## A POSTCARD FROM PAUL, PT. 9; PHILE. 1:19b-20 (Ed O'Leary)

### INTRODUCTION.

TODAY, ~ WE'LL FINISH UP ~ VERSES 17-20.

AS WE'VE NOTED, ~ IN THESE VERSES, ~ PAUL GETS INTO SPECIFICS ~ REGARDING Onesimus.

▶▶In verse 17, ~ which we looked at ~ a couple weeks ago, ~ Paul specifically states ~ how he would like Philemon ~ 77

DD to handle the situation ~ of his returned slave

 $\triangleright \triangleright As$  we noted, ~ basically, ~ Paul is saying this ~ in verse 17.

→ Philemon, ~ since you consider me ~ a partner ~ in spreading the gospel, ~ give Onesimus, ~ this new partner ~ in the gospel ministry, ~ the same ready welcome ~ on his arrival ~ that you would give me.

 $\triangleright$ Simply put, ~ Paul is asking Philemon ~ to ~ forgive and reconcile with ~ Onesimus.

▶▶In verses 18-19a, ~ last week, ~ Paul offers to pay ~ any debt ~ that Onesimus incurred ~ in running away.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  And as we observed ~ what Paul did for Onesimus ~ parallels ~ what Jesus did for us.

- →→Onesimus ~ had wronged Philemon ~ and thus ~ was separated from him.
  - $\rightarrow$  Sinners have wronged God ~ and are thus ~ separated. 11 1/9

→ Paul had not been involved ~ with Onesimus' quilt. → Jesus ~ was sinless, ~ separated from sinners → Paul wrote this letter ~ to reconcile ~ Onesimus and Philemon. → Jesus' work on the cross ~ reconciled sinners and God. → The debt Onesimus had with Philemon ~ had to be paid. ⇒ Paul offered to pay it. → The penalty for sin ~ had to be paid. ⇒ And Jesus paid it. → Paul took on a debt ~ that was not his own ~ by promising to repay Philemon. → Jesus took on the debt of sin ~ that was not his own (the sins of the whole world) ~ and paid it ~ by his death. OK, ~ LET'S FINISH VERSES 17-20. AFTER PAUL SAYS THAT ~ HE WILL PAY ~ ONESIMUS' DEBT TO PHILEMON, ~~ 77 HE HAS A REMINDER FOR PHILEMON ~ IN VERSE 19b.

▶▶ to say nothing ~ of your owing me ~ even your own self.

HERE PAUL REMINDS PHILEMON THAT ~ while Paul is seeking a favor from him, ~ 77

▶▶he, ~ Philemon, ~ actually is in debt ~ to the greater favor ~ already showed to him ~ by Paul. 11 2/9

- ▶▶No doubt Paul is referring ~ to leading Philemon to the Lord.
- ▶▶Most likely, ~ Philemon was saved ~ during Paul's three-year ministry in Ephesus.

PHILEMON THEN, ~ HUMANLY SPEAKING, ~ OWED HIS OWN SOUL TO PAUL.

- ▶▶Philemon's debt to Paul ~ was thus ~ incalculable.
- ▶▶So ~ how could he refuse Paul's request ~ and not show favor to Onesimus?
- ▶▶By putting it this way, ~ Paul wishes to remind Philemon ~ of the pardon he himself received from God.
- ▶▶Most likely, ~ Paul does so ~ in order ~ to help him understand ~ 77
  - Dhow grace freely received ~ calls us ~ to freely ~ pass grace on to others.
- ▶▶Jesus tells us, ~ freely ~ you have received, ~~ freely give (Matt. 10:8b, NIV).

IN FACT,  $\sim$  IN EPH. 1,  $\sim$  PAUL TELLS US  $\sim$  that God caused his grace  $\sim$  to abound to us.

- ▶▶The Greek word for "abound" means ~ more than enough, ~ to provide in abundance, ~ to cause to overflow.
- ightharpoonup God is infinitely rich in grace.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$  But He is not stingy with it.

→ Not like some cosmic Scrooge. 11 3/9

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▶▶God ~ does not give His grace to us! in limited measure, ~ carefully weighed out.
    >> He causes His grace to overflow, ~ to super-abound to us.
 ▶▶And we, ~ my . . . , ~ are to ~ freely ~ pass on ~ abundant grace ~ to others.
TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION ~ the case of ~ Paul, ~ Philemon, ~ and Onesimus, ~ 77
 ▶▶I would suggest ~ that it is also Scriptural ~ to teach ~~ Freely ~ you have been ~
 forgiven, ~~ freely ~ forgive.'
MATTHEW ~ 18:23-35 ~ RECORDS JESUS' PARABLE OF THE UNFORGIVING SERVANT.
 ▶▶In the parable . . . .
 ► Verses 32-35 . . . .
 ▶▶A child of God ~ has had ~ all ~ of their sins forgiven by faith in Jesus.
    >> Because of that, ~ we should ~ not ~ withhold forgiveness from others.
 ▶ Realizing how completely Christ has forgiven us ~ should produce ~ 77
    DDa free and generous attitude of forgiveness ~ toward others.
 ▶▶When we don't forgive others, ~ we are saying ~ 77
    \triangleright \triangleright that we appreciate God's love and forgiveness ~ but ~ that we're unwilling ~ to give it
    to anyone else. 11 4/9
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WE MUST ADMIT ~~ ON THE HUMAN LEVEL, ~ FORGIVENESS CAN BE ~ very difficult, ~ can't it?
▶▶We've all been hurt from time to time ~ by people, ~ unbeliever and believer alike.
⊳⊳And will be so again.
▶▶At those times, ~ we can do one of two things.
$\triangleright \triangleright$ One, ~ continue to be hurt, ~ unforgiving, ~ and become ~ resentful and bitter.
▷▷Or, ~ two, ~ take the high road.
⇒⇒I.e., ~ Meditate on ~ Calvary ~ and God's free and full forgiveness bestowed on us there.
WE WERE IN ~ INCALCULABLE DEBT ~ TO GOD, ~ DUE TO ~ WHO WE WERE ~ and what we had done.
▶▶Yet, ~ he, ~ through his Beloved Son on Calvary, ~ freely and fully ~ 77
DD canceled the record of debt ~ that stood against us with its legal demands, ~ as Paul says in Col. 2:14.
▶▶Christ's death ~ was sufficient ~ to cancel the charges against the sinner ~ completely.
▶▶Jesus paid our debt for us.
▶▶The Greek word for ~ "canceled" ~ means ~ to cause something to cease ~ by obliterating

