▶▶Peter 1st declares ~ the nature of Jesus' sufferings.

 \triangleright \triangleright (NIV) 24a, ~ He himself ~ bore our sins ~ in his body ~ on the cross.

▶▶Then he lists 3 practical results ~ of Jesus' atoning work for believers.

 \triangleright (NIV) 24b, ~ so that we might 1/12

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\rightarrow \rightarrow \bigcirc, ~ die to sins.
        →→②, ~ live for righteousness.
        → And ③, ~ By his wounds [we] have been healed.
Okay, ~ now let's unpack 1 Pet. 2:24
Peter First Declares ~ The Nature ~ Of Jesus' Sufferings.
24a (NIV), ~ He himself ~ bore our sins ~ in his body ~ on the cross.
 ▶►Notice: ~~ sins plural, ~ Jesus ~ bore [all of] our sins ~ in his body ~ on the cross, ~ 77
     DDnot just ~ <u>some</u> ~ of our sins.
     \triangleright \triangleright Col. 2:13, ~ And you, ~ who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of
    your flesh ~ [i.e., ~ before salvation], ~ 77
        → God made alive ~ together with him, ~ having forgiven us ~ all ~ our trespasses.
But what does it mean ~ when Peter says ~ that Jesus bore our sins ~ in his body on the cross?
 ▶▶In Isaiah, ~ we see quite a good def.
     >>Hundreds of years ~ before Jesus came, ~ Isaiah foresaw ~ 77
        →Jesus' suffering & death for our sins. 2/12
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>>And he describes quite well ~ what ~~ He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross ~ means.

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▷Is. 53:4-6 (NIV).
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 \Rightarrow Surely ~ he ~ took up our pain ~ and bore our suffering, ~~ yet ~ we considered him ~ punished by God, ~ stricken by him, ~ and afflicted. ~~ 77

 \rightarrow But \sim he was pierced \sim for our transgressions, \sim he was crushed \sim for our iniquities; \sim 77

 \rightarrow the punishment ~ that brought us peace ~ was on him, ~~ and by his wounds ~ we are healed. ~~ 77

→ We all, ~ like sheep, ~ have gone astray, ~~ each of us ~ has turned to our own way; ~~ and the Lord ~ has laid on him ~ the iniquity of us all.

▶ Jesus substituted Himself for us.

 \triangleright He died ~ in our place, ~ as the payment ~ for our sins.

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→→2 Cor. 5:21, (NLT).
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 \rightarrow For God made Christ, ~ who never sinned, ~ to be the offering ~~ for our sin, ~~ so that ~ we could be made right with God ~ through Christ.

→ Look! ~~ The Lamb of God ~ who takes away the sin of the world!

After Declaring The Nature Of Jesus' Sufferings, ~ Peter Then, ~ As Noted, ~ 77

1st Practical Result, ~~~ ^{24a} He Himself Bore Our Sins In His Body On The Cross, ^{24b} So That We Might Die To Sins.

I.e., \sim Jesus' death \sim makes it possible for believers \sim to be free from both \sim the penalty \sim and the power of sin.

At the moment of conversion, ~ believers are freed ~ from the penalty of sin.

▶ Rom. 8:1 (NLT), \sim 50 \sim now \sim there is no condemnation \sim for those who belong \sim to Christ Jesus.

DD No condemnation.

 \triangleright The point ~ Paul is making here, ~ is that condemnation ~ <u>is</u>, ~ in <u>every</u> sense, ~ 77

→ out of the question ~ for those ~ who belong to Christ Jesus.

▶▶Recall that ~ in Eph. 1:7, ~ through Jesus, ~ believers have ~ the forgiveness of sins.

 \triangleright Remember, ~ the term forgiveness ~ means ~ to release ~ or ~ to cancel.

 \triangleright It thus denotes ~ a permanent release ~ from the punishment for sins, ~ 77

→ which have been paid for ~ by Christ's sacrifice.

 $\triangleright \triangleright God$ ~ no longer holds the sins against us.

>> The psalmist beautifully illustrates this in Ps. 103:12 (NLT).

