PRECEPTS FOR RELATIONSHIPS, PT. 5; COL. 3:22-4:1; EPH. 6:5-9 (Ed O'Leary)

INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WRAP UP OUR STUDY ~ OF THE PRECEPTS FOR RELATIONSHIPS ~ that Paul lays out for us ~ in Col. 3:18 - 4:1. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Precepts for relationships.

▶▶ TPID, ~ general rules ~ governing Christian relationships ~ in various settings.

► And as everyone, ~ I think, ~ is aware ~ that we've been jumping back and forth with Ephesians.

 $\triangleright \triangleright Also$ and more in depth.

IN ~ COL. 3:22-4:1 ~ AND EPH. 6:5-9, ~ PAUL ADDRESSES ~ CHRISTIAN SLAVES AND Christian masters.

► Obviously, ~ there is no slavery today, ~ but Paul's instructions ~ can easily be applied ~ to the workplace.

► So, ~ by way of application, ~ Paul has instructions, ~ for Christian employees and Christian employers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Focus today. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ On this application.

FOR EMPLOYEE, ~ CONCENTRATE MAINLY ON EPH. ⇒ → FOR EMPLOYER, ~ COL.

IN EPH. 6:5a, ~ PAUL EXHORTS CHRISTIAN EMPLOYEES ~ TO OBEY THEIR EMPLOYERS.

SIMPLY PUT, ~ PAUL IS SAYING, ~ "CHRISTIAN EMPLOYEES, ~ CARRY OUT THE JOB ~ that your employer ~ has hired you to do." 11 1/11

>> The Christian employee ~ should be the model employee ~ when it comes to working.

>>We should never ~ be guilty of ~ slacking off, ~ being lazy, ~ wasting time, ~ 77

→ → or ~ taking extra time for lunch or breaks.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And except for lunch and breaks, ~ we should work from ~ the minute our shift begins ~ to when it ends.

>>Prov. 18:9 says ~ "Whoever is slack in his work ~ is a brother ~ to him who destroys."

 \rightarrow The phrase ~ "is a brother" ~ means ~ that ~ the lazy person and the destroyer ~ are of the same nature, ~ 77

→ → the same kind of people.

 \rightarrow I.e., ~ one ~ who through laziness ~ fails to carry out his work promptly or efficiently ~ 77

 \rightarrow is as bad ~ as someone who destroys things.

IN EPH. ~ 6: ~~ 5b-7, ~ PAUL EXPLAINS ~ HOW WE ARE TO ACT ON THE JOB.

IN VS. 5b, ~ PAUL SAYS ~ BELIEVERS ARE TO DO THEIR JOB ~ "WITH FEAR AND trembling."

► Now, ~ the phrase ~ "fear and trembling" ~ has actually ~ little to do ~ with terror and panic.

 \triangleright Simply put, ~ it is a matter ~ of reverence and respect, ~ not ~ of being afraid or terrified. 11 2/11

▶▶Most likely ~ what Paul has in mind here ~ is a call for Christian employees ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ to have ~ a proper respect ~ for their bosses. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Trans. ~~ deep/great/proper respect.

► Again, ~ not a respect that's earned

IN EPH. 6:5c, ~ WE SEE PAUL'S NEXT POINT ~ ON HOW WE ARE TO ACT ON THE JOB.

▶ Paul tells believers ~ to carry out our work ~ "with a sincere heart, ~ as you would Christ."

► The phrase ~ "with a sincere heart" ~ means ~ that we are to carry out our work ~ sincerely, ~ honestly, ~ 77

Dand ~ with ~ no ulterior motive or hidden intention.

>>We are to have ~ purity in our intentions ~ and not to succumb to ~ scheming, ~ deceit, ~ or ~ any other kind of improper motive.

►► And notice in verse 5c, ~ Paul doesn't stop ~ after the words "with a sincere heart."

▷▷He adds the words "as you would Christ."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It is a given, ~ a no-brainer, ~ that the genuine believer ~ serves Jesus ~ 77

→ → sincerely, ~ honestly, ~ with pure intentions, ~ and ~ with no ulterior motive or hidden intention.

 \rightarrow And we ~ are to reproduce that kind of service ~ in our workplace. 11 3/11

PAUL'S NEXT POINT ON HOW WE ARE TO ACT ON THE JOB ~ IS IN EPH. ~ 6:~ 6a (CSB).

