► Believers in general. ⇒ Submit

 \triangleright Submitting to one another means ~ having a mindset ~ of being ~ meek, ~ gentle, ~ and humble ~ toward one another.

 \triangleright It consists ~ of a willingness to respect and honor ~ the needs of other believers ~~ even giving them precedence ~ over our own needs.

 \triangleright It also involves ~ a willingness ~ to serve, ~ to learn from, ~ and ~ to be corrected ~ by any other believer.

▶ Wife/husband.

 \triangleright The Christian wife \sim is called upon \sim to \sim voluntarily \sim recognize, \sim accept, \sim respect, \sim and yield to, \sim 77

→ the ~ God-given ~ authority and leadership ~ of her husband. 11/15

▶► Husband/wife.

 \triangleright Christian husbands ~ do not have ~ complete freedom ~ to act as they ~ wish ~ or ~ think best.

 \rightarrow On the contrary, \sim we husbands \sim are commanded \sim to exercise \sim our authority and leadership \sim within the parameters \sim that God has set up.

 \triangleright The God-given authority and leadership ~ that a Christian husband ~ rightly exhibits in marriage ~ 77

 \rightarrow is \sim not \sim to be carried out \sim harshly or selfishly, \sim but \sim lovingly, \sim and graciously.

 \rightarrow And it is <u>not</u> ~ to be exercised ~ in a domineering manner.

>> When we boil it all down, ~ the command alone, ~ actually says it all.

 \rightarrow Christian husband, ~ love your wife, ~ just as Jesus ~ loved the church. ~~ He ~ gave up his life ~ for her. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Up to speed on main points.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So, ~ today ~ stay on the theme ~ of precepts for wives and husbands.

<u>1 PETER. ~ 3: ~ 1-4, ~ & ~ 7.</u>

► Two ~ for Christian wives. ⇒ And two ~ for Christian husbands.

>>Following Peter's layout, ~ we'll look at the precepts for wives ~ first.

THE FIRST PRECEPT ~ SHOULD SOUND QUITE FAMILIAR.

1 PETER ~ 3: ~ 1a.

▶▶Peter calls on the Christian wife, ~ to submit to her husband.

SINCE WE'VE THOROUGHLY EXAMINED THIS, ~ I'LL JUST SAY A COUPLE OF THINGS ~ in review.

▶▶ 1^{st} , ~ like Paul, ~ Peter ~ is basically ~ calling each Christian wife ~ to voluntarily ~ recognize, ~ accept, ~ and yield ~ 77

DD to ~ the God-given ~ authority and leadership ~ of her husband.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd}$, ~ here in our review, ~ & this bears repeating ~ because it's so extremely important.

DDA Christian wife's submission to her husband ~ is restricted as to degree. ⇒⇒ 3 ways.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow 1^{st}$, ~ if a husband ~ demands ~ that his wife do something ~ 77

→→that would cause her to violate God's word, ~ she is to obey God.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow 2nd, ~ submission does not mean ~ that the wife ~ has to endorse ~ her husband's foolish decisions, ~ or ~ 77

→→to show unquestioned acceptance ~ of everything ~ her husband does. 11 3/15

- \rightarrow And 3rd, \sim <u>nowhere</u> \sim does Paul suggest \sim that \sim submission of a wife to her husband \sim 7.7
 - → requires the wife ~ to be silent ~ in the face of abuse, ~ physical or otherwise.
 - → → Abuse ~ requires ~ outside help.
 - \rightarrow And no wife ~ should ever imagine ~ that ~ resisting abuse ~ violates ~ Paul's command.

THEN IN 1 PETER ~ 3: ~~ 1b-2, ~ PETER EXPANDS ON THE COMMAND TO WIVES.

HE TURNS ~ TO A CHRISTIAN WIFE ~ SUBMITTING TO HER HUSBAND ~ 77

▶▶in a situation ~ in which ~ the husband ~ is not a believer.

DDIOW, ~ the precept ~ still applies.

- ▶ The phrase ~ do not obey the word ~ is just another way ~ of referring ~ to an unbeliever.
- ▶ Right off the top, ~ what Peter says here ~ shows us that ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ even unsaved husbands \sim have \sim the God-given authority and leadership role \sim in the marriage.

