## A POSTCARD FROM PAUL, Pt. 3; PHILE. 1:4-5a (Ed O'Leary)

## INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL BEGIN TO TAKE UP ~ THE NEXT SECTION OF PHILEMON, ~ VERSES 4-7.

▶►After listing the recipients of the letter, ~ Paul narrows his focus to Philemon, ~ the principal recipient.  $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$  Not just a private matter.

THIS 9 ~ IS PAUL'S STATEMENT OF APPRECIATION ~ FOR HIS FRIEND PHILEMON ~ 77

- land can be outlined this way.
- ▶▶In verse 4, ~ Paul tells Philemon ~ that ~ whenever he prays for him, ~~ he expresses thanks to God for Philemon.
- ▶▶He then tells him ~ why he gives God thanks, ~ verse 5.  $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$  2 reasons.
- ▶▶In verse 6, ~ Paul informs Philemon of one of the things he's been praying about for him.
- ▶▶And then ~ Paul gives a personal testimony in verse 7.

>>He states the impact Philemon's ministry to believers ~ has had on him ~ personally.

BEFORE WE BEGIN ~ TO GET INTO ~ THE DETAILS ~ OF THESE FOUR VERSES, ~ 77

I WOULD ONCE AGAIN LIKE TO NOTE ~ PAUL'S APPROACH TO PHILEMON.

▶▶Paul ~ was gracious and tactful ~ in his approach to him. 11/10

▶▶Instead of ~ immediately pleading ~ for the man's life, ~ 77 DPaul first ~ expressed ~ sincere appreciation ~ for his friend Philemon. >> This was not ~ empty flattery. → It was sincere Christian appreciation. ▶▶And lest we think that Paul ~ was ~ buttering Philemon up, ~ we need to consider this. >>Paul ~ normally offered ~ congratulatory thanksgivings ~ in his letters. >> And ~ his tribute to Philemon ~ for his faith and love ~ is identical ~ to his praise of all the Colossians. ▶▶Paul teaches us ~ an important lesson here. >> We need to become ~ genuinely ~ gracious and tactful ~ in our relationships with our fellow believers. → And, ~ when we genuinely appreciate someone, ~ we should let them know. NOW LET'S UNPACK THESE FOUR VERSES, ~ PHILEMON 1:4-7. IN VERSE 4, ~ AS NOTED, ~ PAUL EXPRESSES THANKS ~ TO GOD FOR PHILEMON. CSB: I ALWAYS THANK MY GOD ~ WHEN I MENTION YOU ~ IN MY PRAYERS. ▶▶I.e., ~ whenever Paul mentioned Philemon in his prayers, ~~ without fail ~ he gave thanks to God. 11 2/10

▶ Based on his description of Philemon, ~ most likely, ~ 77

Paul was always thanking God in prayer ~ for Philemon's ~ exemplary ~ Christian witness.

PAUL CONTINUALLY GAVE THANKS ~ FOR HIS FELLOW BELIEVERS.

- ▶▶He told the Ephesian believers, ~ "I do not cease ~ to give thanks for you."
- ▶▶And to the church in Philippi ~ he wrote, ~ I thank my God ~ in all my remembrance of you.
- ▶▶If you think about it, ~ this is the attitude that we should have ~ 77
  - Dotoward all of our brothers and sisters in Christ.
    - → Whenever we ~ think of them ~ or pray for them, ~ we should thank God for them.
- ▶▶David weighs in on this as well.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  Ps. 16:3, ~ As for the saints in the land, ~ they are the excellent ones, ~ in whom is all my delight.

 $\rightarrow$  Like David, ~ we should have the attitude ~ that our brothers and sisters in Christ ~ "are the excellent ones," ~ 77

→ and take pleasure in them ~ and enjoy their company.

AS WE OBSERVED, ~ IN VERSE 4 (CSB), ~ WHENEVER PAUL MENTIONED PHILEMON IN prayer, ~ without fail ~ he gave God thanks.

