INTRODUCTION.

AS WE NOTED LAST TIME, ~ 77

>>James suggested ~ that testing ~ is intended to produce ~ a wholeness of character ~ 77

DD that lacks nothing ~ in the array of virtues ~ that define Godly character.

 \blacktriangleright Of course, ~ for testing to produce the intended result, ~ believers must respond to it with ~ 77

DD confidence in God ~ and determination to endure

IN 1: ~ 5-8, ~ JAMES DISCUSSES A KEY VIRTUE ~ IN THIS RANGE OF QUALITIES ~ 77

that characterizes Godly character.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And i.e., ~ wisdom.

▶ James is pointing out ~ that this ~ is a key, ~ or, ~ perhaps <u>the</u> key ~ attribute ~ 77

>>> that Christians ~ must <u>not</u> lack ~ as we move ~ toward spiritual maturity.

▶ Jesus touches on the importance of possessing wisdom ~ in Matt. 10:16.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents ~ and innocent as doves. 11 1/10

▶▶ Solomon as well ~ drives home the importance ~ of having wisdom.

>>Prov. 4:5-9, ~~ Get wisdom; get insight; do not forget, and do not turn away from the words of my mouth. Do not forsake her, and she will keep you; love her, and she will guard you. The beginning of wisdom is this: Get wisdom, and whatever you get, get insight. Prize her highly, and she will exalt you; she will honor you if you embrace her. She will place on your head a graceful garland; she will bestow on you a beautiful crown.

▶ ▶ Perhaps we see ~ in just these two passages ~ why James singled this virtue out.

LET'S OUTLINE THIS PARAGRAPH, ~ JAMES 1:5-8.

▶▶In this paragraph, ~ James does the following.

 \blacktriangleright 1st, ~ he realistically recognizes ~ the believer's need for wisdom (v. 5a).

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ If any of you lacks wisdom.

▶ Next, ~ he ~ points out ~ how ~ the believer must get ~ the needed wisdom (v. 5b).

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Let him ask God.

▶ He then states ~ what kind of giver God is. (v. 5c),

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Who gives generously to all without reproach,

▶▶Next, ~ James assures us ~ God will give us this wisdom that we need. (v. 5d).

 $\triangleright \triangleright And$ it will be given him. 11 2/10

▶ But then James immediately notes ~ a condition we must meet in order ~ for wisdom to be given to us.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The attitude for effective praying ~ must be present, ~ verse 6a.

 \Rightarrow But let him ask in faith, with no doubting. \Rightarrow I.e., ~ given if this condition is met.

► Elaborates about the doubter, ~ 6b-8. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ ^{6b} for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea that is driven and tossed by the wind. ⁷ For that person must not suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; ⁸ he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

LET'S BEGIN TO ~ BREAK THIS DOWN. ⇒⇒ 5a-c today.

▶ ^{5a} If any of you lacks wisdom, ^{5b} let him ask God, ^{5c} who gives generously to all without reproach.

IN VERSE 5a, ~ JAMES REALISTICALLY RECOGNIZES ~ the believer's need ~ for wisdom.

THE TYPE OF GREEK CONDITIONAL STATEMENT FOUND HERE, ~ "IF ANY" ~ 77

does not imply doubt ~ concerning the reality of the need.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Rather ~ it assumes ~ the reality of the need ~ and views it ~ as a standing fact.

>>It's as if James said, ~~ Since, ~ or seeing, ~ that you lack wisdom.

Furthermore, ~ If any of you ~ indicates ~ 77

DD that this consciousness of a wisdom shortage ~ must come ~ as an <u>individual</u> recognition. 11 3/10

>>James gives us ~ no suggestion ~ that there are individual exceptions ~ to this need.

▷▷The <u>degree</u> ~ of the need may vary, ~~ 77

→ → but <u>all</u> believers ~ have a need ~ for this wisdom ~ that James is talking about.

JAMES IS NOT TALKING ABOUT ~ JUST ANY KIND OF WISDOM HERE.

► He's definitely not talking about earthly wisdom.

