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GRACE, GRACE, GOD'S GRACE; EPH. 2:8-9 (Ed O'Leary; 4/7/19)
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GRACE, ~ GRACE, ~ GOD'S GRACE.
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GRACE THAT WILL PARDON AND CLEANSE WITHIN.

▶▶Grace, ~ grace, ~ God's grace, ~ grace that is greater than all our sin!

THIS A.M., \sim IN CELEBRATING THE LORD'S SUPPER, \sim set our study of James aside \sim 77

▶▶and focus on ~ God's amazing grace.

DDIN Eph. 2:8-9, ~ Paul explains that our salvation, ~ is totally ~ by God's grace alone.

IN VERSE 8a, ~ PAUL SAYS, ~ 77

FOR BY GRACE YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED."

▶▶"grace" here means <u>free and undeserved favor</u>.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ Saved by God's

▶▶Paul emphasizes "by grace."

"For by grace you have been saved."

 \triangleright Paul does not want us to miss this, ~ that the source of our salvation ~ 77

→ is God's grace, ~ and His grace alone! 1/10 11

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▶▶In our unsaved state, ~ we were ~ 100% sinful.
     \triangleright \triangleright Sinning ~ was a way of life for us.
     >> We were following ~ the standards of this world and Satan.
     >> We were ~ enslaved to our sinful nature and its sinful desires ~ 77
         → and carried those sinful desires out.
     >> We were ~ God's enemies, ~ and were subject to, ~ deserving of, ~ 77
         → and destined for ~ God's wrath.
 ▶ Even though all this was true, ~ 77
     DDGod's mercy and love ~ led him ~ to offer humanity ~ the gift of salvation.
     \triangleright \triangleright As John tells us in his 1<sup>st</sup> epistle, ~ This ~ is real love ~ not that we loved God, ~ 77
         → but that he loved us ~ and sent his Son ~ as a sacrifice ~ to take away our sins.
BACK IN EPH. 1:8, ~ PAUL SAID ~ THAT GOD ~ LAVISHED ~ HIS GRACE UPON US.
 ▶ The Greek word for ~ lavished ~ means ~ 77
     \triangleright \triangleright more than enough, \sim to \sim provide in abundance, \sim to \sim cause to overflow. 2/10 11
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GOD IS INFINITELY RICH IN GRACE.

- ▶ But ~ He is not stingy with it. ⇒ ⇒ Not like some ~ cosmic Scrooge.
- ▶▶God ~ does not give His grace to us ~ in limited measure, ~ carefully weighed out.
- ▶▶He causes His grace ~ to overflow, ~ to abound ~ to us.
- ▶▶Gives it ~ in overflowing measure.

AND GOD'S GRACE ~ IS SUFFICIENTLY ABUNDANT ~ TO COVER THE SINS OF ALL.

- ▶▶And it is adequate ~ for the worst of sinners.
 - $\triangleright \triangleright As$ the hymn that we're going to sing later says, ~ 77
 - the vilest offender ~ who truly believes, ~ that moment from Jesus ~ a pardon receives.

SOME MIGHT THINK, ~ "OH, ~ GOD COULD NEVER FORGIVE ME FOR WHAT I'VE DONE."

- ▶▶Consider Paul, ~ before his conversion, ~ he persecuted Christians.
 - ⊳⊳Stephen. *⇒⇒* On way to Damascus
 - >>But Jesus didn't hold this against Paul.
 - → Jesus didn't refuse to forgive Paul.
 - → Jesus didn't withhold His grace from Paul. 3/10 11