PETER'S POINT HERE ~ IS AN ~ EVANGELISTIC ONE. 11 4/15

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▶ Back in ~ 1 Pet. ~ 2: ~ 12, ~ Peter links ~ our conduct ~ with ~ our evangelism.
    >> Keep your conduct ~ among the Gentiles ~ honorable, ~ so that ~ when they speak
    against you ~ as evildoers, ~ 77
        → they may see ~ your good deeds ~ and glorify God ~ on the day of visitation.
    >>Peter's primary idea here ~ was that ~ in the midst ~ of people speaking against us "as
    doing evil," ~ 77
        → some unbelievers ~ will come to Christ ~ through the witness ~ of our honorable
       lifestyle.
    \triangleright \triangleright So, ~ our lifestyle ~ is an important feature ~ in ~ our evangelism.
 ▶▶And the same is true ~ for a Christian wife ~ who is married to an unbeliever.
 ▶ Peter says, ~ so that ~ even if some ~ do not obey the word, ~ they may be won ~ without
 a word ~ by the conduct ~ of their wives, ~ 77
    Dwhen they see ~ your respectful and pure conduct.
>>In the immediate context, ~ "conduct" ~ refers ~ to the wife being submissive ~ to her
husband.
        ⇒⇒But the application is much wider.
           → → "Conduct," ~ since it's a more general term than ~ "submit," ~ implies ~ 77
               → that the wife's overall behavior ~ is an important factor ~ in attempting ~
              to lead her husband to the Lord. 11 5/15
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>> And by using the phrase "respectful and pure conduct," ~ 77
       →Peter is identifying ~ that the type of conduct he's talking about ~ is behavior ~
      that glorifies God.
▶▶So more specifically, ~ Peter is saying ~ that the wife's ~ godly behavior ~ which includes
~ her willing submission ~ 77
   DD is an important factor ~ in attempting ~ to lead her husband to Jesus.
▶Now, ~ I don't believe that Peter is telling wives, ~ or all believers in general, ~ as per
2:12, ~ 77
   \triangleright \triangleright to never ~ verbally ~ share the gospel.
   ⊳⊳Rom. 10:17 (CSB).
      ⇒⇒So faith ~ comes from ~ what is heard, ~~ and what is heard ~ comes ~ through the
      message ~ about Christ.
   >> So Peter ~ is not telling believers ~ to never ~ verbally ~ share the gospel.
      → I believe Peter ~ may have been using ~ hyperbole.
         \rightarrow \rightarrow I.e., ~ he was exaggerating ~ for the sake of effect.
      → He's emphasizing, ~ in two places in his first epistle, ~ just how effective ~ 77
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 \rightarrow a life ~ that glorifies God ~ can be ~ evangelistically. 11 6/15

 $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ A wife's ~ respectful, ~ pure, ~ and submissive behavior ~ may just lead her unsaved husband ~ 77

DD to inquire ~ as to what ~ inspires this conduct.

 \rightarrow And thus ~ opening the door ~ for her ~ to share the gospel.

 \blacktriangleright And, ~ of course, ~ what we have been saying ~ would apply ~ equally as well ~ to a Christian husband ~ 77

Dwho is married ~ to an unbelieving wife.

IN 1 PETER ~ 3: ~~ 3-4, ~ WE FIND PETER'S 2nd PRECEPT ~ FOR CHRISTIAN WIVES.

FIRST, ~ THE PRECEPT, ~ VERSE 3.

- ▶ Do not ~ let your adorning ~ be external ~~ the braiding of hair ~ and the putting on of gold jewelry, ~ or the clothing you wear
- ▶▶It is ~ extremely important ~ to understand here ~ what Peter is <u>not</u> saying.
- ▶ Peter is <u>not</u> saying ~ wives cannot ~ have nice hairdos ~ or wear expensive jewelry ~ or expensive clothes.
 - \triangleright He's simply using them ~ to point out, ~ by way of contrast, ~ what's more important.
 - \triangleright Peter's point ~ is that ~ the development of ~ <u>inner</u> ~ character ~ 77
 - →matters ~ 100% more ~ than ~ outward ~ appearance. 11 7/15

▶▶It is also extremely important to understand, ~ that ~ 77

Dwhile Peter is speaking ~ specifically ~ to wives, ~ the application ~ is much wider.

 \triangleright The command ~ to focus more ~ on the development ~ of proper inner character ~ 77

→ than outward appearance ~ applies ~ to all believers, ~ whether ~ male or female, ~ single or married.

▶ Jesus slammed the scribes and Pharisees ~ for focusing on the external ~ and neglecting the internal, ~ 77

Dwhich shows us ~ the importance ~ of developing ~ proper ~ inner character.

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→ → Matt. ~ 23: ~ 27-28 . . . .
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►► And God's words to Samuel ~ make it very clear ~ that ~ the inside ~ is more important ~ than ~ the outside.

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⊳ 1 Sam. 16:6-7 . . . .
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THEN ~ IN ~ 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 4, ~ PETER DEFINES ~ 77

▶▶this proper inner character that ~ is to be developed, ~ not just by wives, ~ but by all believers.

▶ But let your adorning ~ be the hidden person ~ of the heart ~ [i.e., ~ your beauty ~ should come ~ from inside you] ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ with the imperishable beauty ~ of a gentle and quiet spirit. 11 8/15

 $\gt\gt$ "gentle" ~ means ~ showing humility, ~~ consideration of others, ~~ not insisting on one's own rights, ~~ not being pushy or overly assertive.