▶▶In fact, ~ we're warned against depending on human understanding.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Prov.~3:5},$ ~~ Trust in the Lord ~ with all your heart, ~ and do not lean ~ on your own understanding.

► Why? ~~ Suggest at least 3 reasons.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ finite.

⇒⇒Job 38-41 . . .

 $\triangleright \triangleright 2^{nd}$, ~ imperfect so understanding is faulty.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Job's counselors . . .

→ → Disciples and man born blind

→ Prov. 14:12 and 16:25. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way to death. 11 4/10

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And 3rd, ~ our sinful nature ~ interferes with thinking processes, ~ Jer. 17:9 (NIV).

 \rightarrow The heart is deceitful above all things ~ and beyond cure. ~~ Who can understand it?

▶▶That doesn't instill a whole lot of confidence ~ in our wisdom ~ now does it?

>>Rather, ~ it points out a large capacity within us ~ for self-deception, ~ doesn't it?

JAMES IS TALKING ABOUT ~ SPIRITUAL/BIBLICAL ~ WISDOM.

▶▶ Spiritual wisdom ~ means more ~ than intellectual knowledge.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ It is less ~ "knowing that" ~ than ~ "knowing how."

▶▶Biblical wisdom ~ is the understanding that enables believers ~ 77

Doto view history and their lives ~ from God's perspective.

►►Additionally, ~ spiritual wisdom ~ is the moral discernment ~ 77

DD that enables the believer ~ to meet life and its trials ~ 77

→ → with decisions and actions ~ consistent with God's will.

▶ What's more, ~ it is the ability ~ to discern ~ right from wrong ~ and good from evil.

Furthermore, ~ it is the power ~ that enables a person ~ 77

DD to do and say ~ the right thing ~ at the right time. 11 5/10

 \blacktriangleright And, ~ biblical wisdom is the understanding ~ that enables a believer ~ 77

DD to avoid the paths of wickedness ~ and to live a life of righteousness.

► Overlap

▶►All of this ~ points ~ to the importance of this wisdom ~ and ~ to why we need it.

IN VERSE 5b, ~ POINTS OUT ~ HOW ~ THE BELIEVER MUST GET ~ the needed wisdom.

LET HIM ASK GOD.

▶ 3^{rd} person imperative $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ If any of you lacks wisdom, ~ you must ~ ask God.

▶ The 3rd pers. sing. vb. ~ marks it ~ as the duty ~ of each ~ individual believer.

► Ongoing action.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ You, ~ each believer, ~ must ~ continually ~ ask God.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow I.e., ~ it is a standing duty to be performed ~ whenever ~ there is a conscious need for wisdom.

EACH BELIEVER ~ MUST ~ ASK GOD ~ FOR THIS WISDOM YOU NEED.

►► Any failure to ask ~ implies ~ that the believer ~ is blind to his/her need.

▶ But ~ he who has a constant longing for wisdom ~ will persistently ~ pray for it. 11 6/10

NOTICE HERE ~ JAMES DOES NOT SAY, ~ "FOR THIS WISDOM, ~ GO AND ASK"

▶▶No, ~ biblical wisdom ~ can be gained ~ only ~ by asking our heavenly Father for it.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ This is why ~ we must ask him for it.

►► As James says later in chapter 1, ~ God is ~ 77

DD the Father of the heavenly lights, ~ from whom comes ~ every good and perfect gift.

▶ The entire twenty-eighth chapter of Job ~ is devoted ~ to this theme.

>>Job asks, ~ But where shall wisdom be found? ~~ And where is the place of understanding?

 $\triangleright \triangleright \land$ After reviewing the failure ~ of all sorts of sources, ~ he comes in the end ~ 77

→ → to affirm ~ the exclusive claims of God.

 \rightarrow Job asserts, ~~ God understands the way to it ~ and he alone ~ knows where it dwells (NIV).

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And he finishes by saying, ~ Behold, ~~ the fear of the Lord, ~ that is wisdom, ~~ and to turn away from evil ~ is understanding.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Fear of the Lord ~ does not mean afraid of.