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1st, ~ PAUL WAS CONFINED ~ AND NOT FREE TO GO AROUND PREACHING & TEACHING,
~ etc.
 ▶▶IOW, ~ he was restricted ~ in what he could do in ministry.
    DDBut not useless. ⇒ Prayed. ~~ Wrote 4 letters.
 ► Someone ~ may be restricted (illness, etc.). ⇒⇒ But not useless.
THE 2<sup>nd</sup> OBSERVATION ABOUT PAUL HERE.
 ▶▶Thanksgiving to God was a big part of Paul's life.
    >>He prayed ~ with a thankful heart, ~~ and he prayed for Philemon ~ with thankfulness.
 ▶▶Paul was an example ~ of a much larger truth.
    >>Thankful people.
    >> Believers ~ are to have a continual ~ attitude ~ of gratitude ~ toward the Lord.
 ▶ Remember the repetition in Colossians? . . . . *⇒⇒ Why the repetition? . . . . *
 ► Reject ~ our inherent ~ ingratitude.
    >> And develop ~ a continual ~ attitude of gratitude ~ toward the Lord.
       → And we should be ~ expressing that thankfulness ~ 77
           \rightarrowin thought, ~ word, ~ and deed. 11 4/10
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## LET'S LOOK AT VERSE 4 ONCE AGAIN.

CSB: T	AI WAYS	THANK ~ MY	GOD ~	WHEN I MENTION YOU ~ IN MY PRAYERS.
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- ►► "my God." ⇒⇒ Personal relationship.
- ▶▶This reminds us ~ that the sovereign, ~ almighty Creator of the universe ~ is personal.
  - >>He's not some ~ untouchable, ~ unknowable ~ God.
- ▶▶He is not like what deists claim, ~ 77
  - $\triangleright \triangleright$  that ~ he created everything ~ and then ~ went off ~ and has nothing more to do with His creation.
- ▶▶No, ~ He is ~ deeply personal ~~ and very much involved ~ in His creation.
  - Do In Acts 14:17, ~ Paul says, ~ "Yet he did not leave himself without witness, ~~ for he did good ~ by giving you rains from heaven and fruitful seasons, ~~ satisfying your hearts~ with food and gladness."
  - $\triangleright$ Ps. 145:18, ~ The Lord is near ~ to all who call on him, ~ to all who call on him in truth.
  - $\triangleright$ Ps. 34:18, ~ The Lord ~ is near to the brokenhearted ~ and saves the crushed in spirit.
- ▶▶So involved and personal is God ~ that ~ he sent his Son to save us from our sins.
  - >>Problem.
  - $\triangleright \triangleright God remedied$ . 11 5/10

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  Jn. 3:16-17,  $\sim$  NIV,  $\sim$  For God so loved the world  $\sim$  that he gave  $\sim$  his one and only Son,  $\sim$  that whoever  $\sim$  believes in him  $\sim$  shall not perish  $\sim$  but have eternal life.  $\sim$  For God  $\sim$  did not  $\sim$  send his Son into the world  $\sim$  to condemn the world,  $\sim$  but to save the world through him.

 $\triangleright$ Everyone ~ who puts their trust ~ in Jesus for salvation ~ 77

→ has a personal relationship ~ with this ~ very personal ~ and very involved ~ God.

>>Even more, ~ those who have accepted Christ for salvation ~ are now children of God.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow 1$  Jn. 3:1a,  $\sim NIV \sim$  "See  $\sim$  what great love  $\sim$  the Father has lavished on us,  $\sim$  that we  $\sim$  should be called  $\sim$  children of God!  $\sim\sim$  And that is what we are!"

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  My brothers and sisters in Christ,  $\sim$  each of us can say,  $\sim$  "God  $\sim$  is my God,"  $\sim$  "God  $\sim$  is my Father."

⇒⇒I don't know about you, ~ but I think that's pretty awesome!

IN VERSE 5, ~ PAUL SAYS ~ WHY ~ HE GIVES THANKS TO GOD ~ FOR PHILEMON.

BECAUSE ~ I HEAR ~ OF YOUR LOVE ~ AND OF THE FAITH ~ THAT YOU HAVE ~ 77

- ▶▶toward the Lord Jesus ~ and for all the saints.
- Technical notes . . . . (2)

FIRST.