~ any evidence. ⇒⇒ Quite a statement. 11 5/9

▶ When a person repents ~ and turns to Jesus for salvation, ~ God the Father ~ obliterates ~ the charges against them.

 $\triangleright$  Through Isaiah, ~ God says in Is. 43:25, ~ I, ~ I am he ~ who blots out your transgressions for my own sake, ~~ and I will not remember your sins.

MY FELLOW BELIEVERS, ~ OUR RECORD OF DEBT HAS BEEN ~ FREELY AND FULLY ~ canceled ~ by Jesus.

- ▶▶How can we then ~ bear grudges against our fellow human beings?
- ▶▶A true understanding of God's grace ~ leads to gratitude, ~~ 77

Dand gratitude ~ leads to showing grace.

- ▶▶The grace ~ that God lavished on Philemon, ~~ Philemon ~ was to lavish on Onesimus.
- ▶▶The grace ~ that God lavished on us, ~ we ~ are to lavish on others.

# IN VERSE 20, ~ PAUL SAYS, ~ 77

YES, ~ BROTHER, ~~ I WANT SOME BENEFIT FROM YOU IN THE LORD. ~~ REFRESH MY heart in Christ.

▶ Recall, ~ at the beginning of the letter, ~ Paul noted that Philemon ~ had an ~ uplifting influence ~ on other believers.

AS WE NOTED AT VERSE 7, ~ WE TOO ~ SHOULD HAVE AN UPLIFTING INFLUENCE ON fellow believers.

►►A little review ~ because so important. 11 6/9

▶▶We should avoid ~ having an attitude and temperament ~ that adds ~ to the burden ~ others carry. ▶▶Instead of draining others' energy and motivation ~ with complaints and problems, ~ 77 >> we should replenish their spirits ~ by things like ~ 77 → generosity, ~ expressing Christ-like love, ~ encouragement, ~ gracious hospitality, ~ and a helpful attitude. ▶▶In brief, ~ our brothers and sisters in Christ ~ should feel refreshed ~ 77 Dafter spending time with us. BACK TO PHILEMON, ~~ AND PAUL NOW ~ WAS ASKING TO BE UPLIFTED BY PHILEMON. ▶▶By forgiving and reconciling with Onesimus, ~ Philemon ~ would be refreshing Paul ~ by bringing him joy. FOR ONE THING, ~ THROUGH FORGIVENESS AND RECONCILIATION, ~ 77 ▶▶Philemon would maintain the unity in the Colossian church. ▶▶And that ~ would bring great joy to Paul. ▶ Paul urged the church in Philippi, ~ 77

Domake my joy complete by ~ being like-minded, ~ having the same love, ~ being one in

spirit and of one mind. 11 7/9

#### NOTICE THAT ~ THIS REFRESHMENT WOULD BE ~ IN CHRIST.

- ▶▶I.e., ~ no doubt talking about ~ spiritual blessings.
- ▶ Paul always sought ~ spiritual blessings.
- ▶▶And that's exactly what Jesus taught us to do.

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⊳ Matt. 6:19-21 . . . .
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- >>Jesus exhorts his followers ~ to continually store up heavenly treasures ~ 77
  - → that are not subject ~ to the same kinds of things as earthly possessions.
- $\triangleright$  $\triangleright$ To be focused on treasures in heaven ~ is to pursue those goals and activities ~ 77
  - that have eternal significance ~ and ~ that have a relationship to God as the ultimate concern.
- $\triangleright \triangleright$  Since one's treasure  $\sim$  is indicative of a person's loyalty and inner commitment,  $\sim$  77
  - → one's ultimate pursuit and interests ~ provide a window ~ to the true self.

#### GETTING BACK TO PHILEMON.

- ▶▶Failing to forgive Onesimus ~ would sadden Paul.
- ▶▶It would also damage ~ the testimony of the Colossian church ~ before the watching world. ↓ 1 8/9

## IN ADDITION TO FORGIVING BECAUSE WE'RE FORGIVEN, ~ 77

- ▶▶believers ~ should be motivated to forgive and reconcile ~ by the knowledge ~ 77
- ▶▶And in addition to that, ~ our church presenting a proper witness to the world ~ 77
  - >> should be another motivation ~ for forgiveness and reconciliation.
- BUT ~ THE MOST IMPORTANT MOTIVATION ~ for forgiveness and reconciliation, ~ 77
  - ▶▶is that ~ it is glorifying and pleasing to the Lord.
    - >> And glorifying and pleasing the Lord in our life ~ should be ~ our highest priority.