▶▶Jesus ~ abundantly bestows His grace ~ on all who come to Him in true repentance. >> Paul testifies to this ~ in 1 Tim. 1:12-14. ~~ Paul writes, ~ "I thank him who has given me strength, ~ Christ Jesus our Lord, ~ because he judged me faithful, ~ appointing me to his service, ~~ though formerly ~ I was a ~ blasphemer, ~ persecutor, ~ and insolent opponent. ~~ But I received mercy ~~ because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, ~ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus." ⇒⇒Used of a vessel ~ that becomes too full. ⇒⇒ Run over, ~ overflow. ▶▶No one, ~ in this life, ~ is beyond the reach of the Savior. DDIs. 59:1 declares, ~ "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, ~ that it cannot save." >>If you've never accepted Christ, ~ it doesn't matter what you've done ~ or are doing. DDIn this life ~ you are not ~ beyond God's grace. ⇒⇒ Emph. on ~ this life ▶ Paul says in Rom. 5:20, ~ "Now the law came in ~ to increase the trespass, ~ but where sin increased, ~ grace abounded all the more." >>What a contrast! → No matter how great human sin becomes, ~ 77 \rightarrow God's grace ~ overflows beyond it ~ and abundantly exceeds it. ▶▶Marvelous grace of our loving Lord, ~ Grace that exceeds ~ our sin and our guilt! >> Marvelous, ~ infinite, ~ matchless grace, ~ freely bestowed on all who believe. 4/10 11 "FOR BY GRACE YOU HAVE BEEN SAVED," ~ PAUL TELLS US.

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▶▶I.e., ~ by God's grace, ~ 77
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believers have been freed ~ from sin and our sin nature.

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→ Rom. 6:6 (NLT), ~ We know ~ that our old sinful selves ~ were crucified with Christ ~ so that ~ sin might lose its power in our lives. ~~ We are no longer ~ slaves to sin.
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 \triangleright We have been freed ~ from all the spiritual powers of evil in the heavenly places.

 $\rightarrow God$ has delivered us \sim from the domain of darkness \sim and transferred us \sim to the kingdom of his beloved Son, \sim in whom \sim we have redemption, \sim the forgiveness of sins.

 \triangleright Every one of our sins \sim has been forgiven.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow As$ far \sim as the east \sim is from the west, \sim so far \sim has he removed our transgressions from us.

>>We have been ~ reconciled with God.

→ Therefore, ~ since we have been justified by faith, ~ we have peace with God ~ through our Lord Jesus Christ.

>> We have been ~ delivered from God's wrath.

 \rightarrow 1 Thess. 5:9-10, ~ For God has not destined us for wrath, ~ but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ~ who died for us ~ so that ~ whether we are awake or asleep ~ we might live with him.

► Truly!, ~ God's grace is amazing, ~ isn't it? 5/10 11

▶▶We are saved by God's grace.
⊳⊳But grace goes further ~ than our salvation.
$\triangleright \triangleright$ It does not cease ~ at the moment of our conversion to Christ.
▶▶James writes, ~~ Every good gift and every perfect gift ~ is from above, ~ coming down from the Father of lights.
hdThe gifts are viewed ~ as continually ~ coming down from God the Father
$\triangleright \triangleright$ The Greek verb ~ views each gift ~ as originated and designed in heaven ~ 77
→ → and then ~ as descending ~ in an ~ unending ~ succession.
⊳⊳In Lamentations Jeremiah writes, ~ 77
The steadfast love of the Lord ~ never ceases; ~~ his mercies ~ never come to an end; ~~ they are new ~ every morning.
$ hd hd hd G$ od's free and undeserved favor \sim flows abundantly into our lives \sim on a daily basis.
▶▶But there's more.
$\triangleright \triangleright G$ race is also an ongoing provision from G od, \sim enabling believers \sim to live in conformity with His will \sim 77
\Rightarrow and to undertake the ministry and service that God has entrusted to them. 6/10 11

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>>IOW, ~ grace is also divine enablement, ~ empowering us ~ to live the Christian life ~
    and to serve God.
       → We see this meaning brought out in 2 Cor. 12:7-10 . . . .
 ► Truly!, ~ God's grace is amazing, ~ isn't it?
IN VERSE 8b, ~ PAUL STATES HOW WE RECEIVE GOD'S GRACE FOR SALVATION.
FOR CONTEXT, ~ START AT BEGINNING OF VERSE 8.
 ▶ Paul says ~ For by grace you have been saved ~ [and here's how we receive it:] ~ through
 faith.
 ▶▶Whereas God's grace is the objective source of our salvation, ~ 77
    >>through faith ~ is the subjective means ~ or channel ~ 77
        → by which one receives God's grace ~ and is saved.
 ▶▶This is important, ~ for the salvation that was purchased by Christ's death ~ is universal ~
 in its provision.
    >> But it is not ~ universal ~ in its application.
 ▶▶One is not ~ automatically saved ~ because Christ died.
    \triangleright \triangleright But one is saved ~ when one puts their faith and trust ~ 77
        → in God's gracious provision. 7/10 11
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▶▶Jn. 3:16 points this out.
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 \triangleright "For God so loved the world, ~ that he gave his only Son ~ [God's gracious provision], ~ that whoever ~ [universal provision, ~ i.e., ~ available to all].