▶ Paul says ~ we are <u>not</u> ~ to work ~ <u>only</u> ~ while being watched, ~ as people-pleasers.

▶ Paul is referring here ~ to work ~ that is done only ~ to make an impression in the boss' presence ~ and ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ to call attention to oneself.

 \rightarrow The implication is ~ that acceptable work ~ ceases ~ when the boss ~ is no longer around.

▶ Those who act in such a way ~ are "people-pleasers" ~ who seek to gain favor ~ 77

DD with their employer ~ rather than ~ please God.

The Christian worker ~ is told ~ not to do this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright We$ ~ are to do our job ~ whether the boss is present or not.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We are to carry out our duties ~ in a way that pleases God, ~ 77

 \rightarrow and not ~ be motivated by ~ gaining favor with our employer ~ or calling attention to ourselves.

<u>CONTINUING OUR LOOK ~ AT PAUL'S EXPLANATION ~ OF HOW WE ARE TO ACT ~ ON</u> <u>the job.</u> ~ 77

IN EPH. ~ 6: ~ 6b, ~ PAUL PRESENTS A CONTRAST.

but as bondservants of Christ, ~ doing the will of God from the heart. 11 4/11

▶▶I.e., ~ in contrast to working "by the way of eye-service, ~ as people-pleasers," ~ 77

DPaul says ~ that ~ since believers ~ are servants of Jesus, ~ we are to do ~ the will of God.

►►And the will of God for us ~ in the context here ~ 77

DD is to follow Paul's instructions for us ~ in the workplace.

▶▶ TPID, ~ doing the will of God in the workplace ~ means ~ being the best possible employee we can be; ~~ 77

EPH. ~ 6: ~ 7, ~ HAS PAUL'S ~ FINAL INSTRUCTION ~ ON HOW WE ARE TO ACT ~ on the job.

▶ Paul says, ~ "rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man."

▶ The Greek word translated "good will" ~ means ~ a positive attitude ~ exhibited in a relationship.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So Paul is calling us ~ to have a positive attitude ~ on the job.

▶▶But look carefully ~ at what he says.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Work with a positive attitude ~ as to the Lord and not to man.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow I.e., ~ work with a positive attitude ~ as though ~ you were working ~ for the Lord ~ rather than for people. 1 5/11

▶▶In fact, ~ in the Colossians passage on this, ~ Paul asserts that ~ the Christian employee ~ is serving Jesus.

▶▶And that will help us carry out Paul's instruction here.

 $\triangleright \triangleright As$ we work, ~ keep our eyes fixed on Jesus ~~ and have the attitude ~ that He is our boss.

 \rightarrow Think about it, ~ what genuine believer ~ wouldn't have a positive attitude working for Jesus?

BACK TO COLOSSIANS NOW.

IN THIS PASSAGE ON PRECEPTS, ~ PAUL GIVES TWO MOTIVATIONS TO FOLLOW the guidelines he's laid out.

1st, ~ COL. 3:24a. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ KNOWING ~ THAT FROM THE LORD ~ YOU WILL RECEIVE ~ THE inheritance as your reward.

▶▶The language indicates that ~ time when we are resurrected and glorified is in view.

▶ Paul reminds us here ~ that nothing ~ is unwitnessed by the Lord.

⊳⊳Ps. 33:13-15.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And Heb. 4:13. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ And no creature ~ is hidden from his sight, ~~ but all ~ are naked and exposed ~ to the eyes of him ~ to whom we must give account. 11 6/11

▶ Fellow believers, ~ nothing well done ~ is ever done in vain.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ There may be no thanks on earth.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow A person ~ may reap only ~ criticism and misunderstanding on their job.

 \rightarrow But there is ~ an unfailing reward ~ that comes from the Lord ~ for faithful service.

►►And ~ if the boss plays favorites, ~ if you get passed over for promotion, ~ 77

► Our effort ~ will be rewarded.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We may have missed out ~ in the here and now.

 \Rightarrow But ~ from the Lord ~ we will receive ~ the inheritance as our reward.

▶▶1 Cor. 15:58.

 \triangleright Therefore, ~ my beloved brothers, ~ be ~ steadfast, ~ immovable, ~ always abounding in the work of the Lord ~ [and our jobs are the work for the Lord], ~ knowing that ~ in the Lord ~ your labor is not in vain.