 \triangleright "quiet" ~ refers ~ to inner character ~ that calmly bears disturbances ~ created by others ~ 77

→ and ~ that does not ~ create trouble.

▶▶Simply put, ~ Peter is calling on wives, ~ and by application ~ all believers, ~ 77

→→In Matt. ~ 11: ~ 29, ~ Jesus described Himself as ~ "gentle and humble in heart."

NOTICE ~ HERE IN 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 4, ~ THAT ~ PETER REFERS ~ to Christ-like character ~ as ~ "imperishable."

- ▶▶In contrast, ~ clothing, ~ jewelry, ~ and our bodies ~ <u>are</u> ~ perishable.
- ▶ Peter here ~ is giving a specific example ~ of a general principle ~ stated by Paul ~ in 2 Cor. ~ 4: ~ 18 (NIV).

 \triangleright So we fix our eyes \sim not \sim on what is seen, \sim but \sim on what is unseen, \sim since what is seen \sim is temporary, \sim but \sim what is unseen \sim is eternal.

 $\triangleright \triangleright G$ reek word for temporary \sim pertains \sim to \sim a relatively short period of time, \sim with emphasis \sim upon the temporary nature \sim of the event or state.

▶▶We can own ~ every stitch of expensive clothing ~ and piece of jewelry ever made.

 \triangleright They will <u>not</u> ~ follow us ~ into eternity. 11 9/15

▶▶We can pour ~ enormous amounts of cash ~ into making our bodies look good.

DDOur present bodies ~ will <u>not</u> ~ follow us ~ into eternity.

▶▶On the other hand, ~ "a gentle and quiet spirit," ~ i.e., ~ Christ-like character ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright \underline{will} \sim \text{follow us} \sim \text{into eternity}.$

⊳1 Tim. 4: ~ 7-8

▶ Perhaps ~ we can consider ~ Christ-like character ~ to be one the treasures ~ that we can store up in heaven.

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⊳⊳Matt. 6: ~ 19-21 . . . .
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AT THE END OF 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 4, ~ PETER ADDS ~ THAT ~ "A GENTLE AND QUIET SPIRIT" ~ is precious in God's eyes.

▶▶And what is precious in God's eyes ~ should be precious ~ in his people's eyes.

NOW LET'S TURN OUR ATTENTION ~ TO THE TWO PRECEPTS ~ PETER HAS ~ FOR husbands.

THE FIRST PRECEPT, ~ 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 7a.

CHRISTIAN HUSBANDS, ~ LIVE WITH YOUR WIVES ~ IN AN UNDERSTANDING WAY.

▶▶The phrase ~ live with your wives ~ in an understanding way ~ is literally, ~ 77

▶▶That a husband ~ should live with his wife ~ in an understanding way ~ implies ~ 7.7

DDmore than just ~ a kind attitude.

 \triangleright It goes deeper, ~ implying ~ that living with his wife ~ in an understanding way ~ is based on ~ 77

→ his knowledge ~ of her ~ needs, ~ desires, ~ gifts, ~ and ~ abilities.

 $\triangleright \triangleright A$ husband ~ who acts on his knowledge of his wife ~ will greatly ~ enrich her life, ~ as well ~ as his own.

PETER'S SECOND PRECEPT ~ FOR HUSBANDS ~ IS IN VERSE 7b.

PETER EXPLAINS ~ THAT A HUSBAND ~ MUST ALSO ~ RESPECT HIS WIFE ~ AS THE weaker partner.

- ▶ showing honor to the woman ~ as the weaker vessel
- ▶▶If I understand this correctly ~~ boiled down, ~ the word ~ "vessel" ~ refers ~ to an instrument ~ whereby something ~ is accomplished.

DDI point you here ~ to Acts 9:15. ⇒⇒ Used of Paul.

 $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ But the Lord said to him, \sim "Go, \sim for he is a chosen \sim <u>instrument</u> \sim of mine \sim to carry my name \sim before \sim the Gentiles \sim and kings \sim and the children of Israel.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ IOW, ~ Paul was an instrument ~ for God's service.

 $\triangleright \triangleright I$ believe ~ it is used in this sense ~ here ~ in 1 Pet. ~ 3: ~ 7b. 11/15

 \triangleright The wife ~ is God's instrument, ~ along with her husband ~ for God's service ~ in the family ~ and in society.

>> The word "vessel" here ~ can also be translated ~ as "partner."

▶▶The word ~ "weaker" ~ refers to physical weakness, ~ 77

DDnot to ~ moral, ~ spiritual, ~ or intellectual ~ inferiority.

 \triangleright Peter used the term $\sim \underline{not}$ to diminish women, \sim but to build a case $\sim \underline{for}$ respecting them.