 \rightarrow He has removed our sins ~ as far from us ~ as the east is from the west. 4/12

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▶▶And in Col. 2:14 (NLT), ~ Paull notes that ~ through Jesus, ~ God the Father ~ 77
    Docanceled the record of the charges against us ~ and took it away ~ by nailing it ~ to
     the cross.
     >> The Grk word for ~ canceled ~ means ~ 77
        → to cause something to cease ~ by obliterating ~ any evidence.
           \rightarrow \rightarrowQuite a statement.
    >> When a person repents ~ and turns ~ to Jesus for salvation, ~ God the Father ~ 77
        → bobliterates ~ the charges against them.
    >> Through Isaiah, ~ God says ~ in Is. 43:25, ~ 77
        \rightarrow \rightarrow I, ~ I am he ~ who blots out your transgressions ~ for my own sake, ~~ 77
            → and ~ I will not remember your sins.
At the moment of conversion, ~ believers are also freed from ~ the power of sin.
 ▶▶Prior to our conversion, ~ we were ~ slaves to sin.
 ▶▶It was ~ an internal force ~~ that we were enslaved to.
 ▶▶When we come to Jesus for salvation, ~ 77
     \triangleright \triangleright we are liberated ~ from that enslavement. 5/12
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>>Rom. 6:6.
        → We know ~ that our old self ~ was crucified with him ~~ in order ~ that the body of
        sin ~ might be brought to nothing, ~ 77
           → →so that ~ we would no longer ~ be enslaved to sin.
    ▷▷ And Rom. 6:17 (NIV).
        ⇒⇒But ~ thanks be to God ~ that, ~ though you used to be slaves to sin, ~ 77
           →you have come to obey from your heart ~ the pattern of teaching ~ that has now
           claimed your allegiance.
This does not mean ~ sin has stopped affecting believers.
 ▶▶Christians are indeed ~ tempted by sin ~ and often yield to it.
 ▶ But sin ~ is no longer ~ an internal force.
 ▶▶It is now ~ an external force ~ trying to regain control ~ by luring us ~ away from Christ.
 ▶▶TPID, ~ we still have ~ our sinful nature.
    \triangleright \triangleright But ~ we don't have to obey it.
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▶▶& NT makes it clear, ~ that ~ as new creations in Christ, ~ we are not to obey it. 6/12

→ We are no longer ~ slaves to it.

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⊳⊳E.g., ~ Rom. 6:12-13 (NIV).
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 \rightarrow Therefore ~ do not let sin reign in your mortal body ~~ so that ~ you obey its evil desires. ~~ 77

→ Do not offer any part of yourself ~ to sin as an instrument of wickedness, ~ 77

 \rightarrow but rather \sim offer yourselves to God \sim as those \sim who have been brought from death to life; $\sim\sim$ 77

G and offer \sim every part of yourself \sim to him \sim as an instrument of righteousness.

   >> Christians ~ are new people.
   >> The Holy Spirit gives us ~ new life.

   >> Been given ~ a new ~ spiritual nature.
      → One ~ which by instinct ~ wishes ~ to live for & please God.
   ⊳>Quick side note.
      → Unfortunately, ~ old is still hanging on.
         →→Marley's ghost . . . .
   >> Christians are not ~ reformed, ~ rehabilitated, ~ or ~ re-educated.
      → → We are ~ re-created.
         \rightarrow \rightarrow 2 Cor. 5:17b.
             → If anyone is in Christ, ~~ he is a new creation. ~~ The old has passed away;
             ~~ behold, ~ the new has come.
   >>At conversion, ~ believers are not merely ~ turning over a new leaf.
      → We begin ~ a new life ~ under a new Master. 8/12
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>> The old life ~ of sin and death ~ has gone.
      → The ~ selfish, sinful ~ human nature ~ has been dealt ~ a death blow.
          \rightarrow \rightarrow Gal. 5:24 (NLT).
              \hookrightarrow Those who belong to Christ Jesus \sim have nailed \sim 77
                 44the passions and desires of their sinful nature ~ to his cross ~~ and

▶► And another powerful resource ~ that enables us ~ 77

By his wounds ~ [we] have been healed.

▶▶Now, ~ at first glance, ~ this may seem ~ like Peter is talking about ~ physical healing.

DDBut please ~ don't make that mistake. 10/12

▶►Nothing in the context ~ points ~ to physical healing. >> Figuratively. ▶ Peter is speaking of ~ spiritual healing. ▶▶He's likening our unsaved state ~ to a state ~ of spiritual sickness. $\triangleright \triangleright$ Sin is a deadly cancer ~ that infects ~ every person, ~ 77 → and of which ~ a person must be healed ~ or be lost forever. ▶▶When Jesus ~ bore our sins in his body on the cross, ~ 77 Dhe made complete spiritual healing available ~ 77 → to all ~ who would call upon Him for salvation. ▶▶At conversion, ~ a believer is healed of this spiritual cancer ~ 77 DD and restored to full spiritual health. What A Savior. He died ~ in our place, ~ as the payment ~ for our sins. ▶▶At the moment of conversion, ~ believers are freed from ~ 77 $\triangleright \triangleright$ the penalty of sin. 11/12