▶▶In the context ~ of serving other believers, ~ but certainly ~ applicable to our jobs as well, ~ note what Heb. 6:10 says.

 \triangleright For God is not unjust ~ so as to overlook ~ your work ~ and the love that you have shown for his name ~ in serving the saints, ~ as you still do. 11 7/11

▶▶There will be ~ recognition, ~ appreciation ~ and greater rewards than these.

>>Our faithful service in this life ~ might never get a pat on the back from our employer.

 \Rightarrow But, ~ we will definitely get a ~ Well done, ~ good and faithful servant," ~ when we go home to be with Jesus.

AND NOW THE SECOND MOTIVATION ~ TO FOLLOW THE GUIDELINES ~ Paul's laid out.

► For the wrongdoer ~ will be paid back ~ for the wrong he has done, ~ and there is no partiality.

► Here Paul gives ~ a negative motivation.

► Here and now

▶ The warning ~ then ~ is that the Lord ~ will discipline ~ without partiality ~ in cases of disobedience.

▶ Paul acknowledged ~ that the Christian slave Onesimus ~ was responsible ~ to repay Philemon.

▷ ▷ Philem. 18-19

▶ The Christian employee ~ is not to presume on his Christianity ~ to justify disobedience on the job.

Even if we are God's children, ~ we will reap what we sow, ~ because God ~ is impartial.

 \triangleright In his message at Cornelius' house, ~ Peter said, ~ "Truly ~ I understand ~ that God ~ shows ~ no partiality." **1** 8/11

▶▶In summary, ~ our heavenly Father ~ will not cover for us ~ when we do wrong.

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→→But God ~ is not necessarily going to protect us ~ from the consequences ~ of our wrongdoing.

→→David. ⇔⇒ 2 Sam. 12:9-15

IN COL. ~ 4: ~ 1, ~ PAUL TURNS HIS ATTENTION ~ TO CHRISTIAN EMPLOYERS.

MASTERS, ~ TREAT YOUR BONDSERVANTS JUSTLY AND FAIRLY, ~ knowing that you also ~ have a Master in heaven.

▶▶Applied to Christian employers, ~ the idea here, ~ I would suggest, ~ is this.

>>And finally, ~ you Christian employers, ~ treat your employees ~ justly and fairly, ~ since you are well aware that you, ~ like your Christian employees, ~ have a heavenly employer ~ to whom ~ you are accountable.

► The term ~ justly ~ means ~ to provide your employees ~ with that which ~ they rightly deserve.

⊳⊳Good or bad

► The word ~ fairly ~ is pretty self-explanatory.

Christian employers, ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ in addition ~ to providing their employees ~ with what they deserve, ~ are to provide fair treatment ~ to all of their employees. **11** 9/11

►►Notice that ~ the words, ~ justly and fairly ~ emphasize ~ the duties ~ of Christian employers, ~ rather than ~ their rights.

►►At the end of the verse, ~ Paul reminds Christian employers ~ that ~ they will be held accountable ~ by God, ~ for the way they use their authority.

>>Don't forget, ~ Paul says, ~ that you have a Master in heaven.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Their earthly status ~ does not ~ give them the right ~ to abuse their authority.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Required to function within the parameters that God has set up.

CONCLUSION.

AND THAT BRINGS US TO THE END ~ OF THE PRECEPTS FOR RELATIONSHIPS ~ THAT Paul lays out for us in Col. 3:18-4:1.

►►A closing thought.

▶ The precepts ~ that Paul lays out for us in this section, ~ 77

D and all of the precepts for us ~ in God's word ~ cut ~ across the grain ~ of the culture in which we live.

▶ But that's the way it's supposed to be.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We are not ~ to copy ~ the behavior and customs ~ of this world.

 \Rightarrow \Rightarrow God's people ~ are to be ~ countercultural. 11 10/11

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We ~ are to be at variance ~ with the social norms ~ of this fallen world.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Our way of life and set of attitudes ~ are to be different ~ 77

 \rightarrow \rightarrow than the prevailing ~ way of life and set of attitudes ~ of this present evil age.

>>We're citizens of heaven ~~ and are to live ~ the way citizens of heaven should.