FELLOW HUSBANDS, ~ WE ARE TO EXERCISE ~ OUR GOD-GIVEN AUTHORITY AND leadership ~~ with respect ~~ for our wives.

- ▶▶We are not ~ to bully or coerce our wives ~ in any way. coerce
- ▶▶A husband ~ who respects his wife ~ will ~ protect, ~ honor, ~ and ~ help ~ her.

 \triangleright \vdash He will ~ respect her opinions, ~ listen to her advice, ~ and ~ be considerate of her needs.

 \rightarrow Plus, ~ he will relate to her, ~ both privately and publicly, ~ with ~ love, ~ courtesy, ~ insight, ~ and tact.

 $\blacktriangleright \blacktriangleright$ While the wife \sim may be weaker physically, \sim she is also \sim a partner to her husband.

 \triangleright This implies ~ a side-by-side relationship ~ of working together ~ for God's glory ~ 77

→ in their family, ~ in their local church, ~ and ~ in society at large. 11 12/15

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▶▶The Christian husband ~ must exercise ~ his God-given authority and leadership ~ 77
    Dwith ~ knowledge of ~ and respect for ~ his wife.
       → He must ~ never be ~ a tyrant, ~ faithless, ~ unloving, ~ or impatient.
IN 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 7c, ~~ PAUL GIVES US ~ THE REASON ~ 77
FOR LIVING WITH OUR WIVES ~ IN AN UNDERSTANDING WAY ~ and ~ for showing her
respect.
 ▶▶It is because ~ they are heirs with us ~ of the grace of life.
THIS REMINDS EACH CHRISTIAN HUSBAND ~ THAT ~ even though he has been given ~ 77
 >> greater authority and the leadership position ~ within his marriage, ~ his wife ~ 77
    Dis still equal to him ~ in spiritual privilege ~ and ~ in eternal importance.
 ▶▶Husband and wife ~ are both ~ joint-heirs with Jesus.
    >>In the marriage relationship ~ the husband and wife ~ complement each other.
    >>In their personal standing before God, ~ there is equality.
    \triangleright \triangleright Both ~ are accepted by God ~ on the same basis, ~ his grace.
    \triangleright Believing wives, ~ like Christian husbands, ~ believe in the same Savior. 11 13/15
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- >>Both husband and wife ~ are redeemed by the blood of Christ. >>Both live ~ by the same empowering grace, ~ bestowed by the Holy Spirit. >> And both ~ look forward ~ to the same eternal destiny. ▶▶Recognition ~ of this reality ~ will prevent ~ a husband's abuse ~ of his authority and leadership. ▶▶And remember, ~ the Christian husband ~ is only allowed ~ 77 Do to exercise his authority & leadership ~ within the parameters ~ that God has set up. ⇒⇒I don't think ~ this can be reiterated enough. $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ We are <u>not</u> free ~ to lead our marriage ~ any way we want. IN 1 PET. ~ 3: ~ 7d, ~ PETER INCLUDES AN ADMONITION TO HUSBANDS. ▶▶Peter here ~ adds the warning to husbands ~ that ~ 77
- SO THAT ~ YOUR PRAYERS ~ MAY NOT ~ BE HINDERED.
- Dif they fail to obey these two precepts, ~ their prayers ~ would be hindered.

THE GREEK WORD FOR ~ "HINDERED" ~ IS APPARENTLY ~ A MILITARY METAPHOR.

▶▶And it means ~ "to cut in on," ~~ "throw obstacles in the way" ~~ or ~~ 77 \triangleright "cut up the road" ~ so that ~ normal movement ~ is impossible. 11/15

- ▶►IOW, ~ a husband's disobedience ~ hinders his prayers, ~~ so that ~ they do not rise ~ to God's throne.
- ►► To put it bluntly, ~ he's in sin.

 \triangleright And Is. 59:2 ~ says, \Rightarrow but your iniquities ~ have made a separation ~ between ~ you and your God, ~~ and your sins ~ have hidden his face from you ~~ so that ~ he does not hear.

IN GENERAL, ~ A BELIEVER'S FELLOWSHIP WITH GOD ~ IS CLOSELY RELATED ~ 77

- ▶▶to his/her relations ~ with others.
 - >> Jesus said ~ that if you have a problem with a fellow believer, ~ 77
 - →you must make it right with that person ~ before ~ coming to worship (Matthew 5:23-24).
- ▶▶This principle ~ carries over ~ into a man's marriage relationship.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ If a husband ~ uses his position ~ 77
 - to treat his wife ~ contrary to God's commands, ~ his relationship with God ~ will suffer.
 - >>A husband ~ should not expect ~ to have a vital ministry ~ in life ~ or ~ in prayer ~ 77
 - →→if he is mistreating his wife ~ in any way.