→ But to apply ~ God's gracious provision to him/herself.

→ That whoever <u>believes</u> in him ~ should not perish ~ but have eternal life.

PERHAPS EMPHASIZE POINT, ~ that God's grace alone is the source of our salvation, ~ 77

IN VERSES 8c-9a PAUL EXPLAINS ~ THAT OUR SALVATION ~ 77

▶▶does not originate with humans ~ in any way, ~ shape, ~ or form.

IN VERSE 8c, ~ HE SAYS THAT ~ IT DOES NOT ORIGINATE ~ WITHIN US.

HE SAYS, ~ AND THIS ~ [I.E., ~ YOUR SALVATION] ~ IS NOT YOUR OWN DOING ~ [I.E., ~ you are not the source]; ~~

▶▶it is the gift of God ~ [from God, ~ or, ~ it is God's gift].

>>And this salvation ~ is not ~ from you as a source; ~~ it is the gift from God.

▶ Rom 3:23-24a, \sim for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, \sim and are justified by his grace \sim as a gift.

 $\triangleright \triangleright G$ rk. word for gift ~ refers to ~ being ~ freely given, ~ as a gift, ~ without payment, ~ w/out charge.

DDOur salvation is free & undeserved gift from God. →→Originates w/ God. 8/10 11

IN VERSE 9a PAUL SAYS THAT ~ NEITHER ARE OUR WORKS ~ THE SOURCE OF OUR salvation.

- ▶▶He says that this salvation is also ~ <u>not</u> a result of works.
- ▶▶"works" here ~ refers ~ to any good deed ~ 77

⇒ In brief, ~ we <u>cannot</u> earn salvation ~ by doing good works.

 $\rightarrow \rightarrow$ And it's definitely ~ not earned ~ by a person's good works ~ outweighing their bad.

▶ Rom. 11:6, ~ But if it is by grace, ~ it is no longer ~ on the basis of works; ~~ otherwise ~ grace ~ would no longer be grace."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ If we could earn salvation through works, ~ then God's grace ~ 77

→ would not be what it really is, ~ free and undeserved.

SINCE NEITHER WE ~ nor our works ~ are the source of our salvation, ~ none of us ~ 77

HAS BRAGGING RIGHTS ~ WHEN IT COMES TO OUR SALVATION, ~ Paul says in verse 9b.

- ▶▶So that ~ no one may boast.
- ▶▶Paul puts it this way in Rom. 3:27-28. 9/10 11

>> Then what becomes of our boasting? ~~ It is excluded. ~~ By what kind of law? ~~ By a law of works? ~~ No, ~ but by the law of faith. ~~ For we hold ~ that one is justified ~ by faith ~ apart from works of the law.

 \rightarrow Since righteousness \sim is based on faith in what God has accomplished in Christ alone \sim 77

→ → boasting in ourselves ~ is ruled out.

OUR BOASTING ~ CAN ONLY BE ~ IN THE LORD ~ AND WHAT HE HAS DONE FOR US.

- ▶▶As Paul puts it in 2 Cor. 10:17, ~ "Let the one who boasts, ~ boast in the Lord."
- ▶▶The point is, ~ it's not, ~ "Hey, ~ everyone, ~ look what I've done."

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ But, ~ "Hey, ~ everyone, ~ look what great things Jesus has done for me ~ 77

→ and how He has had mercy on me!"

MY . . . , ~ BY GOD'S INCREDIBLY FREE AND UNDESERVED FAVOR ~ WE HAVE BEEN SAVED.

EVEN THOUGH WE DID NOT DESERVE IT, ~ GOD'S MERCY AND LOVE ~ LED HIM ~ 77

▶▶to offer humanity ~ the free and undeserved gift ~ of salvation.

 \triangleright Amazing grace ~ is what we celebrate around this table this a.m. 10/10