 \rightarrow Rather, ~ it means ~ to recognize God's character ~ 77

 $rac{}{\sim}$ and respond by ~ revering, ~ trusting, ~ worshiping, ~ obeying, ~ and ~ serving ~ Him. $ac{}{\sim}$ 7/10

[God] ~ gives ~ 1st, ~ generously ~~ 2nd, ~ to all ~~ and 3rd, ~ without reproach. ⇒⇒ Unpack.

1st, ~ GOD GIVES GENEROUSLY.

▶ The form of the Greek verb for "gives" ~ points out two things about God.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$, ~ it stresses that ~ giving ~ is the ~ inherent nature ~ of God.

 $D > 2^{nd}$, ~ it sets forth ~ God's generous nature as ~ continually ~ giving.

 \triangleright \triangleright He has revealed Himself ~ as a God ~ who is ~ continually and generously ~ giving to humans.

▶ His giving includes ~ everything ~ that is good.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ If you then, ~ who are evil, ~ know how to give good gifts to your children, ~~ how much more ~ will your Father who is in heaven ~ give good things to those who ask him!

 \triangleright For the Lord God ~ is a sun and shield; ~~ the Lord bestows ~ favor and honor. ~~ No good thing ~ does he withhold ~ from those who walk uprightly {Ps. 84:11}.

▶▶It is this view of the nature of God ~ that encourages the believer ~ to come boldly to God ~ with their requests.

 \triangleright In Rom. 8:32, ~ Paul writes, ~ He who did not spare his own Son ~ but gave him up for us all, ~ how will he not also with him ~ graciously give us all things?

→→ "Graciously" here ~ means ~ to give or grant graciously and generously, ~ with the implication of good will ~ on the part of the giver. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ Throne of grace. 11 8/10

(5c) 2nd, ~ JAMES SAYS ~ GOD GIVES ~ TO ALL.

▶ "To all" ~ restricted ~ as to scope ~ by context. ⇒ ⇒ believers

▶ To all" here ~ is restricted ~ as to scope ~ in two other ways as well.

 $\triangleright \triangleright 1^{st}$ ~ it does not mean ~ all people, ~ saved and unsaved.

 \rightarrow The Lord does not ~ hear or honor ~ the requests of unbelievers.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ Unless, ~ of course, ~ it's a prayer for salvation.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow Prov. 15:8 (NIV), ~ The Lord detests ~ the sacrifice of the wicked, ~ but the prayer of the upright ~ pleases him.

 \rightarrow \rightarrow So, ~ believers are in view.

 $>>2^{nd}$, ~ to all ~ is further restricted ~ to those believers ~ who ask

(5c) AND 3rd, ~ JAMES SAYS ~ GOD GIVES ~ WITHOUT REPROACH.

► The grammar of the Greek text indicates ~ that God ~ permanently abstains ~ from such a practice.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ We never ~ have to worry ~ that this will happen, ~ 77

→ → no matter how many times we go to him for help.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ We'll always ~ be warmly welcomed ~ at his throne. 11 9/10

► God gives without reproach, ~ James declares.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \circ$ Our heavenly Father does not ~ respond to our petition ~~ and then ~ heap insults upon us ~ for asking.

 \triangleright \triangleright He does not ~ offensively recall ~ the benefits he's already given us ~~ or ~ rebuke us ~ if we ask for more.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He does not ~ give ~ in a way ~ that humiliates the receiver.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He does not ~ scold us ~ if we've inadequately used ~ his former gifts.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And he does not ~ rebuke us ~ for our repeated lack of wisdom.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ The Lord's generosity ~ is measured by what He designs ~ and not ~ by what we deserve. $\Rightarrow \Rightarrow$ We actually don't deserve anything from him.

▶►All of this means ~ we can be honest ~ with our heavenly Father in our prayers.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And we can pour out ~ our deepest feelings to him ~ without fear.

 $\triangleright \triangleright \mathsf{Our}$ heavenly Father ~ accepts us.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ And ~ he understands ~ our weaknesses.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So we can come to him, ~ not just for wisdom, ~ but for ~ whatever ~ we need.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ So we must never hesitate ~ to <u>boldly</u> come ~ to the throne of grace.
