLE.

- ► We are to submit ~~ to ~ church leadership, ~~ to ~ human government, ~~ and ~~ to ~ our employer.
- ▶▶Children ~ are to submit ~ to their parents.
- ►► And wives ~ are to submit ~ to their husbands. ⇒⇒Lord's leadership structure, not man's.

MOVING ON, ~ WE SEE ~ IN EPH. 5: ~ 23b, ~ 77

THAT PAUL COMPARES ~ THE HUSBAND'S LEADERSHIP ~ OF THE MARRIAGE ~ WITH Jesus' leadership ~ of the church.

▶▶For context, ~ start at 23a.

 \triangleright "For the husband ~ is the head of the wife ~ even as Christ ~ is the head of the church, ~ his body, ~ and is himself ~ its Savior." 11/14

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► Here Paul qualifies the husband's authority and leadership ~ 77
    by describing his headship ~ as patterned after Christ's headship over the church.
 ▶▶Jesus' headship over the church ~ is expressed ~ by ~ his loving it ~ and giving his life for
 it.
WE, ~ HUSBANDS, ~ ARE TO LEAD OUR WIVES ~ LIKE JESUS DOES THE CHURCH.
 ►► And how . . .?
    >>Lovingly and sacrificially.
 ▶▶Whoa, ~ that's ~ a pretty tall order ~ and heavy responsibility, ~ isn't it guys?
 ▶▶And I've got new for us. \Rightarrow \Rightarrow Guys if we do this . . . ~ our wives . . . .
IN EPH. 5: ~ 24, ~ PAUL NOTES THAT ~ THE CHURCH'S SUBMISSION TO CHRIST ~ 77
SHOULD BE REPLICATED ~ IN THE SUBMISSION OF WIVES ~ TO THEIR HUSBANDS.
 Now ~ as the church submits to Christ, ~~ so also wives ~ should submit in everything ~ to
 their husbands.
 ▶▶Genuine believers ~ willingly ~ recognize, ~ accept, ~ and yield ~ to Jesus' authority and
 leadership.
    >> And Paul says ~ that this willing submissiveness ~ should be reproduced ~ 77
        →in the submission ~ of wives to their husbands. 11 12/14
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- ▶▶ the prevailing tendency ~ of the wife toward her husband.
- ▶▶It means ~ that a wife ~ should cultivate an attitude of ~ 77
 - Daffirming, ~ supporting, ~ & respecting ~ her husband's authority and leadership, ~ 77
 - without holding back certain areas ~ where she wants ~ to assert or maintain control.

NOW, ~ WE SHOULD POINT OUT ~ THAT ~ THE PHRASE ~ "IN EVERYTHING" ~ is restricted ~ as to ~ degree. ⇒⇒ Three examples.

- $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ just like with our submission to ~ the government ~ or employers ~ or even church leaders, ~ 77
 - Dethere is a limit ~ to a wife's submission to her husband.
 - >>Peter and the other apostles set the precedent. ⇒⇒ Acts 5:27-29
 - \triangleright If government., ~ employers, ~ or even church leaders, ~ demand we do something that would cause us to violate God's word
 - >> The same principle applies to marriage.
 - $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ If a husband ~ demands ~ that his wife do something ~ that would cause her to violate God's word, ~ 77
 - → she is to obey God. 11 13/14

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\triangleright2<sup>nd</sup>, ~ "in everything" ~ does not mean ~ that the wife ~ has to endorse ~ her husband's foolish decisions, ~ or ~ 77
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DD to show unquestioned acceptance ~ of everything ~ her husband does.

▶▶And 3^{rd} , ~ <u>nowhere</u> does Paul suggest ~ that ~ submission of a wife to her husband ~ "in everything" ~ 77

Drequires the wife ~ to be silent ~ in the face of abuse, ~ physical or otherwise.

>>Abuse ~ requires ~ outside help.

 \rightarrow And no wife ~ should ever imagine ~ that ~ resisting abuse ~ violates ~ Paul's command.

NOW LET'S VERY BRIEFLY LOOK AT THE ~ 2nd precept ~ for a wife in relation ~ to husband.

EPH. 5:33b, ~ AND LET THE WIFE SEE ~ THAT SHE ~ RESPECTS ~ HER HUSBAND.

▶▶Pretty self-explanatory ~ except for this.

>> And I think ~ this is all we need to add here.

 \rightarrow Paul is not thinking \sim of the kind of respect \sim that is earned, \sim but a respect \sim based on \sim one's position.

▶▶IOW, ~ then, ~ the way I see it, ~ is that Paul ~ is calling upon wives ~ to respect ~ 77

Dthe God-ordained leadership ~ of their husbands.

Focus on God & relationship w/ Him. ⇒⇒ When right w/ God Pray 11 14/14
