PEACE WITH GOD; COL. 1:22a-b (Ed O'Leary; 6/2/19)

Back In April On Communion Sunday, ~ We Talked About ~ God's Grace.

Today ~ we're going to talk about reconciliation.

▶▶Specifically, ~ what we're talking about is the fact that ~ 77

Dall who ~ have openly declared that Jesus is Lord ~ 77

→ and believe in their heart that God raised him from the dead ~ have peace with God.

 \triangleright Rom. 5:1, ~~ Therefore, ~ since we have been justified by faith, ~ we have peace with God ~ through ~ our Lord Jesus Christ.

We noted ~ at the end of our message on communion Sun. in April that ~ 77

- ▶▶the Lord's table ~ is for God's blood-bought people ~ to celebrate his infinite grace.
- ► Well, ~ it's also for God's blood-bought people to celebrate the fact ~ that we have peace with him.
- ▶▶Like God's grace, ~ our reconciliation ~ fits right in ~ with the cross of Jesus.
 - \triangleright (Rom.) We were reconciled to God ~ by the death of his Son.
 - \triangleright For in him ~ all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, ~ and through him ~ to reconcile to himself all things, ~ whether on earth or in heaven, ~ making peace ~ by the blood of his cross. 1/8

Obviously, ~ There Is A Lot To Talk About When It Comes To This Subject.

But we're narrowing our focus to ~ two aspects ~ of our reconciliation.

- ► Col. 1:22a-b.
- ▶▶ 1^{st} aspect, ~ 22a, ~ the fact ~ of recon.
- ▶▶And the 2^{nd} aspect, ~ 22b, ~ the means ~ of recon.

The Fact Of Reconciliation. ~~ Verse 22a (NIV).

But now ~ he has reconciled you.

- ▶▶The emphasis of reconciliation ~ is that ~ of making peace with God.
- ▶▶Human beings ~ are estranged ~ from God.
 - >>And through reconciliation ~ are brought into communion ~ with God.
- ▶▶Sin ~ had created a barrier ~ between man and God, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ and rendered humanity hostile toward God, ~ as Gen. 3 so sadly relates.
- ▶▶Through Christ ~ that barrier was removed.
- ▶▶Reconciliation ~ may thus be defined as ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright G$ od removing the barrier of sin, \sim producing peace, \sim and enabling humanity to be saved. 2/8



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My ..., \sim it is a fact \sim that we, \sim 77
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- who have accepted this reconciliation God has offered through his Son ~ have peace with God.
- ▶ Paul also states the fact of our reconciliation in Rom. 5:1.
 - \triangleright Therefore, ~ since we have been justified by faith, ~ we have peace with God ~ through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- ▶►My . . ., ~~ having peace with God ~ means ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright$ there is no more hostility between us and God, \sim no sin blocking our relationship with him.

We must reiterate because ~ it's so important ~ and ~ it's good news.


- ightharpoonup If you openly declare \sim that Jesus is Lord \sim and believe in your heart \sim that God raised him from the dead, \sim you will be saved.
 - \triangleright You will have ~ peace with God.

And here is something ~ that should always amaze us, ~ i.e., ~ the blood-bought people of God.

- \blacktriangleright We were \sim in open rebellion against, \sim enemies of, \sim and hostile toward \sim God \sim in our unsaved state.
- ▶ But even in the face of all of this, ~ 77
 - $\triangleright \triangleright G$ od ~ carried through the work of reconciliation. 4/8

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▶ He is the One ~ who took the initiative in his ~ mercy, ~ love, ~ and grace ~ 77
   DD to carry through ~ the work of reconciliation.
▶▶The word reconciliation ~ comes from the Greek word that means ~ 77
   DD to effect a change, ~ to reconcile.
▶▶God is the one ~ who initiated this change or reconciliation.
   >>He moved ~ to reconcile sinful humanity to Himself
▶▶We know from what Paul tells us in Eph., ~ 77
   \triangleright \triangleright G od is so rich in mercy, \sim and he loved us so much, \sim 77
      → that even though ~ we were dead in our trespasses, ~ 77
          → he ~ made us alive together with Christ ~ and raised us up with him ~ 77
             → and seated us with him in the heavenly places.
                \subseteq By grace we have been saved.
▶▶Jesus died for us ~ when we ~ were still weak, ~ ungodly, ~ and could do nothing for
ourselves.
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 \triangleright He died for us ~ while we were still sinners ~ and while we were his enemies. 5/8



By Christ's physical body ~ through death.

- ►► According to Col. 1:20, ~ God chose to send his Son ~ for the designated purpose of ~ 77
 - Dreconciling all creation, ~~ and in particular fallen humanity, ~ to himself.
- ▶ Because Jesus is God, ~ He was able ~ to do ~ what no mere man could ever do: ~~ 77
 - Dreconcile lost sinners to the Father.
- ▶▶And the means by which this reconciliation was accomplished ~ 77
 - >> was Christ's substitutionary death on the cross.

And it is extremely important to understand, ~ that Jesus' death on the cross ~ 77

- **▶**<u>was</u> ~ a substitutionary sacrifice.
- ▶▶Jesus substituted himself in our place.

▷Is. 53:4-6.

→ Surely he has ~ borne our griefs ~ and carried our sorrows; ~~ yet we esteemed him ~ stricken, ~ smitten by God, ~ and afflicted. But he was pierced ~ for our transgressions; ~~ he was crushed ~ for our iniquities; ~~ upon him ~ was the chastisement ~ that brought us peace, ~~ and with his wounds ~ we are healed.

 \hookrightarrow All we like sheep ~ have gone astray; ~~ we have turned—every one—to his own way; ~~ and the Lord has laid on him ~ the iniquity of us all. $\frac{7}{8}$

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D>And 1 Pet. 2:24 (NIV).
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→ "He himself ~ bore our sins" ~ in his body on the cross, ~~ so that ~ we might ~ die to sins ~ and live for righteousness; ~~ "by his wounds ~ you have been healed."

▶▶Jesus' substitutionary sacrifice ~ satisfied God 's righteous demands ~ 77

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ by paying in full ~ the penalty for sin.

▶▶The doctrine of substitution ~ is important ~ in that through Christ's death ~ 77

Dthe righteous demands of God ~ have been met.

 \triangleright It was a legal transaction \sim in which \sim Christ dealt with the sin problem for the human race.

 $\triangleright \triangleright$ He became ~ the substitute ~ for humanity's sin.

 \triangleright Without the shedding of blood ~ there is no forgiveness of sins.

My . . . , ~ Peace With God ~ Is A Reality Of Life ~ Forever For Believers.

So let's come to the Lord's table ~ with hearts filled ~ with gratitude and joy.

►► And let's celebrate ~ God's infinite grace ~ and ~ 77