▶▶The Greek text here ~ employs a literary figure ~ that becomes confusing ~ using a literal English translation. 16/10

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>>It's a somewhat ~ awkward reading ~ 77
        → and needs to be smoothed out ~ in translation.
 ▶ What's going on here is this.
    >>Paul's thanksgiving ~ is based ~ on reports reaching him ~ concerning the love and faith
    of Philemon.
    >>Namely, ~ his faith toward the Lord Jesus, ~ 77
        → and ~ his love toward fellow believers.
 ▶▶This ~ is the better reading ~ of the Greek text.
 ▶▶A clearer translation ~ that brings out the meaning quite well ~ is this.
    DD[I give thanks] ~~ because I hear of ~ your faith in the Lord Jesus ~ and ~ your
    love for all the saints. NET
 ▶▶So ~ there are two reasons ~ Paul gives thanks to God for Philemon.
    >>His faith in Jesus.
    >>And his love for all believers.
2<sup>nd</sup> TECHNICAL NOTE.
 ► Continual . . . . 11 7/10
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 $\triangleright \triangleright I$  give thanks ~ because ~ I keep hearing ~ about your faith in the Lord Jesus ~ and ~ your love for all of God's people.

NOW LET'S UNPACK ~ THE FIRST ~ OF THESE TWO REASONS.

▶Next, ~ 2<sup>nd</sup> reason ~ as well as vv. 6-7.

1st, ~ PAUL KEPT HEARING ABOUT PHILEMON'S FAITH IN THE LORD JESUS.

- ▶▶Paul thanked God for Philemon, ~ first, ~ because Philemon ~ was a genuine believer.
- ▶▶And people were continuing to testify ~ to that fact.

>>IOW, ~ Philemon gave plenty of evidence ~ of genuine salvation.

▶▶That means ~ Philemon's life ~ was bearing ~ good ~ spiritual fruit.

>>And it was quite evident ~ to all who had contact with him.

▶▶Bearing good spiritual fruit ~ is a sign ~ of a genuine believer.  $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$  Spend time on this.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  In his upper room discourse Jesus said, ~ 77

 $\rightarrow$  My Father is glorified by this:  $\sim$  that  $\sim$  you produce much fruit  $\sim$  and prove  $\sim$  to be my disciples. (Jn. 15:8, CSB)

 $\triangleright$  The proof of genuine discipleship, ~ 77

→i.e., ~ genuine salvation, ~ is fruit-bearing. 11 8/10

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>> Jesus' statement coincides ~ with his teaching in the sermon on the mount.
   → → Matt. 7:15-20 . . . .
   → These verses show that ~~ true faith in Christ ~ changes the life ~ and produces
   fruit for God's glory.
   → Everything ~ in nature ~ reproduces after its kind.
      → And this ~ is also true ~ in the spiritual realm.
   \rightarrow Good fruit \sim comes \sim from a good tree.
   ⇒⇒But bad fruit ~ comes ~ from a bad tree.
      → The tree ~ that produces rotten fruit ~ is cut down and thrown into the fire.
   \Rightarrow \Rightarrow 2 important questions to ask ourselves \sim are these.
      → → 1. Did my decision for Christ ~ change my life? ~~ 2. What kind of fruit am I
      bearing?
>>In his explanation of his parable of the sower, ~ Jesus said, ~ 77
   →But those that were sown on the good soil ~ 77
       → are the ones who ~ hear the word ~ and accept it ~ and bear fruit, ~ thirtyfold
      ~ and ~ sixtyfold ~ and a hundredfold.
          → Diff. amts. ⇒ But will bear. 11 9/10
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\triangleright \triangleright In Rom. 7:4 (NIV), ~ Paul writes, ~ 77
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\rightarrowSo, \sim my brothers and sisters, \sim you also died to the law \sim through the body of Christ, \sim that you might belong to another, \sim to him who was raised from the dead, \sim in order that \sim we might bear fruit for God.
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→ Our new life in Christ ~ is expected to bear fruit.

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DDAnd using different words, ~ James makes the same point. ⇒⇒ James 2:14-17....
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→ James emphasizes ~ the absolute necessity ~ of post-conversion works.

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\rightarrow \rightarrow He calls ~ a faith that ~ does not ~ bring about a changed life ~ dead, ~ lifeless, ~ and ~ useless.
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▶▶ As in the case of Philemon, ~ genuine belief ~ in Jesus ~ as Savior and Lord ~ 77

Dowill bear good spiritual fruit ~ that is quite evident to others.

▶▶In closing, ~ let's get a brief glimpse ~ of the nature of this fruit ~ that true conversion produces.

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<u>LET'S PRAY . . . . 10/10</u>
